Gopal Narayan Singh University wants to contribute to the society through pursuit of education, learning, and research at the highest international levels of excellence. The University desires to provide student-centered education and foster personal and intellectual growth to prepare students for productive careers, meaningful lives, and responsible citizenship in a global society. GNS University desires to create an ecosystem wherein the students, faculties, and staff thrive and the citizens of Bihar, the Nation, and the world benefits.</p> <p>The University is spread over an area of more than 38 acres with availability of more land for future expansions. Interaction with Faculty, Staff and Students:

(A) FACULTY

The Committee while interacting with the faculty of “Gopal Narayan Singh University” noted that the faculty was by and large found to be satisfied with their service with the “University”.

(B) STUDENTS

The students were found to be very enthusiastic and positive about “University”. No significant complaints were received from the students while interacting with them. They are satisfied with the teaching learning processes and the facilities provided. However, there are few suggestions from the students for better teaching learning process which are summarized in suggestion.

(C) NON-TEACHING STAFF

While interacting with non-teaching staff and officers, in general, the committee found that the staff is satisfied with their professional careers & are satisfied with their service conditions and dealing with the University management.

Part – IV – Recommendations

A. Observations of the Committee

- Since the University is in its nascent stage, operationally it is seen that the University is performing satisfactorily,
- Admission process is as per the eligibility conditions formed the Government of India for Medical courses and for other courses as per the University’s Governing Authorities,
- Faculty members needs to undertake the more research activities,
- Teacher Student ratio is as per UGC and other respective regulatory bodies,
- Innovative teaching learning processes are being adopted. Lab development is underway as the batch progresses,
- More research facility to be created in-terms of e-journals and research labs,

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- Sufficient allocation and utilization of the budget,
- Sports and cultural facilities are under development stage/process,
- Good medical facilities with qualified Doctors,
- A 1500 seating + 300 additional seating capacity auditorium is under construction and will be available for use very soon,
- Placement records of the University is good,
- Less occupancy in OPD as well as in IPD.

B. Suggestions of the Committee which require satisfactory compliance by the University

- Faculty recruitment to be undertaken on priority for fulfillment of requirement of better Student learning process and better student teacher ratio.
- All buildings need to be conforming to barrier free parameters and internal spaces be made accessible to physically challenged students/staff.
- Library facility needs to be strengthened. And Library timing may be extended from 8 AM to 10 PM on all the working days,
- Inner approach/ link roads and inside campus roads to be improved,
- University needs to make the campus clean, green and environment friendly,
- All the equipments in the laboratories are required to be maintained and serviced regularly,
- Adequate equipments are to be made available in the laboratories of Faculty of Pharmacy,
- Cleanliness in Hostels are to ensured particularly in girls' hostels,
- A wending machine to be placed in each girl's hostel in order to ensure proper hygiene,
- Sufficient numbers of ROs for drinking water is to be installed at proper place.
