O.P. JINDAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY

O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit global university established by the Government of Haryana and recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC). JGU was established as a philanthropic initiative of its Founding Chancellor, Mr. Naveen Jindal in memory of his father, Mr. O.P. Jindal. JGU has been awarded the highest grade 'A' by the National Accreditation & Assessment Council (NAAC). JGU is one of the few universities in Asia that maintains a 1:13 faculty-student ratio and appoints faculty members from India and different parts of the world with outstanding academic qualifications and experience.

JGU is a research intensive university, which is deeply committed to its core institutional values of interdisciplinarity and innovative pedagogy; pluralism and rigorous scholarship; and globalism and international engagement. In 2009, JGU began its first academic session with the establishment of India's first global law school, Jindal Global Law School (JGLS). JGLS is recognised by the Bar Council of India and offers a three-year LL.B. programme, five-year B.A.LL.B. (Hons) and B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) programmes and a one-year LLM programme and a Ph.D. programme in Law. JGLS has research interests in a variety of key policy areas, including: Comparative and International Taxation; *Global Corporate and Financial Law and Policy*; *Women Law, and Social Change*; *Penology, Criminal Justice and Police Studies*; *Human Rights Studies*; *International Trade and Economic Laws*; *Global Governance and Policy*; *Health Law, Ethics, and Technology*; *Intellectual Property Rights Studies*; *Public Law and Jurisprudence*; *Environment and Climate Change Studies*; *South Asian Legal Studies, International Legal Studies, Psychology and Victimology Studies and Clinical Legal Programmes*. JGLS has established international collaborations with law schools around the world, including Harvard, Yale, Columbia, Michigan, Cornell, UC Berkeley, UC Davis, Arizona, Oxford, Cambridge and Indiana. CENTRE FOR POST GRADUATE LEGAL STUDIES

All the LLM and PhD programmes at JGLS are offered under the aegis of the Centre for Post Graduate Legal Studies (CPGLS). The CPGLS at the Jindal Global Law School is established to provide students with quality teaching and learning opportunities thereby creating an intellectually stimulating academic environment with experienced and dedicated faculty committed to provide an excellent and world-class education. The Centre has already commenced with a one-year LLM programme, which is the first programme of its kind in India, with specialisations being offered in Corporate and Financial Law and Policy, International Trade and Investment Law, Intellectual Property Rights and Technology Law and a General LLM.

The General LLM programme allows students to choose courses in any area of law that interests them and gives enough flexible options whilst maintaining the rigours of an LLM.

CPGLS, JGLS has launched a full-time LLM Programme in Taxation for working professionals. JGLS collaborated with the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants for the purpose of offering intensive expertise in contemporary developments related to international taxation and internationally accepted accounting standards.

The CPGLS entered into a partnership with the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva for a real time legal project on Trade and Investment Law. The goal of this project and the collaboration is to make legal expertise in trade and investment matters more broadly available to actors, including small and medium Enterprises (SMEs) and developing countries. Through this project, the LLM students at JGLS will have an opportunity to work on 'real' questions by analyzing trade and investment law and jurisprudence through supervised legal clinics by Professors from JGLS and Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva. The Centre for Post Graduate Legal Studies has received a letter of support from The Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA), The Hague, The Netherlands in 2014.

The faculty at CPGLS has a strong research orientation and the regular LLM students are expected to contribute to faculty and research center projects in the University. CPGLS promotes interdisciplinary studies, joint teaching and joint research programmes in partnership with other Schools in the University and with partner Universities of the O.P. Jindal Global University with which JGU established international collaborations and semester exchange programmes.

With respect to all the programmes under the aegis of CPGLS, the intensive curriculum provides a number of electives on contemporary topics in international and business oriented law streams. The courses and curriculum reflect the contemporary needs of a rapidly changing global legal profession. While the fulfilment of academic credits is the basis for the completion of the programme, there is also a mandatory research component which gives students an opportunity to write on topics of contemporary legal significance.

VISION

The LLM programme is developed to integrate Indian and global perspectives on aspects of corporate, international trade, intellectual property rights, taxation and general legal studies and emphasizes on an international, transnational and comparative approach to research. The programme aims to equip students with skills for global research enabling them to adapt, innovate and apply their knowledge to international legal issues. The objectives of the LLM programme are based on the vision of the O.P. Jindal Global University in imparting globalised legal education with a view to producing world class professionals, scholars, business leaders and academics in law.

Distinctive Features of the LLM

CPGLS, JGLS offers specially designed, fully accredited, one-year full-time LLM programme with a global exposure for students seeking a world class postgraduate education in Law. The Law School offers one-year LLM in the following fields. The LLM programme is academically rigorous, requiring students to produce at least one scholarly piece of writing of publishable quality during the course of their study. Students will be supervised by a faculty member and provided with the necessary help to publish his/her independent research.

- Corporate and Financial Law and Policy
- International Trade and Investment Law
- Intellectual Property Rights and Technology Law
- General LLM
- LLM Taxation (Non- Residential)

About the LLM Programme

As an advanced degree offered at CPGLS, JGLS, the LLM programme is designed to represent outstanding academic achievement. The intensive curriculum provides a number of electives on contemporary topics in international, business law, tax law oriented streams and industry centric. Our teaching pedagogy will be based on the assumption that students pursuing an LLM degree have a strong academic background and basic understanding of their speciality area. Many of our courses will be taught by both leading scholars and periodically by accomplished international and domestic practitioners. Leading academicians, senior lawyers, judges, industry professionals will be offering lectures as a part of the programme. We ensure high faculty-student ratio and better interactive learning atmosphere.

The specially designed, fully accredited one year LLM programme in Taxation is for professionals seeking a world class education in taxation laws. This advanced and specialised master's level course in international and comparative tax law is aimed at early to mid level corporate lawyers and tax professionals who are either willing to substantiate their knowledge and expertise in taxation laws or are willing to make a switch to this domain. The programme would focus on contemporary challenges and issues faced by professionals with regard to taxation, both domestic and cross-border. With the ever growing assimilation of markets globally, the determination of applicable tax jurisdictions and the procedural requirements thereafter is a monumental challenge for tax professionals. The administration of tax laws has the intrinsic tendency to result in disputes and litigation, primarily due to differences in the interpretation of the law by the authorities and the taxpayers. As a result, significant amounts of time, money and efforts are being employed both by the taxpayers and the Government with thousands of crores of taxes getting blocked in long-drawn litigations. The course will be designed in a manner to aid the professionals in tackling these conventional challenges and also the novel developments in the field of taxation. The programme would also be helpful in preparations for tax professional examinations in the UK (like the Chartered Tax Advisor exam) and other jurisdictions. It would provide an insight into the taxation system of EU as well.

Academic Overview

The One-Year LLM consists of core/foundational and elective courses drawn from one of the three specializations. The programme shall have minimum 28 credits with the following components:

- **Three Core/Three Foundational mandatory courses (3 credits and 2 credits each)**
- **Five optional courses of (2 credits each) and**
- **Dissertation on a topic approved by the Dissertation Committee (3 Credits).**

To graduate with a LLM in Taxation, candidates need to write a dissertation on a topic relevant to the area of tax law, along with the core and specialised courses. The courses and the dissertation would be spread across two semesters. As is evidenced through various studies, the major reason for dispute between Corporations and the Government is the lack of clarity relating to interpretation of the tax statutes. The candidates would be introduced to rules of interpretation when it comes to tax statutes through various research assignments and case studies during their study period.

The teaching pedagogy will be based on the assumption that the candidates pursuing this programme have strong academic and professional background and basic understanding of the concepts of Taxation and Accounting. Many of the courses will be taught by both leading scholars and accomplished international and domestic practitioners. The LLM programme is designed to ensure high faculty-student ratio and better interactive learning atmosphere. In addition to course work, candidates will be given an opportunity to participate in certificate/ diploma programmes specially developed for JGU by the ACCA as a part of the proposed collaborations.

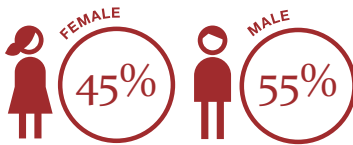
