Genesis

From ancient Bharat to modern India, higher education has always occupied a place of prominence in Indian history. In ancient times, Nalanda, Taxila and Vikramsila universities were renowned seats of higher learning, attracting students not only from all over the country but from far off countries like Korea, China, Burma (now Myanmar), Ceylon (now Sri Lanka), Tibet and Nepal. Today, India manages one of the largest higher education systems in the world.

The present system of higher education dates back to Mountstuart Elphinstone's minutes of 1823, which stressed on the need for establishing schools for teaching English and the European sciences. Later, Lord Macaulay, in his minutes of 1835, advocated "efforts to make natives of the country thoroughly good English scholars". Sir Charles Wood's Dispatch of 1854, famously known as the 'Magna Carta of English Education in India', recommended creating a properly articulated scheme of education from the primary school to the university. It sought to encourage indigenous education and planned the formulation of a coherent policy of education. Subsequently, the universities of Calcutta, Bombay (now Mumbai) and Madras were set up in 1857, followed by the university of Allahabad in 1887.

The Inter-University Board (later known as the Association of Indian Universities) was established in 1925 to promote university activities, by sharing information and cooperation in the field of education, culture, sports and allied areas.

The first attempt to formulate a national system of education in India came in 1944, with the Report of the Central Advisory Board of Education on Post War Educational Development in India, also known as the Sargeant Report. It recommended the formation of a University Grants Committee, which was formed in 1945 to oversee the work of the three Central Universities of Aligarh, Banarasand Delhi. In 1947, the Committee was entrusted with the responsibility of dealing with all the then existing Universities.

Soon after Independence, the University Education Commission was set up in 1948 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S Radhakrishnan "to report on Indian university education and suggest improvements and extensions that might be desirable to suit the present and future needs and aspirations of the country". It recommended that the University Grants Committee be reconstituted on the general model of the University Grants Commission of the United Kingdom with a full-time Chairman and other members to be appointed from amongst educationists of repute.

In 1952, the Union Government decided that all cases pertaining to the allocation of grants-in-aid from public funds to the Central Universities and other Universities and Institutions of higher learning might be referred to the University Grants Commission. Consequently, the University Grants Commission (UGC) was formally inaugurated by late Shri Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the then Minister of Education, Natural Resources and Scientific Research on 28 December 1953.

The UGC, however, was formally established only in November 1956 as a statutory body of the Government of India through an Act of Parliament for the coordination, determination and maintenance of standards of university education in India. In order to ensure effective region-wise coverage throughout the country, the UGC has decentralized its operations by setting up six regional offices at Pune, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Bhopal, Guwahati, Bangalore and Northern Regional College Bureau (NRCB) at Delhi. The head office of the UGC is located at Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg in New Delhi, with three additional bureaus operating from 35, Feroze Shah Road and the NET Bureau from South Campus of University of Delhi as well.

University Grants Commission Composition

- 1. The Commission shall consist of-
 - (i) A Chairman (ii) A Vice- Chairman, and (iii) ten other members, to be appointed by the Central Government.
- 2. The Chairman shall be chosen from among persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Government.
- 3. Of the other members referred to in clauses (iii) of sub-section (1)-
 - (a) two shall be chosen from among the officers of the Central Government, to represent that Government.; (b) not less than four shall be chosen from among persons who are at the time when they are so chosen, teachers of Universities; and (c) the remainder shall be chosen from among persons:- (i) who have knowledge of, or experience in, agriculture, commerce, forestry or industry; (ii) who are members of the engineering, legal, medical or any other learned profession; or (iii) who are Vice-Chancellors of Universities or who, not being teachers of Universities, are in the opinion of the Central Government, educationists of repute or have obtained high academic distinctions
 - Provided that not less than one-half of the number chosen under this clause shall be from among persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Government.
- 4. The Vice-Chairman shall exercise such of the powers, and discharge such of the duties, of the Chairman as may be prescribed.
- 5. Every appointment under this section shall take effect from the date on which it is notified by the Central Government in the Official Gazette.

Executive Summary: 2018-2019

The Executive Summary of the UGC Annual Report 2018-19 encapsulates the activities of the UGC undertaken in 2018-19 to achieve its mandatory objectives of coordination, determination and maintenance of standards of University Education. The physical targets achieved under various schemes / Programmes implemented by the Commission during 2018-19 and the expenditure entailed on the same has been depicted in details. The summary will give in a nutshell the composition and role of the UGC, statistical growth in the higher education sector, major decisions taken in the year, Financial outlays to Universities and Colleges under various schemes and steps taken to promote Quality and Excellence, Research, Access and Equity including Skill Education, ICT in education and Distance education.

1. Role & Organization of UGC

- The Commission consists of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and ten members (Secretary-Education, Secretary-Expenditure, 8 other members) appointed/ nominated by the Government of India. The Secretary headed the Commission's Secretariat with 407 working staff including 73 Group 'A' and 226 Group 'B' officers and 100 Group 'C' officials and 8 Canteen Staff. Out of working staff strength, 31.20 % are women, 23.10% Scheduled Caste, 4.42% Scheduled Tribe employees.
- The UGC has decentralized its functioning by opening 6 Regional Offices and One Bureau office in UGC since 1994.
- As many as 17,199 RTI applications were received under Right to Information Act 2005 and 11,110 were disposed off. 2512 appeals were received and 1163 were disposed off by CPIOs and FAAs during 2018-19. Rs. 44,190 /- were collected as RTI fee and Rs. 47424 /- as additional fee.
- UGC has framed (Minimum Qualifications for appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations 2018 and notified in the official Gazette of India on 18th July, 2018.
- UGC has issued 1st & 2nd amendment of UGC Regulations on M.Phil / Ph.D 2016 which were notified in Gazette of India 27th August, 2018 and 18th October, 2018 respectively.
- The Vigilance Cell of UGC received as many as 194 complaints from CVC (3), MHRD (12), CBI (19), Others (125) (From various Universities & Colleges and other agencies), 35 CVC referred complaints were forwarded to MHRD during the reporting year and the complaints of sensitive nature were placed before the Enquiry Committee and action was initiated according to the recommendations of the Committee. Also 14 RTI applications were received in Vigilance Cell and replies were sent in time.
- The UGC had been impleaded in as many as 820 cases filed in various courts of India during 2018-19 and an expenditure of Rs. 167.80 lakhs was incurred on the bills of advocates as compared to Rs. 152.50 lakhs in the previous year.
- The Desk-Parliament had received as many as 634 Parliament Questions during 2018-19 as compared to 685 in the previous year. The number of starred questions were 47 out of which 10 questions had been under assurance and the rest had been disposed off.
- The Anti Malpractice Cell which deals with the menace of existence and mushrooming of Fake Universities and degrees has identified a total of 23 institutions and initiated action on them. In addition to 23 Fake Universities there are two more Institutes, (1) Bhartiya Shiksha Parishad, Lucknow (2) Indian Institute

- of Planning and Management (IIPM), which are not recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Warning notices / show cause notices were issued to unapproved Institutions. Public notices/ Press released for awareness of public/students in newspapers at the beginning of academic session cautioning the aspiring students not to seek admission in fake institutions.
- UGC has set up a special reservation cell for enforcement of orders of reservation in Posts and Services.
- One matter was brought to the notice of the UGC Internal Complaint Committee on "Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place."
- The Anti-Ragging Cell which was set up in 2008 is responsible for eradicating the menace of ragging from higher educational institutions. All higher educational institutions have been asked to follow the UGC regulations with regard to ragging. A nation-wide 24X7 toll-free anti-ragging help line 1800-180-5522 has been established with call centre facilities in 12 languages. During the reporting year (2018-2019), 1031 complaints were received from various colleges/universities and the institutions concerned were asked to take action on the complaints and send the action taken report to the UGC. In 1009 cases, action taken was reported by Institutions, however in the remaining 22 cases action taken reports are awaited and in case no response is received, relevant punitive action shall be initiated as per the UGC Regulations on curbing of menace of Ragging.
- An Internal Audit Cell is functioning in UGC to oversee the UGC accounts for better maintenance and transparency.
- To obtain the policy of zero tolerance, UGC has taken various measures for ensuring the Safety of Women on Campuses and Programmes for Gender Sensitization.
- Publication Bureau incurred an Expenditure of Rs. 16.46 lakhs on Publication/ Printing of UGC documents during the year 2018-19.
 - Budget and Finances of UGC The Budget and receipt of Grant-in-Aid for the financial year 2018-19 was to the extent indicated below:
- Total Grants received (Revenue & Capital) under General Budget Head was Rs.11368.20 Crore as against allocation of Rs. 11358.28 Crore (RE). An amount of Rs. 456.75 Crore as unspent balance (2017-18) was also used during 2018-19.
- Grants Received from the Ministries under Revenue and Capital (General) Budget during 2018-19 are as follows:- (1) MHRD, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi (General) Rs 11368.20 Crore (2) Ministry of Social & Justice Empowerment, New Delhi Rs 270.00 Crore; (3) Ministry of Minority Affairs, New Delhi Rs. 97.70 Crore
- Out of the Revenue and Capital Grants of Rs. 11824.95 Crore received (Fund Received = 11368.20 Crore + Unspent Balance of 2017-18=465.75 Crore), Grants amounting to Rs. 11513.60 Crore released to Institutions during 2018-19. (Rs. 6583.62 Crore) 57.18% had gone to Central Universities, (Rs. 2135.68 Crore) 18.55% to colleges of Central Universities, (Rs. 460.57 Crore) 4.00% to State Universities, (Rs. 515.24 Crore) 4.48% to Institutions deemed to be University, (Rs. 203.04 Crore) 1.76% to Colleges of State Universities, (Rs. 245.11 Crore) 2.13% to Inter university Centres, (Rs.153.12 Crore) 1.32% to Regional offices, (Rs. 1100.23) 9.56% to online payment through Banks for Scholarships/Fellowships, (Rs. 2.32 Crore) 0.02% to Anti Ragging Measures, (Rs. 0.15 crore) 0.004% to Institute of Eminence (IOE), (Rs. 0.85 crore) 0.01% to National Academic Depository (NAD) (Rs. 103.26 Crore) 0.90% to Administrative Charges (HO) & (RO), (Rs. 10.40 Crore) 0.09% to Misc./Non Univ. & Instt.

- Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC)of UGC recommends complete framework of Uniform service conditions for the non- teaching staff (Group A,B &C) of central universities, the UGC maintained deemed to be Universities and the Delhi Colleges.
- UGC & MHRD organized a three day (26th to 28th July, 2018) National Conference of Vice-Chancellors and Directors on Research and Innovation in Higher Education.
- During 2018-19, University Grants Commission held 9 meetings and Major Decisions taken on Matters relating to Standard; Reference from Government and other National Bodies; Special Programmes; Quality Programmes and Grant to Universities / Colleges are given in Chapter-I (Page 61 to Page 87).
- Special Activities/Initiatives taken during the year 2018-19 are given in Chapter-1 (Page 87 to Page 100).
- Having come into being on 28th December, 1953, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has completed 65 years of its existence with its mandate for the co-ordination and determination of standards in Universities, for qualitative improvement of higher education in the country.

2. Growth of Higher Education System : Statistics

- The Commission is empowered under Section 12 (h) and under section 12(i) of the UGC Act, 1956 to collect information on all such matters relating the University education in India and other countries as it think fit, and to require a university to furnish it with such information as may be needed related to the financial position of the University. In order to get timely and quality data in Higher Education Sector which has implications for human development, Ministry of Human Resource Development initiated an All India Survey of Higher Education to build a database and to assess the overall picture of Higher Education in the country.
- A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of National Informatics Centre (NIC) for collection and compilation of the data. In order to get timely and quality data in the education sector, compilation and estimation of Data at All India level is being made through portal http://aishe.gov.in.
- At the time of Independence of India, there were only 20 Universities and 500 Colleges in the country with 2.1 lakhs students in higher education. The numbers now have increased 52.35 times in the case of the Degree awarding Universities (1047), 83.87 times in the case of Colleges (41935) and the students enrolment (37399388) has gone up to over 178.09 times in the system of higher education in comparison to the figures at the time of independence.
- As on 31.03.2019, the number of Universities listed by the UGC under Section 2(f) of UGC Act 1956 had gone up to 911 universities (51 Central, 397 State Public, 334 State Private, 126 Deemed to be Universities, 3 Institutions established under State Legislation and 12070 Colleges are listed under Section 2(f) and out of these colleges 9755 colleges are under Section 12B in the Higher Education sector. So far as the number of universities in states is concerned, Rajasthan tops the list with 83 universities, followed by Uttar Pradesh (75), Gujarat (67) etc.
- During the reporting year 2018-19, 17 State Public and 40 State Private Universities and 3 Deemed to be Universities were included in the UGC list of universities. 7 State Public Universities, 23 Deemed Universities and 2 State Private Universities were declared fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act 1956.

- During 2018-19 there were 41,935 Colleges (Affiliated -38787, Constituent-1702, PG/Off Campus Centres-183, Recognised Centres-1263.).
- At the end of the financial year 2018-19, the total number of colleges recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 were 12070. The maximum number of colleges recognized so far under Section 2(f) is in the State of Uttar Pradesh (2839), followed by Maharashtra (1471), Karnataka (1065), Tamil Nadu (660), Madhya Pradesh (592) and Gujarat (557) etc.
- Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Higher Education in India is 26.3% which is calculated for 18-23 years of Age Group. GER for male population is 26.3% and for Female it is 26.4%.
- During the academic session 2018-19, the total students enrolment in all courses and levels in regular and distance education Programmes was 373.99 lakhs including 181.90 lakhs women students, constituting 48.64%. The maximum number of students had been enrolled in the state of Uttar Pradesh (64.69 lakhs), followed by Maharashtra (42.30 lakhs), Tamil Nadu (34.14 lakhs) and West Bengal (20.97 lakhs) etc.
- The student enrolment in terms of percentages at various levels was 79.76% at UG, 10.81% at PG, 0.53% at Research, 8.26% at Diploma/Certificate and 0.64% at Integrated Courses.
- There are 47427 foreign Students from 164 different countries enrolled in Universities and Collegs.
- During the year 2018-19, Out of total no. of 1416299 Teachers, about 58% are male teachers and 42% are female teachers.
- There were 169170 and 30692 Students enrolled in Ph.D & M.Phil courses respectively in Universities and Colleges during 2018-19.
- During 2018, 64.74 Lakh Students have been Graduated and 15.00 Lakh Students Passed Post Graduation.
- The number of research degrees Ph.D. and M.Phil awarded during 2018 were 40813 and 25787 respectively. At Ph.D level, maximum number of students Out turn was in the Science stream (10023) followed by Engineering and Technology (7160).
- In terms of percentages, the women enrolment has been the highest in Lakshdweep (76.70%), followed by Kerala (58.19%) & Andaman and Nichobar (55.67%). In absolute numbers, UP had been on the top with 32.79 lakhs women enrolment, followed by Maharashtra (19.06 lakhs) and Tamil Nadu (16.77 lakhs), etc.

3. Development and Maintenance Assistance to Universities

- General Development Grants are being provided to the Central, State and Deemed to be Universities for their overall development covering aspects like enhancing access, ensuring equity, imparting relevant education, improving quality, making the administration effective, enhancing facilities for students, augmenting research facilities and any other plans of universities. Maintenance Grants are also being provided to limited number of universities to meet their recurring expenditure on salaries of both teaching and non-teaching employees, maintenance of labs, libraries, buildings and also for obligatory payments such as taxes, telephone & electricity bills, postage, etc. The Central and a few Deemed Universities are being paid both Capital and Revenue (Non-Recurring and Recurring Expenditure) grants where as the State Universities are being paid only Capital grant. Private Universities are given Grant for Teachers & students schemes only.
- During 2018-19, the number of Central Universities are 51. Out of these, Nine universities namely, (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New

Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai (iv) South Asian University, New Delhi (v) Nalanda University, Bihar (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Uttar Pradesh and (vii) Rani Lakshmi Bai Central Agricultural University, Jhansi, Uttar Pradesh (viii) Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa, Samastipur-848003 and (ix) National Sports University, Kowruk, Manipur-795146 are not funded by the UGC.

- General Development Grant amounting to Rs. 414932.00 Lakhs, Rs. 189922.66 Lakhs and Rs. 56064.91
 Lakhs was provided to 42 Central Universities under Salary, Recurring and Capital Assets respectively
 during 2018-19.
- An amount of Rs. 113.38 lakh has been released to Central Universities during 2018-19 under the Scheme of Non NET fellowship for M.Phil / Ph.D.
- UGC has sanctioned full fledged YOGA departments and courses in eight Central Universities (i) Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University (2) Visva Bharti (3) Central University of Rajasthan (4) Central University of Kerala (5) Indira Gandhi National Tribal University (6) Manipur University (7) Central University of Himachal Pradesh (8) Central University of Haryana to promote value of Yoga as a means of promoting health, Social harmony and discipline.
- Grant of Rs. 42.50 lakh has been released to Jamia Millia Islamia under Coaching Scheme for Residential Coaching Academies for Minorities/SC/ST/Women during 2018-19.
- UGC has initiated the scheme for special honorarium of Rs. 15,000/- p.m. to the teachers who are Fellows of at least two of the identified four specified Science Academies. An amount of Rs. 14.59 lakh has been released to Central Universities- Pondicherry University (Rs. 2.25 lakhs) & Banaras Hindu University (Rs. 12.34 lakhs) during 2018-19 under the scheme.
- UGC provided funds to three Central Universities: Aligarh Muslim, Maulana Azad Nation Urdu & Jamia Millia Islamia for establishment of Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers.
- UGC is providing funds to Central Universities for establishing and strengthening of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQACs) in them.
- The UGC has sanctioned for expansion and strengthening of teacher education in Central Universities. At present 39 Central Universities have schools/departments of education offering various pre services and other teacher education programme.
- The UGC has established 9 Centre for Endangered Languages to the following 9 Central Universities Tezpur University, Rajiv Gandhi University, Sikkim University, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Central University of Jharkhand, Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya, Central University of Karnataka, Central University of Kerala and Visva Bharati. During the year 2018-19 total grant of Rs. 130.51 lakh was released to Three Central University (1) Central University of Jharkhand (Rs. 13.51) (2) Guru Ghasi Dass Vishwayadaya (Rs. 27.00 Lakh) and (3) Sikkim University (Rs. 90.00 Lakh) respectively.
- HEFA has been set up on 31st May 2017 by the Central Government as a non-profit, Non Banking Financing Company (NBFC) for mobilising extra-budgetary resources for building crucial infrastructure in the higher educational institutions under Central Government. Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education (RISE) by 2022 is an attempt to translate the objectives into action plan by making available resources from the market. In order to accommodate the needs of all institutions, especially the institutions set up after 2014, Central Universities, and those with limited internal resources the Government has approved the five windows for financing under HEFA and the modalities of repaying

- the Principal portion of the fund (interest continues to be serviced through Government grants in all these cases)
- The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres or any other units therein, by whatever name called, shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its schemes without having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December,2015. Out of 40 Central Universities, 36 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation earlier but accreditation period is over for Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya and Mizoram University have applied for accreditation. One newly established central university i.e. Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari) is not eligible for accreditation. Central University of Jharkhand has Applied first time for accreditation.
- MHRD / Govt of India has implemented the Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) for admission in Central Education Institution in accordance with One Hundred and Third Amendment of Constitutions of India. For its immediate implementation and compliance, UGC has requested all the Central Education Institutions to implement the Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) for admissions.
- Govt. of India, DOPT vide its O.M. No. 36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res.) dt. 19th January 2019 has notified 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs)in Central Government Posts and services and would be effective in respect of all Direct recruitment vacancies to be notified on or after 01.02.2019. In pursuance of the decision of Govt. of India, UGC vide its letter No. F25-4/2007(CU) Pt. file dt. 20th March,2018 extended the above decision in all Central Universities.
- As on 31st March, 2019, there were 397 State Public and 334 State Private Universities set up under laws enacted by the legislatures of various states.
- During the financial year 2018-19 an amount of Rs.253.80 crore has been sanctioned to State Universities under General Development Assistance Scheme.
- The UGC has introduced the new scheme "Swachh Bharat Swasth Bharat" during 2014-15. The Universities shall utilize the General Development grant for this purpose which has been already allocated to State Universities.
- An amount of Rs.220.27 crore was sanctioned to Punjab University, Chandigarh towards Non-Plan grant (2018-19) Salary Head.
- As on 31.03.2019, there had been 126 Deemed Universities, Out of 126 Deemed Universities there are
 21 Identified Deemed Universities receiving Development and Fixed Manintenance / Special Grant from the UGC.
- The UGC has released an amount of Rs. 5796.94 lakh to 10 Deemed Universities during the year 2018-19 under the General Development Scheme (Block Grant).
- An amount of Rs. 41483.45 lakh has been released during the year 2018-19 under the Capital Grant (Maintenance Grant) to 10 Deemed Universities.

4. Development and Maintenance Assistance to Colleges

• The focus of Development Assistance to colleges has been on supporting the teaching – learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure. Emphasis has been on the expansion and consolidation of facilities

in the existing institutions, improvement of standards through modernization, rationalization and diversification of UG courses especially to relate them to career opportunities. Setting up new colleges in educationally backward areas where adequate facilities do not exist, is also one of the priorities of the Commission.

- As on 31st March, 2019, there were 40489 colleges (Affiliated & Constituent) in the country. Out of these, only 12070 colleges are recognized up to 31-03-2019 under section 2(f) of the UGC Act, constituting 29.81% of the total number of colleges. Out of 12070 only 9755 are eligible to receive grants from the UGC under Section 12B of the UGC Act. All the schemes/programmes relating to the college sector are being implemented through the UGC Regional Offices located at Hyderabad, Pune, Bhopal, Kolkata, Guwahati, Bangalore and the Northern Region College Bureau (NRCB)at Delhi.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional Offices/NRCB released the total Grant of Rs. 13.60 crore to 155 beneficiaries (colleges) under the scheme of Development Assistance to Colleges.
- During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 as many as 5853 eligible colleges were assisted to the extent of Rs. 797.32 crores under the College Development schemes.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional Offices/NRCB released a grant of Rs. 16.00 Crore to 131 Beneficiaries (Colleges) under the scheme of construction of Women's Hostel. Total Grant of Rs. 504.89 Crore was released to 2024 Colleges during 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional offices/NRCB released the grant of Rs. 33.10 crore under the scheme of Autonomous Colleges to 176 beneficiaries (colleges). Total Grant of Rs. 225.92 Crore was released to 309 Colleges during 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional Offices/NRCB released a Grant of Rs. 2.14 crore in Sciences and Rs. 2.04 Crore in Humanities under the Scheme of Minor Research Project for Teachers to 457 Teacher in Sciences & 554 Teachers in Humanities. During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 Grant of Rs. 246.46 Crore was released to 18462 Teachers in Humanities & Sciences.
- During the financial year 2018-19, the UGC Regional Offices/NRCB had approved as many as 255 proposals for organizing Seminars/Symposia/Workshops etc., and had released Rs. 0.91 crores to the eligible colleges. During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 Rs. 81.01 Crore released to 6937 Colleges Beneficiaries under the Scheme.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional offices/NRCB released a grant of Rs. 56.65 crore to 1396 Beneficiaries (Teacher) under the scheme of Faculty Development Programme. During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 Rs. 239.28 Crore released to 8485 Beneficiaries (Teachers) under the Scheme.
- The UGC has taken a policy decision to direct all colleges to establish IQAC for which it has decided to provide Rs. 3.00 lakhs as seed money to each college to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of IQAC. During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 Regional Offices released a grant of Rs. 139.46 crore to 4685 Beneficiaries (Colleges) under the Scheme of Internal Quality Assurance Cell for Colleges.
- During the year 2018-19, Regional Offices/NRCB released a Grant of Rs. 25.44 crore to 149 Beneficiaries (Colleges) under the scheme of Sports Infrastructure & Equipment in colleges. During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 Rs. 338.45 Crore released to 1091 Colleges.
- In recognition of institutions which have completed 100 years of their existence and have contributed tremendously not only in the field of higher education but also maintaining the cultural, social and moral

- fabric of the long history of our country, UGC during 2018-19 provided a grant of Rs. 0.34 Crore to one college under the Scheme of "Granting Special Heritage to Colleges". During 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019 a grant of Rs. 10.54 Crore was released to 16 Colleges under the Scheme.
- Visually Challenged Teachers: This UGC Scheme helps visually challenged permanent teachers to pursue teaching and research with the help of a Reader and by using teaching and learning aids by way of providing Reader's Allowance and funds for purchase of Braille books, recorded materials etc. During 2018-19 a grant of Rs. 0.33 Crore released to 74 beneficiaries. Total Grant of 1.97 Crore was released to 265 beneficiaries during 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019.
- The UGC Regional offices/NRCB released a Grant of Rs. 1334.05 Crore to 7076 beneficiary Colleges during 1.04.2012 to 31.3.2019. for the Schemes which were discontinued during XII Plan as one time catch up grant, additional assistance, merged schemes, Golden jubilee celebration under committed liabilities (Old UGC Schemes)
- A total Revenue grant of Rs. 198158.86 Lakh as maintenance grant had been provided to the 53 colleges
 of Delhi University during 2018-19 and an amount of Rs 5874.58 lakh had also been paid to the 4
 constituent colleges of Banaras Hindu University.
- During 2018-19 financial assistance of Rs. 1165.63 Lakh was provided to 19 colleges of Delhi University towards construction of Women's Hostels, Sports Infrastructure, Construction of Building, Seminar/Conference/Workshop & Visually Handicap Teachers -Readers allowance.

5. Quality and Excellence

- In order to achieve excellence in teaching and research, the UGC selected 16 identified universities for granting the status of 'University with Potential for Excellence' (UPE). Tenure of 15 universities has already been over and extension was granted up to 31.03.2019 to utilize the unspent grant.
- Under the Scheme "Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas (CPEPA)" to promote quality and excellence and interdisciplinary approach in teaching and research activities, As on 31st March, 2019, 29 Centres from different universities are being supported under the scheme. An amount of Rs. 2.45 Crore was released to the Centers during 2018-19.
- To achieve excellence mainly in teaching and to initiate a research culture in colleges, the UGC has initiated a scheme "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE). Presently 295 colleges are enjoying the CPE status and 19 colleges are enjoying the "College of Excellence" (CE) status. During 2018-19, 314 colleges are under the scheme CPE. An amount of Rs. 14.61 crore was released to colleges during 2018-19.
- The University Departments of Science including Bio-Science, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences are being supported financially under the scheme of Special Assistance Programme (SAP) for achieving excellence in research and for improving the quality of post-graduate teaching programme. As on 31.03.2019 the number of SAP supported departments stood at 808. During 2018-19, 150 departments were assisted under CAS level, 72 Departments under DSA level and 586 Departments under DRS level. An expenditure of Rs. 74.62 Crore was incurred during the year 2018-19.
- To provide academic freedom for potential colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, the UGC has been conferring autonomous status on them. Up to 31.03.2019, autonomous status had been given to 687 colleges spread over 108 universities of 25 states. During 2018-19, the

- UGC Regional Offices released grants to the extent of Rs. 33.10 crore under the scheme of Autonomous Colleges to 176 beneficiary colleges.
- A comprehensive Programme for professional development of teachers through Human Resource Development Centers (HRDC) & Regional Centre of Capacity Building (RCCB), (Academic Staff Colleges ASC) had been carried out in different disciplines. Grant of Rs. 44.22 Crore had been sanctioned to these Centers functioning in various universities. During 2018-19 approx. 25000 Teachers-participants have gone through the programme / courses conducted by 66 UGC HRDCs.
- Three weeks Flagship leadership development training programme (LEAP) (2 week domestic and 1 week foreign Training) for second level academic functionaries in public funded Higher Education Institutions has been launched by MHRD.
- Towards the promotion of Hindi Language, the Rajbhasha Section of the UGC organized Essay, Noting & Drafting and Hindi Typing competitions for its employees, conducted workshops/ Hindi Pakhwara and celebrated Hindi Divas during the reporting year. Approval has been granted by the Commission for the establishment and up gradation of Hindi Department in Central / State / Deemed Universities receiving grants from the Commission.
- UGC has been running joint Research Programme with countries like USA, UK, Israel, Norway and New Zealand and has also facilitated Indian Scholars to realize their research potential through scholarship and research programmes etc.
- Under Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme, UGC and Israel Science Foundation (ISF) invited proposals for Joint –Research Project and approved 11 proposals for funding in the year 2018 for a period of three years
- UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships are intended to be between Institution based research teams in UK and India of proven research ability. Under Thematic Partnership, 18 Joint research projects were awarded in the year 2018 for a period of 2 years i.e. from 15th March, 2018 to 14th March, 2020.
- Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP): On the basis of the MoU signed between the Ministries and JDI, an MoU has been signed on 5th October 2015 between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India and German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), Germany on Indo-German Partnership in Higher Education (IGP) and MoU was Exchanged in the presence of Honorable Prime Minister of India and HE Chancellor of Germany. In the 1st cycle, 8 Institutional partnerships have been awarded in 2016 for a period for 4 years.
- Under Project based Personal Exchange Programme (PPP) worked out by the UGC and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), in 2018, one project was selected for a period of two year programme.
- The Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing higher education links between India and Norway. An MoU on cooperation in higher education and on the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU), was signed on February 14, 2014. Under INCP, UGC, India and SIU, Norway selected 13 projects in the year 2014 for a period of 3 years and further extended to 31st December, 2018.
- Indo US -21st Century Knowledge Initiative was announced in 2009 as an affirmation of the commitment to build an enhance India- United States Strategic Partnership in education.

- Under Indo-New Zealand Joint Research Projects, applications are invited from Academics seeking funding the Joint Research Projects.
- Australia-India-Educational Council (AIEC) awarded one project on student mobility to Jammia Millia Islamia University, New Delhi.
- UGC offered Raman Fellowships for Post-Doctoral Research in USA with the aim to provide excellent opportunity to young Indian researchers and teachers to have international collaborative research training in emerging fields.
- The Association of Commonwealth Universities, United Kingdom offered 10 Common-Wealth Medical Fellowship awards to enable promising faculty members in Universities and medical colleges in India to do research work. During 2018, UGC nominated 10 Indian Doctors, out of which 3 Indian Doctors were selected by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission.
- UGC invited applications from Indian students to pursue Graduate, Post-Graduate & Doctoral Studies in Hungary. In the year 2018-19, 166 Indian students selected by the Hungarian Scholarship Board. Against this 3 Hungarian Scholars visited india to pursue their Studies in selected Universities of Higher Education.
- During 2018, UGC had nominated four Scholars to visit Bulgaria for participation in International Seminar in Bulgarian Language and Culture.
- Foreign Language Teachers: The UGC has collaborative programmes which, inter-alia, provide for the appointment of foreign language teachers in Indian universities to teach foreign languages. As per the EEP & CEP appointment of 22 language teacher have been approved in various Higher Education Institutions.
- The UGC conducts a National Eligidility Test (UGC NET) has been entrusted to National Testing Agency (NTA) (Constituted by Govt. of India) twice in a year for eligibility for Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowships to ensure minimum standards for entrants in teaching and research. The NET examination is being conducted in 81 subjects. In July, 2018 UGC NET, 8.59 lakhs candidates appeared for eligibility for Assistant Professor and 5.80 Lakh candidates appeared for Junior Research Fellowship. Out of these candidates 56364 (6.56%) qualified for Assistant Professor and 3972(0.69%) qualified for JRF & Assistant Professor.
- In December. 2018 UGC-NET 6.82 lakhs Candidates appeared for eligibility for Assistant Professor and 4.72 Lakh appeared for Junior Research Fellowship. Out of these candidates 44355 (6.50%) qualified for Assistant Professor and 3946 (0.84%) qualified for JRF & Assistant Professor.
- The CSIR, on behalf of the UGC, has been conducting NET in five Science subjects. In June 2018 and December 2018 Joint CSIR-UGC NET, 7247 and 7458 candidates qualified for the eligibility for Assistant Professor including 1500 UGC JRF in each test.
- The Commission has also granted accreditation to states/group of states for conducting State Eligibility Test (SET). The candidates who have cleared the State Eligibility Test (SET) for lectureship prior to 1st June, 2002, are exempted from appearing in the NET Examination. For SET examinations scheduled on or after June, 2002, the qualified candidates are eligible to apply for the post of Lecturer/Assistant Professor only in the Universities/Colleges situated in the state from where they have cleared their SET Examination.
- In the year 2018-19, the States of Andhra Pradesh, Chhatisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Goa, North Eastern States, Tamil Nadu,

Telanagana, West Bengal had conducted SET examinations successfully. The expenditure for conducting SET is borne by the respective states.

- Travel Grant has been availed by 355 college teachers/librarians and 7 Vice-Chancellors and 2 Commission Members for presenting their research papers in International Conferences during the reporting year. The financial assistance is paid for their foreign travel, registration fee, residence allowance, etc. The permanent teachers/librarians once in three years and Vice Chancellors, Commission Members and UGC Officers once in two years can avail this facility. An amount of Rs.5.25 crores had been paid to the beneficiaries during the reporting year.
- Eight Inter-University Centres (IUCs) set up as autonomous centres under clause 12(ccc) of the UGC Act,1956 are functioning in Indian Universities System to provide common facilities, services and programmes to universities and research institutions etc. by offering expertise in each field and providing access to the state-of-the-art equipment and excellent library facilities. During the reporting year 2018-19 the UGC released an amount of Rs. 116.78 crores Rs. 77.36 crore & 107.87 crore under 36,31 & 35 Head to the Seven Inter-University Centers.
- The UGC has established 4 National Facility Centres in selected Universities and assisted them regularly. During the year 2018-19 the UGC released a grant of Rs. 561.63 Lakh to these Centres.
- Under scheme of Development of Sports Infrastructure and Equipment in Universities to enhance capacity building in various Universities for promotion of sports with an idea that broad base of the sporting pyramid would ultimately produce enough sports persons to participate in elite sports to represent India in International and national events to bring pride to the country. An amount of Rs. 5.72 Crore released during 2018-19. An Total amount of Rs. 73.68 was released to 69 Beneficiary Universities during 2015-16 to 2018-19.
- The Government approved the Scheme of providing regulatory Architecture for setting up / upgrading of 20 Institutes (10 from Public Sector & 10 from Private Sector) as World Class teaching and research Institutions called "Institutions of Eminence". The Empowered Expert Committee (EEC) constituted to effect the selection of 20 High Potential Institutions under the provision of the UGC's Regulations and Guidelines had submitted its first report (May 10, 2018) to the UGC wherein it had identified and recommended 8 Public Institutions and 3 Private Institutions to be covered under the scheme of Institutions of Eminence.
- In order to redefine and strengthen UGC approved list of Journals, the UGC decided that research Journal indexed in SCOPUS and WOS may be considered for all academic purposes in the discipline of Science, Engineering, Technology, Agriculture and Bio Medical Sciences.
- For suggesting a list of credible quality journals in the discipline such as the Social Sciences, Humanities, Languages, Arts, Culture, Indian Knowledge system etc., the UGC established a Consortium of Academic and Research Ethics (CARE)
- Recognising the need to create an enabling environment where by Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) can become Institutions of global excellence, autonomy is pivotal to promote and Institutionalize excellence in Higher Education. The UGC (categorisations of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations 2018 have been notified on 12th February,2018
- The Commission in its 532nd meeting held 24.05.2018 approved the objectives set for improving the quality in Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs). All HEIs shall strive to achieve the objectives by 2022.

Promotion of Research 6.

- The main objective of the scheme of "Research Projects for Teachers" is to promote excellence in research in higher education by supporting research programmes of University/College teachers in various disciplines. The emphasis is on such areas that cut across disciplines and subjects such as Health, Gerontology, Environment, Nano-technology, Biotechnology, Stress Management, WTO and its impact on economy, etc. and other areas as would be identified by subject experts. The maximum ceilings for Major Research Projects in Science including Engg./Tech./Medical/Pharmacy/Agriculture & Humanities, Social Sciences including languages, Arts and Law etc are Rs. 20.00 lakhs and Rs. 15.00 lakhs respectively. Even retired teachers upto the age of 70 may undertake research projects. During the year 2018-19, there were 227 beneficiaries in Arts & Humanities and 861 in Sciences. Total Grant of Rs. 11.45 crore was released to Major Research Projects Beneficiaries during the year.
- The scheme of Research Awards is for permanent teachers of eligible Universities and Institutions to do full time independent research for two years in their respective area of specialization without undertaking any research guidance. Teachers who are doctorates and are under 45 years of age are considered for the award. The selection of awardees is made for 100 slots in alternative years for all disciplines. An expenditure of Rs. 5.80 crores had been incurred towards payment to the awardees during 2018-19.
- To attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin, who may be working abroad, in order to promote high quality research, the scheme of Research Scientists was initiated and implemented in 1983. At present, 24 Research Scientists are on UGC roll working in various institutions. During 2018-2019, an expenditure of Rs. 1.89 crores had been incurred towards the salary and contingencies of these Research Scientists.
- The objective of Post Doctoral Fellowship for SC/ST candidates scheme is to provide fellowships to SC/ST candidates for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. The SC/ST candidates who have obtained a doctoral degree, have published research work to their credit and have already shown evidence of independent research work are eligible. The fellowship is for five years. An expenditure of Rs. 25.95 crore incurred towards payment to the 460 Post-Doctoral fellows during 2018-19.
- For the unemployed women, holding Ph.D. degrees and intending to pursue Post-Doctoral research on full time basis, the UGC has been providing 100 fellowships per annum with the fellowship amount of Rs. 38,800/- p.m. for fresh candidates, and Rs. 46,500/- p.m. after 2 years and contingency amount of Rs. 50,000/- p.a. for five years. During the reporting year, an expenditure of Rs. 32.72 crores had been incurred towards payment to the 591 women fellows.
- Dr. S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences including languages provide an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Indian Universities & Colleges. The total number of slots available under the Scheme are 200 per year. The fellowship amount is Rs. 38,800/p.m. for 1st Year, Rs. 40,300/- for 2nd year and Rs. 41,900/- for 3rd Year with contingency amount of Rs. 50,000/- p.a. An amount of Rs. 18.63 crore had been disbursed to 454 Beneficiarias during 2018-19.
- D.S. Kothari Post-Doctoral Fellowship is provided to pursue Post-Doctoral Research in Basic Sciences / Medical / Engineering and Technology. Till date 2661 candidates have been awarded and 1364 PDFs are in position. During 2018-19, an amount of Rs. 23.26 crores had been released to the fellows working in various institutions.
- With a view to providing opportunity for continuance of research contributions in Basic Science Research by talented Science and Technology teachers who are nearing superannuation in state universities, the

UGC started a scheme called UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship. Teachers who are at the level of Professors/ Associate Professors in Science & Technology departments of universities are eligible. The fellowship carries an amount of Rs. 50,000/- p.m. which is exclusive of pension and/or other retirement benefits. During 2018-19, an amount of Rs. 11.14 crores was released to 104 BSR Faculty Fellows

- The Emeritus Fellowship Scheme provides an opportunity to superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years, of all recognized Universities to pursue active research in their respective field of specialization. The number of slots available under the scheme is 100 for Science streams and 100 for Humanities & Social Sciences every alternative year at any given time basis. The honorarium for Fellow is Rs. 31000 /- p.m. for two years with contingency amount of Rs. 50,000/- p.a. During 2018-19, an expenditure of Rs. 3.82 Crores had been incurred towards payment to the 169 beneficiary Fellows.
- Under the scheme of Junior Research Fellowships (JRF) for Indian Nationals JRF is provided to the Indian candidates who qualify UGC NET conducted by either UGC or CSIR.
- In the reporting year, an expenditure of Rs. 740.00 Crore had been incurred under JRF schemes for Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. At present approx. 24850 Scholars are pursuing M.Phil / Ph.D under JRF.
- Under the Scheme of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) and Research Associate ship (RA) for Foreign Nationals, 46 Foreign National Candidates are pursuing Ph.D / Post Doctoral Research. An amount of Rs. 0.52 Crore was paid to JRF & RA (Foreign National) during the year 2018-19.
- To minimize the social disparities in Higher Education, the UGC provides 2000 National Fellowships to SC candidates every year to undertake advanced studies and Research leading to M.Phil/Ph.D. degrees. During 2018-19, an expenditure of Rs. 254.84 crores for 6883 Beneficiaries SC Fellows incurred under the scheme.
- The Ministry of Tribal Affairs has entrusted and funded the UGC since 2005 for implementation of the Scheme of National Fellowships for ST Candidates by providing 750 slots per year. An expenditure of Rs. 1.50 Crore was incurred on 35 Beneficiaries during the year 2018-19.
- The Ministry of Minority Affairs has entrusted and funded the UGC since 2009 for implementation of Maulana Azad National Fellowship by providing 1000 slots per year for minority community to pursue higher studies such as M.Phil and Ph.D. The rate of fellowship is at par with the other UGC fellowships. An expenditure of Rs. 91.13 crore was incurred to 2537 Beneficiaries
- The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has entrusted the UGC the scheme of National Fellowship for students of Other Backward Classes (OBC) since 2014. There are 1000 slots for award of Fellowship every year for all subjects. Fellowship amount is at par with other UGC Fellowships. During 2018-19 an expenditure of Rs. 22.44 Crore was incurred under the Scheme to 683 Beneficiarias.
- The UGC has been entrusted the Scheme of National Fellowship for students with Disabilities by Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment since 2012 to increase opportunity to students with disabilities for pursuing higher education leading to degrees such as M.Phil and Ph.D. Fellowship amount is at par with other JRF Schemes. Payment to the scholars is made by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Disability Affairs, Government of India, New Delhi. The Applications have been Invited for the consideration under the scheme (2017-18 & 2018-19)
- Under Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship Scheme, an amount of Rs. 4.74 crore has been disbursed to 142 Beneficiaries during 2018-19.

- The "Research Fellowships in Sciences for Meritorious Students" (RFSMS) scheme has been implemented with an aim to provide opportunities to meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in Sciences. The candidates who are registered for Ph.D. in Science subjects in Universities with Potential for Excellence/ Centers of Advanced Studies and Departments of Special Assistance identified by the UGC are eligible. The tenure of the Fellowship is initially for two years and it can be extended to three more years based on the evaluation of work done by the Fellow. Up to the end of 2018-19, 9355 Research Fellowships had been allocated to SAP/Non-SAP Departments and 3550 JRFs are in position. During 2018-19, a total grant of Rs. 62.94 crores had been released.
- Non-NET Fellowship for M.Phil/Ph.D in Central Universities Started in 2006-2007. An amount of Rs.113.38 lakh has been released to Central Universities during 2018-2019.
- Post-graduate Scholarships for SC/ST Students in Professional Courses has been implemented keeping in view the social background of the candidates from deprived sections of the society and to provide them an opportunity to undertake post-graduate level studies. Selection for the year 2018-19 is yet to be made. An expenditure of Rs. 2.18 Crore was incurred and 312 beneficiaries received financial assistance.
- The scheme of Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child is to achieve and promote girls education by supporting through scholarships to such girls who happen to be the only child in their families and also providing an incentive for the parents to observe small family norms. Girls who have taken admission in Master's degree programme in any recognized university or a PG College are eligible. The duration of scholarship is for a period of two years with the scholarship amount of Rs. 3,100/- p.m. (for 10 months a year). All eligible students will get the scholarship. Selection for the year 2017-18 & 2018-19 will be made on the Naional Scholarship Portal. An expenditure of Rs. 9.96 Crore had been incurred and 2289 Beneficiaries received the financial assistance during 2018-19.
- With an objective to promote and nurture talented students to pursue PG education, the scheme of PG Merit Scholarship for university Rank Holders at undergraduate level is implemented from 2005-06 onwards. The awardees under the scheme can pursue their PG courses (professional courses are not covered) in any area of specialization as also in any institution of higher learning in the country. The first and second rank holders in general courses and only first rank holders in Honours' Courses are eligible for the scholarship. The duration of scholarship is two years with scholarship amount of Rs. 3100/- p.m. (for 10 months a year). Selection for the year 2017-18 & 2018-19 will be made on the Naional Scholarship Portal. An expenditure of Rs. 4.49 Crore had been incurred and 979 Beneficiaries received the financial assistance during 2018-19.
- To help the graduate students pursue PG studies in higher educational institutions, the UGC has been providing PG Scholarships for GATE qualified students of M.E./M.Tech./M.Pharm. with Scholarship amount of Rs. 12,400/- p.m. and a contingency grant of Rs. 5,000/- p.a. An expenditure of Rs. 21.01 Crore was incurred during 2018-19 to 1125 Beneficiaries.
- With regard to promotion of Higher Education in North Eastern Region (NER) the UGC launched "Ishan Uday" Special Scholarship Scheme for North Eastern Region. Rate of scholarship is Rs. 5,400/p.m. for General Degree Courses & Rs. 7,800/- for Technical and Professional Degree courses. 10,000 candidate are selected under the scheme. Selection for the year 2017-18 & 2018-19 is yet to be finalized

- on the National Scholarship portal. An expenditure of Rs. 151.67 Crore incurred during 2018-19. 19970 Beneficiaries Recived Financial Assistance during 2018-19.
- Free education for sports medal winner/participants of National/International event has been introduced during XII Plan in UGC. The objective of the Scheme is to provide financial assistance to Medal Winners in National Games or participants in recognized international sporting events, elite sports persons who are studying in Universities/Colleges for full time regular courses. There are 70 Beneficiaries under the Scheme.
- To support subject associations at National level in Social Sciences, Humanities & Languages in organizing specific activities in order to encourage teachers and researchers to participate in conferences / Seminars / Workshops and to present paper leading to publications, UGC received 5 Proposals under the Scheme of Incentivisation of Teachers, Subjects / Discipline based associations for organizing various Academic & research during 2018-19.
 - Based on the recommendations of the Empowered Committee for Basic Scientific Research in Indian Universities the following Schemes are being implemented by UGC:
- To strengthen high quality research in Science related disciplines at internationally competitive level and to promote innovative teaching in universities through induction of fresh talent in an academic faculty, Faculty Recharge Programme was initiated in the year 2011 for this purpose, a Cell had been established in Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, and a National Coordinator had been appointed to initiate the process of selection of teachers. At present 373 faculties have been selected out of which 185 are in position. During 2018-19 Rs. 13.32 crores were released in respect of salaries to 160 selectees and Start up grant to 30 Canditate from various Universities/Institutions.
- As many as 10 departments were approved by the Empowered Committee for the establishment of Network Research Centres under the BSR programme, During 2018-19, Grant of Rs. 4.81 Crore was released to these centres.
- Under the scheme Start-up Grant for newly recruited faculty, all teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor with Ph.D degree with minimum two research publications in approved/cited journals are eligible to receive financial support. The quantum of support under the scheme is Rs. 10 Lakh. An amount of Rs. 11.96 Crore was released to 181 newly appointed faculty members for various Universities / Institutions during 2018-19.
- Under the Mid Career Award scheme Rs.10.00 Lakh is provided for a teacher to do research. The grant could be utilized for minor equipment, Chemicals, contingency and fieldwork. An amount of Rs. 2.09 crore was released to 28 teachers who are pursuing their research in various Indian Universities / Institutions.

7. Gender and Social Equity

- The objective of the scheme of Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges is for expansion of women studies through teaching, research and field action and encourage constant interaction with field reality through field action programme. As on 31.03.2019, as many as 159 Women Study Centers had been established and functioning in the university system. An amount of Rs. 7.00 crore has been released to the Women Studies Centre during 2012-13 to 2018-19.
- Govt. of India and University Grants Commission is continuously monitoring the Progress of implementation of reservation policy of SCs, STs, OBC & Persons with Disabilities for Teaching and Non-Teaching staff posts as well as admission to all level courses in Universities. The

Information on the above parameters is collected by SC/ST/OBC Section regularly and provided to MHRD, National Commission for SC & National Commission for ST for information and further action.

- The UGC provides financial assistance for conducting special classes outside the regular time table to enable students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/Minority Communities who need remedial/NET-SET Examination/Entry into Service Coaching to come to the required level. New guidelines of these schemes are under process.
- An amount of Rs. 6.13 lakh and Rs.10.14 Lakh has been released to five Centres under Remedial Coaching for Entry into Service Schemes for SC/ST/OBC & Minority Community Students respectibely.
- To make Colleges and Universities more responsive to the needs and constraints of the disadvantaged social groups, the UGC established Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) in Universities & Colleges. An amount of Rs. 0.88 Lakhs has been released to Five Centers during 2018-19.
- The Commission in its 535th meeting held on 27th September ,2018 resolved to establish a SC/ST cell in newly established centrally funded universities where the SC/ST cell does not exist.
- To support research on the issue of Social Exclusion and inclusion which has theoretical as well as policy
 importance, the UGC had established teaching-cum-research centers in Universities called as Centers for
 Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusion Policy. As on 31.03.2019, as many as 33 Centers are functioning
 in different universities. UGC released a grant of Rs. 7.25 Crore to five Centers during 2018-19 under
 the Scheme.
- With an aim of not ignoring persons with disabilities in the Higher Education System and with an objective to develop courses for special teachers and counselors and also to provide facilities in various forms for the differently able persons, the UGC had been implementing two schemes viz. Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE) and Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN). These schemes are now looked by a separate cell in the UGC and grants are being released by the Cell. UGC approved two centers at Banaras Hindu University and Jammia Millia Islamia University under the Scheme of Teacher Preparation in special education (TEPSE).
- Estimated Gross Enrolment Ratio in Higher Education for Scheduled Castes is 23.0% and for Scheduled Tribes is 17.2%.
- Gender Parity Index (GPI) in Higher Education for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is 102 and 92 per 100 Males respectively.

8. Relevant and Value Based Education

- To promote holistic understanding of the areas outside India with its cultural, social, economic and strategic specificities and to provide critical input to the policy makers particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests, the UGC has been identifying universities from time to time for establishing Area Study Centers. As on 31.03.2019, 35 Centers are functioning and an Amount of Rs. 79.14 Lakh has been released to Centers under Area Studies Programme during 2018-19.
- To acquaint teachers and students with the thoughts and ideas of great social thinkers of India, there are 394 Study Centres established in various Universities/Colleges. A total grant of Rs. 2.98 crores were released during 2018-19.

9. Integration of Information and Communication Technologies for Teaching and Learning

- As part of e-Governance, e-Office has been implemented in the UGC to create paperless environment as regards receipt and movement of files, maintaining of pay slip, e-leave etc
- UGC assigned INFLIBNET for Development of complete integrated and automated e-governance module of UGC in a project mission mode providing end to end on line solution.
- Approx. 23500 modules in 70 subjects and 778 Papers are Developed in Four Quadrant approach
 of e-PG Pathshala Project. Approx. 51 Lakh Learners across the Globe have accessed e-PG
 pathshala.
- UGC offered 47 MOOCs Courses during Academic Session starting July 2018 which commenced from July,2018. 40311 Learners were enrolled in these UGC Non-Technology Post Graduate MOOCs Courses on SWAYAM Platform. The Examination of 8 UGC courses was conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) on 1st December, & 2nd December, 2018. 412 learners appeared for these examination.
- In 2017, NAD was launched as an Online Store house of academic awards (Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates, Marksheet etc.) lodged by the academic institutions/ Boards / eligibility assessment Bodies in a digital format. It is a 24X7 online mode of making available academic awards.
- As on 29.03.2019, Data pertaining to progress of NAD are as follows: 1008 are total academic institutions on Board, 505405 students registered, 31308926 awards lodged and there are 182 verifiers.
- A unique initiative of online professional development of in service teachers of Higher Education using MOOC Platform SWAYAM –Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) was launched by the MHRD on 13th November, 2018.

10. Skill Development Initiatives

- The UGC has launched the scheme of **Community Colleges** on Pilot basis during the year 2013-14. The main objective of the scheme is to offer low cost, high quality education locally which encompasses both traditional skill development as well as traditional course work, thereby providing opportunities to the learner to move directly to employment sector or to move to the Higher Education sector. 281 Community Colleges were approved under the scheme out of which 172 Institutions approved in 2018-19. An amount of Rs. 27.74 Crore released during 2018- 19. Total grant of Rs. 143.19 Crore has been released upto 31.03.2019.
- The UGC has launched a scheme on skill development based higher education as a part of College/ University education leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc) Degree with multiple entry and exit option such as Diploma/Advance Diploma under the NSQF. 446 Universities & Colleges have been approved under the Scheme out of which 330 Institutions approved in 2018-19 and Grants of Rs. 103.08 Crore was released during the year 2018-19. Total Grant of Rs. 240.14 Crore has been released up to 31.03.2019.
- Main objective of DDU KAUSHAL Kendra is to create skilled manpower for industry requirements at various levels. 92 Institutions (16 Self financed) are approved out of which 28 Institutions approved in

2018-19. Grant of Rs. 11.78 Crore released during 2018-19. Total Grant of Rs. 122.56 Crore released upto 31.03.2019.

11. Open Distance & Online Learning

- UGC had notified UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017. Subsequently 1st Amendment was notified on 11th October, 2017, Second Amendment was notified on 6th February, 2018 and Third Amendment was notified on 6th September, 2018.
- After processing the proposals received under UGC (ODL) second and third amendment Regulations 2018, 82 HEIs (75 HEIs for academic session beginning July, 2018 and onwards and 7 HEIs for academic session beginning January, 2019 and onwards) have been accorded recognition to offer 1328 programmes through ODL mode from the academic year 2018-19 onwards.
- 20 Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) under Category I as per UGC (Categorisation of Universities (Only) for grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018, entitled to offer programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Mode.
- UGC had notified Online (Courses or Programmes) Regulations, 2018 on 4th July, 2018 and applications were invited from eligible HEIs for offering courses and programmes through online mode. UGC had received application from 22 HEIs till 31st March 2019.

1.1 Role and Organization of the UGC

The University Grants Commission which came into existence on 28th December, 1953 became a statutory body of Government of India by an Act of Parliament in 1956. Section 12 of the UGC Act provides that the Commission shall in consultation with the universities concerned, take all such steps as it may think fit for the promotion and coordination of university education and for the determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research.

- As per the Section 18 of the UGC Act, the Commission shall prepare once every year an Annual Report
 giving a true and full account of its activities during the previous year, and copies thereof shall be
 forwarded to the Central Government and the Government shall cause the same to be laid before both
 Houses of Parliament.
- The UGC serves as a vital link between the Union and State Governments and the institutions of higher learning. In addition to its role of giving grants to universities and colleges, the University Grants Commission also advises Central and State Governments on the measures necessary for the improvement of university education. It also frames regulations such as those on the minimum standards of instruction and qualifications of teachers.
- In order to accomplish the multi-dimensional objectives of higher education and in discharge of its
 cardinal function of coordinating and maintaining standards of higher education, the UGC has over the
 years, evolved and implemented a wide variety of programmes for realization of the goals of higher
 education.

1.1(a) Organizational Structure: The Commission consists of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and ten other members appointed by the Central Government. The Chairman is selected from amongst persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Governments. Of the ten other members, two are selected from amongst the officers of Central Government to represent the Government. Not less than four, selected from amongst persons who, at the time they are selected, shall be teachers in the Universities. The remaining members are selected from amongst the following persons:

- 1. Who have knowledge of, or experience in agriculture, commerce, forestry or industry;
- 2. Who are members of the engineering, legal, medical or any other learned profession; or
- 3. Who are Vice Chancellors of Universities or who, not being teachers of Universities, are in the opinion of the Central Government, educationists of repute or have obtained high academic distinctions.






Graph 1.1(a): The Commission's Secretariat Sanctioned & Working Strength during 2018-19

1.2 Special Cells Functioning in the UGC

1.2(a) Right to Information Act (RIA) Cell

The University Grants Commission is an autonomous body under Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and provides information to the applicants under Right to Information Act,2005. A cell under CPIO i.e. Right to Information Act (RIA) received the applications/appeals and prepares the required

number of copies to be sent through CPIO to different CPIO(s)/Appellate Authoritie(s) who have the relevant information. There are 22 Appellate Authorities and 45 CPIOs in the office of UGC including the main office, branch offices and regional offices. The RTI applications/appeals from the applicants and notices/decisions from Central Information Commission etc. are centrally received in the name of Central public Information Officer (CPIO) at the main office and forwarded to the concerned Central Public Information Officers who have the requisite information. A copy of the RTI application/appeal/notice/decision is retained in the RIA cell for record. All the Bureau Heads in the UGC are designated as Appellate Authorities under RTI and the Deputy Secretaries/Under Secretaries/Education Officers in the Bureau under them are designated as Central Public Information Officers. The data of quarterly/annual record of number of RTI applications/appeals/fee etc. is prepared by RIA Cell and uploaded on the CIC portal and on UGC website. The RTI applications/appeals received at Regional Offices are being dealt with directly by the respective Central Public Information Officers/ Appellate Authorities. The record of the RTI fee collected from the applicants is also maintained by the RIA Cell. The list of Central Public Information Officers/Appellate Authorities is placed on the UGC website.

During the year 2018-19, UGC received RTI applications 17,199 and disposed off 11,110. Of the 2512 appeals received 1163 are disposed off. The RTI fee collected by the RIA cell was Rs.44,190/- and the additional fee as per RTI rules for providing the information was Rs. 47,424/-.

1.2(b) Pay Scale Section

The Pay Scale Section is entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating the work of Pay Review Committees set by the Central Govt. from time to time and also in the matters relating to Pay Scale and service conditions of teachers and other equivalent cadres viz. Librarians and Director of Physical Education in Universities and Colleges. It also interacts with the national level organizations of teachers and other equivalent cadres. During the reporting year 2018-19, the following important decisions have been taken and conveyed to the universities :-

UGC has received a number of queries from Universities, Colleges and Stakeholders on different matters, for which clarifications has been issued by the Pay Scale Section with respect to UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010 as amended from time to time which are as follows:

- UGC has framed (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations 2018 and notified in the Official Gazette of India on 18th July, 2018 followed by Public Notice issued vide F.No. 1-2/2017 (EC/PS) dated 16th October, 2018 to all universities and affiliated colleges for adoption of UGC Regulations, 2018.
- 2. Public Notice was issued vide F.No. 2-16/2002(PS)Pt.Fl.II dated 16th October, 2018 an extension of the date of participation in Orientation/Refresher Course in respect of Teachers/Assistant Registrar/Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian/Deputy Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College Director of Physical Education for the purpose of career advancement.
- 3. UGC letter regarding unique initiative of online professional development of in-service teachers of higher education, using MOOCs platform SWAYAM-Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) was launched by MHRD on 13th November, 2018 posted in the UGC website.
- 4. Public Notice was issued clarifying admissibility of non-compounded advance increments and benefit of number of years required for promotion under CAS for the candidates who have enrolled/registered/

- completed Ph.D. degree before 11th July, 2009 vide F.No. 28-9/2018(PS/Misc.) dated 7th December, 2018.
- 5. UGC has issued 1st and 2nd amendment of UGC Regulations on M.Phil/Ph.D. 2016, which were notified in Gazette of India 27th August, 2018 and 18th October, 2018 respectively and posted in the UGC website.
- 6. Revised guidelines for enhancement of the Rates of Honorarium of Guest Faculty in Universities and Colleges consequent upon the implementation of the recommendations of the 7th Pay Commission vide F.No. 25-1/2018(PS/Misc.) dated 28th January, 2019 and a circular to this effect posted in the UGC website.
- 7. Public Notice has been issued vide F.No. 27-9(Orissa)2010(L)/PS dated 4th July, 2018 regarding interdisciplinary of subjects (Brief Description).
- 8. The Chairman, UGC has constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. R.P. Tiwari to look into the anomalies of the provisions provided in the UGC Regulations, 2018. The Committee has submitted its final report alongwith proposed amendments in the Regulations, 2018. The report is to be approved by the Commission in its forthcoming meeting.
- 9. The Chairman, UGC has constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Balram to revisit the M.Phil/Ph.D Regulations, 2016 and the report is awaited.
- 10. Visiting Faculty Revision of honorarium for visiting faculty. Public Notice issued and available in UGC website.

1.2(c) Vigilance Cell

The University Grants Commission has set up a Vigilance Cell in accordance with the instructions of the Government of India to keep a close watch on official work so that it does not indulge in acts of corruption. The Secretary, UGC is also functioning as C.V.O of UGC. The CVO is mainly responsible for the prevention and detection of corruption cases in the UGC, Universities / Colleges and also for taking a legal action wherever necessary. The CVO is to further ensure the following:

As directed by the Central Vigilance Commission, the UGC observed the **Vigilance Awareness Week** from 29th October to 3rd November, 2018 by conducting a lecture, administering the pledge, displaying banners and posters and distributing pamphlets and organized essay writing competition etc. during the period.

The Vigilance Cell also advised all the universities to observe Vigilance Awareness Week as per the instructions issued by the CVC. The Vigilance Cell has received good response from the universities in this regard.

During 2018-19, the Vigilance Cell received 3 complaints from CVC, 12 from MHRD, 19 from CBI, 35 CVC referred complaints forwarded to MHRD and 125 from various Universities / Colleges and other agencies. The complaints received against Universities and Colleges have been forwarded to the concerned bureau of UGC for taking necessary action. Enquiry Committees were constituted in some cases by the Chairman, UGC to look into the complaints regarding misuse of UGC fund. The Cell advises the concerned administration Bureaus to take action according to the finding of the enquiry on the complaints. The factual reports on the complaints were also sent to CVC/MHRD.

Besides above 14 RTI applications were also received in vigilance cell and replies were sent in time.

1.2(d) Legal Cell

The Legal Cell deals with Court Cases in Supreme Court of India, various, High/Lower Courts, Tribunals / Forums / Commissions etc. across the country.

The Cell coordinates the Court Cases between Standing Counsels/Panel Advocates engaged in different courts, tribunals other Judicial bodies all over India and different Bureaux of UGC. It also provides Legal opinion on different matters to all the Bureau, of UGC.

Presently, most of the running cases are regarding pay scales, qualifications, age of superannuation, selection of teaching and non-teaching staff of the Universities and Colleges, admission in Professional NET Courses, Common Entrance Test and Establishment of different Institutions / Fake Institutions etc. Some cases are regarding Administrative matters of UGC staff also.

A panel of Advocates in different courts including Supreme Court of India has been prepared with the approval of Competent Authority.

Graph 1.2(d): Year wise (2012-13 to 2018-19) No. of cases received and Expenditure Incurred on Bills of Advocates




1.2(e) Desk Parliament

1.2(f) Anti-Mal Practice Cell (AMPC)

The basic objective of the AMPC is to examine the complaints regarding unrecognized Institutions received from Public/students/parents etc. and also to collect same from print/electronic print media, and to take action against such institutions. With the expansion of higher education system-several types of Mal Practices are being exercised which need to be addressed immediately to restore the credibility of higher education system in society as well as at international levels.

Presently, 23 fake universities/Institutions are enlisted in the list of fake universities maintained by UGC and also available on the UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in. In addition to above 23 universities/institutes following two more institutes are also not recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) and Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.

- 1. Inclusion of one fake university in the list: Adhyatmik vishwavidyalaya (Spiritual University), 351-352, Phase-I, Block-A, Vijay Vihar, Rithala, Rohini, Delhi 110085 was included in the list of fake universities maintained by the UGC on 05.04.2018.
- 2. "Maithili University/Vishwavidyalaya, Darbhanga, Bihar" was deleted from the list of fake universities on receipt of information from the State Government that this fake universities is not in existence any more.
- 3. Warning Notices were issued to the following unapproved institutions:
- i) National Institute of Event Management, All India Institute of Local-Self Government, C.D. Barfiwalla Lane, Juhu Galli, Andheri (W), Mumbai-400058
- Rural Naturopathy Organization, N-11, C-11, 17-5, Deep Nagar, HUDCO, Aurangabad-431003 on ii) 06.11.2018.
- iii) Indian Board of Health Education & Research (IBHER), Plot No. 20, Saiprabha banglow, 2nd Floor Padmadarshan Society, Near Treasure Park Pune-Satara Road, Pune-411009
- iv) Indian Institute of Alternative Medicines and Natural Healing, 123, Aram Nagar Part, Fisheries University Road, Andheri West Mumbai-400061 on 06.11.2018 to warn to stop immediately conducting degree courses in medical Science discipline

The public/students are made aware of the unrecognized status of institutes through UGC website and public notices in leading daily news papers in Hindi and English language to warn them not to seek admission in such fake universities.

1.2(g) Special Reservation Cell

UGC has set up a Special Reservation Cell for enforcement of orders of reservation in posts and services. The Cell is comprised of Joint Secretary, UGC as Liaison Officer, Deputy Secretary as Assistant Liaison Officers.

1.2(h) Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place Cell.

To look into the grievances of women employees at work place, the UGC has an Internal Committee on "Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place" which is headed by Joint Secretary UGC.

Various steps have been taken for wide publicity of the Committee. Notices have been put up at the main reception of UGC Head Quarter and Regional Offices. Constitution of the Committee along with telephone numbers have been uploaded on UGC website for the general awareness of public.

During the period under report one matter was brought to the notice of the UGC Internal Complaints Committee.

1.2(i) Anti-Ragging Cell

An Anti-Ragging Cell is functioning in UGC to coordinate the various anti-ragging measures. In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 8.5.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009), the University Grants Commission has framed "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009" firstly notified on 4th July, 2009 and further amended 08 Oct, 2012 and 29 March, 2014 & 29 June, 2016 which are in force. These regulations are mandatory for all Institutions of higher learning.

A nationwide toll free anti-ragging helpline 1800-180-5522 in 12 languages have been established which can be accessed by students in distress owing to ragging related incidents. The helpline has been established with call centre facilities in 12 languages, viz. English, Hindi and regional languages (Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Kannada, Punjabi, Marathi, Oriya, Assamese, Gujarati and Bengali), for helping victims of ragging besides facilitating effective action in respect of such incidents. The Helpline directly receives complaints from the complainant/victim of ragging. The same is forwarded by the help-line to the respective institutions and the local administration (SHO & SP) for taking necessary corrective action. On receipt of complaints about ragging, the UGC seeks the action taken report from the concerned institutions. In cases of delayed response, repeated reminders are made and when no action taken is reported, punitive action is being initiated.

The Commission has made it mandatory for all institutions to incorporate in their prospectus the directions of the Government regarding prohibition and consequences of ragging.

UGC received 1031 alleged ragging cases pertaining to UGC. Total 1009 cases were closed by UGC and 22 cases were pending during the period 2018-19. UGC has brought 1031 complaints to the notice of respective institutions and vigorously followed up with them through reminders to take urgent and immediate action in this regard.

In the 22 cases action taken report is awaited and in case no response is received, relevant punitive action shall be initiated as per the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging, 2009.

The 9th Inter Council Committee to consider the issue of Monitoring of Anti Ragging measures in institutions of higher educational institutions in India was held on 25.06.2018 under the Chairmanship of Prof. D. P. Singh, Chairman, UGC. The recommendation/decision of the committee are as under:

- Status Report/Action Taken on Media Campaign for anti ragging measures in the preceeding year by the respective Council. JS (ARC) presented the TVCs that have been made by NFDC. After viewing these spots the committee was of the opinion that these should be approved by the media committee soon & aired before the next session of admissions in July/August. It was agreed that softcopies of the posters will be given to various councils for their use in their own presentations & web sites. It was also agreed that an award ceremony should be organized by UGC soon to give prizes to students who made the posters & the short films for anti ragging campaign.
- Action taken has been received from the councils. UGC must request councils to present a progress report of Anti Ragging measures taken by the respective councils rather than just action taken on cases of complaints to give a holistic picture of work done by various councils in Anti Ragging. It was agreed that the Monitoring agency will share admin password with the nominated representatives of various councils so that they can view cases relating to their colleges & get to know how these cases were handled by the Contact Centre & the monitoring agency.
- Presentation of correlation analysis between the Agencies Survey and the All India Survey on Higher Educational (AISHE) 2016-17 for the gap in number of Institutions reported on their Portal. A gap analysis is to be done for top States also by the Monitoring Agency. In response to above dealt with correlation of two data sets, namely, the one that the Monitoring agency has created & the AISHE data set of MHRD, so that the agency can coordinate with the technical team of AISHE & come up with an updated data set that is verified & correct. UGC agreed to approach MHRD for the requested letter of Introduction.
- Report of Monitoring Agency on Psychological Perspective on the need to include School in the awareness initiatives. To extend the Ragging Prevention Program to schools the committee on the work that has already been done by MHRD in this regard. Monitoring Agency has produced a brief note & submit it to UGC so that UGC can organize a meeting with Secretary Higher Education & Secretary School Education on this issue. Also suggested that it will be very useful to request Secretary Women & Child Development too to attend the meeting because there are several initiatives of the Ministry of Women & Child Development in this regard & an integrated initiative of the two ministries will be extremely helpful to eradicate the menace of Ragging in schools.

The 10th Inter Council Committee to consider the issue of Monitoring of Anti Ragging measures in institutions of higher educational institutions in India was held on 15.11,2018 under the Chairmanship of Prof. Bhushan Patwardhan, VCM, UGC. The recommendation/decision of the committee are as under:

Committee was agreed in personnel dealing with complaints at UGC a fresh refresher course/training session for the Call Centre & UGC employees may be organized by Monitoring Agency to ensure the better performance. Some Councils requested to send the soft copy/hard copy of the posters for the prominent display. UGC requested MHRD to release the funds for Media Campaign, MHRD asked the original Utilization Certificate for the earlier sanction to process the same.

This discussion led to a wider issue Committee said that there is sufficient evidence to show that Ragging is on the decline even though one sees an increase in the number of complaints. The increase in the number of complaints is an indication of the confidence that students & their parents have on UGC's complaint redressal system. Councils said that the system of complaint management was now working smoothly & to satisfaction of majority of complainants. It was time to embark on phase 2 of the National Ragging Prevention program which would now focus on compliance of regulations to completely eradicate Ragging.

These two reports, namely, Mohan Rao Report & Vineet Joshi Report, were drafted independently. The first on the orders of the Hon. Supreme Court & the second on the orders of the Hon. Minister of HRD. Both reports recommend that immediate measures should be taken to control the menace of Ragging in schools. The committee was agreed, unanimously, that a special meeting of the Inter council committee to discuss the recommendations of the two reports to arrive at a national consensus on the modifications or amendments required to make the present Anti Ragging Regulations applicable to schools & to Vocational Training Institutions. It was decided in the next inter council meeting, which will be called specifically on the issue of Bullying in schools, all State Education departments, state boards of schools education, Central Boards of school education like CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya etc, Ministry of Women & child Development, Child Line India Foundation (1098), National Commission for Protection of child rights (NCPCR), Cyber Crime experts of the Police Department, Representative of the Skill Development Council must be invited as special guests.

UGC has given the extension to Prof. Raj Kachroo, Founder Trustee (Aman Satya Kachroo Trust) as a Monitoring Agency (NGO) for a period of one year till 31st June, 2019.

UGC has also issued the circular twice in a year to the Vice-Chancellors of all Universities and all Regulatory bodies dated 05.06.2018 and 27.12.2018 to step up anti-ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through various mediums and constitutions of anti-ragging committee and compliance of UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. And requested to display hoardings, distribute pamphlets etc. All the above circulars have been displayed on the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in

UGC has decided to house the Anti Ragging Call Centre in UGC premises. By having Call Centre in our building, we can monitor/oversee the working of the helpline on regular basis. This call Centre can be expanded for other issues such as student grievance redressal, Girl's student helpline, racial discrimination and caste based discrimination. This will save lakhs of rupees on recurring basis as we have to pay commission charges @49.50% of total monthly wagebill to helpline agency.

1.2(j) Internal Audit Cell

The Internal Audit Cell was set up in May, 1995 in the university Grants Commission on the recommendations of the Director General of Audit and Revenues, to oversee the UGC accounts for better maintenance and transparency. Since then , It has been functioning in the office headed by a Deputy Director, supported by Audit/Junior Audit Officer who are on deputation from Govt. of India. The Cell also conduct the audit of UGC Regional Offices and Inter–University Centers established by the UGC within the university system. Besides, the Internal Audit Cell advises UGC on various financial as well as administrative matters of the UGC. The cell is also entrusted with the work of pre-audit of pension payment cases, GPF/CPF final payment cases, pay

fixation, contract documents and other matters entrusted from time to time and also post audit of accounts, test checks of grant—in-aid registers and sanction, pursuance/settlement of objections taken in statutory audit and coordination with various concerned bodies in connection with replies to paras of audit report, the work of inspection of accounts and verification of utilization of funds released to Universities and other beneficiary institutions are also entrusted to the Cell.

1.2(k) Gender Sensitization Cell

To obtain the policy of zero tolerance, UGC has taken various measures for Ensuring the Safety of Women on Campuses and Programmes for Gender Sensitization. Following the Justice Verma Committee Bill in 2013, the Vishakha Guidelines and the Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act 2013, a special Task Force was constituted by the UGC to study and make recommendations on making the University campuses free from gender discrimination & harassment of any kind. UGC has notified UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015.

UGC has requested all the Universities / Colleges to constitute an internal complaint Committee (ICC) and a special cell in their respective Institutions to deal with the issue of gender based violence and to conduct gender sensitization programme.

Graph 1.4(ii): Grants Received (Revenue & Capital) (Rs. in Crore)




Graph 1.4(iv): Grants Released to Institutions (Capital & Revenue): 2018-19









Graph 1.4(vii): State wise Grants Released * to Colleges under Revenue & Capital Grants (2018-19)





1.5 Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) for Central and UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities

On the behest of the MHRD, the UGC set up a Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) recommend complete framework of uniform service conditions for the non-teaching staff (Group A, B & C) of Central Universities, the UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and the Delhi Colleges.

The Central Universities and UGC maintained Deemed Universities have been authorized to implement the ACP/MACP Scheme on its Non-Teaching Staff on its own on the basis of the guidelines prepared & forwarded by UGC.

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development O.M.No.19-62/2017.CU/cdn dated 2nd January, 2018 regarding implementation of 7th Central Pay Commission to the Quasi-Government Organizations, Autonomous Organization and Statutory Bodies set-up and funded/ controlled by Central Government have been communicated to all Central Universities, UGC maintained Deemed Universities and Delhi Colleges (54) and BHU Colleges vide UGC letter No. F.No.11-1/2017(CU) dated 18.01.2018.

The Ministry of Health & family welfare CGHS-II order No. F.No.60011/13/2017-CGHS-II dated 08.03.2017 with regard to change of nomenclature of nursing staff have been communicated to all Central Universities/ Deemed to be Universities vide UGC letter No.F.6-7/97 dated 29.11.2017. The decision to award Part – 'B' scales to the Nursing cadre of CUs/ DUs is under consideration.

On the basis of the MHRD notification No. 1-7/2015-U.II(2) dated 02.11.2017 scheme of revision of pay structure/scale for the posts of Registrar, Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrar, Controller of Examination, Deputy Controller of Examination, Assistant Controller of Examination, Finance Officer, Deputy Finance Officer, and Assistant Finance Officer UGC constituted an expert committee to draft Regulations for the above posts meetings of the committee was held in UGC 16.01.2018. The draft Regulations prepared by the Expert Committee has been approved by the Commission in its 538th meeting held on 29.01.2019 and has been forwarded to MHRD.

The Commission has also constituted a Standing Committee to examine the anomaly cases of Non-teaching Staff of Central Universities/Deemed to be Universities received in the JCRC Section The meetings were held periodically to resolve the anomaly cases non – teaching staff CUs/DUs received in UGC.

1.6 National Conference of Vice-Chancellors and Directors (26th to 28th July,2018)

UGC and MHRD had also organised a three day National Conference of Vice-Chancellors' and Directors' on Research and Innovation in Higher Education in which following ten resolutions were adopted by all the participants:

- (1) Reaffirm our commitment for achieving the UGC Quality Mandate in our respective Universities and the affiliated institutions by 2020 and NAAC accreditation for all institutions by 2022.
- (2) Adopt and implement Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) in HEIs by updating curriculum from academic year 2019-20; Adopt Learner Centric teaching learning processes by suitable improvement in the pedagogy.
- (3) Participate in the Induction Training of newly recruited teachers and annual Refresher Training of all the teachers using the SWAYAM and take measures for improving the motivation levels of teachers.
- (4) Enhance research productivity of our respective institutions by orienting teachers and students to participate in competition-based research funding schemes.

- Create an innovation culture and eco-system, including administrative and financial support, academic (5) freedom and flexibility for promoting innovation and encourage participation in the Smart India Hackathon; facilitate setting up start-ups by students.
- Sensitize the students and encourage them for their active participation in social / economic betterment (6) of the community by adopting at least five villages under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan .
- Give a big fillip to Vocationalisation of higher education by participating in the relevant schemes under (7) National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) duly modified for the requirements of higher education students, and also achieve constructive links with the industry.
- Encourage use of digital learning resources among students and teachers and approving SWAYAM (8) courses for credit transfer, and use the resources like e Shodh Sindhu, National Digital Library, and upload degrees on National Academic Depository
- (9)Create awareness about ethics in research and provisions for checking plagiarism and to weed out predatory journals.
- (10) Strive for a smart and Swachh campus, and also mentor the schools around our institution and the affiliated colleges to motivate the students/teachers therein for striving for academic excellence.

It was also resolved to achieve the same by 2020.

UGC has in the recent past set forth objectives for improving the quality in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). The objectives encompass all the integral areas of higher education like regular revision of curriculum with clearly specified learning outcomes and soft skills, enabling youth secure access to employment/selfemployment or engage in pursuit of higher education; developing social -industry connect; availability of motivated teachers and accreditation to ensure qualitative self improvement in HEIs. The UGC quality mandate as approved by the Commission and various other initiatives expected from all universities/colleges have been placed on UGC website and circulated across the nation.

To achieve the set targets of quality mandate, UGC has initiated drafting of Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework (LOCF). The curriculum is based on an approach to synchronise existing teaching learning activities to ascertain, the expectations from a graduate in terms of understanding and outcome at the end of the programme. Besides, this approach envisages students as active learners whereby teacher act as a facilitator and together they lay foundation of lifelong learning. LOCF in 15 undergradutae subjects is ready.

In order to achieve the purpose of improving quality in higher education, another important initiative of UGC is examination reforms. As the prevailing examination system focuses more on note learning and reproduction of superficial knowledge, an attempt has been made to reform existing examination system such that higher cognitive abilities of students are put to assessment.

UGC has also prepared, "A Guide to Student Induction Programme", proposing for a six day Induction programme to be organised by HEIs for students entering higher education. The purpose of this programme is to help students develop a familiarity with new environment and Institution through various activities such as Physical Activity, Mentoring, Creative Arts and Culture, Literary Activity, Extra-Curricular Activities.

A task force has been constituted for developing curriculum for Soft Skills for UG and PG programmes, for Mentoring of non-accredited institutions, so that every institution can get accreditation by 2022. All institutios with good NAAC score / NIRF ranking are being conveyed that UGC is considering them as MENTOR so that they may identify their mentee institutions.

• The Commission considered and approved National Rail and Transport Institute (NRTI), NAIR Campus, Lalbaug, Vadodara – 390004, Gujarat for Deemed to be University status under De novo category. Further, it was suggested that NRTI be advised to take appropriate steps for placement of the students.

532nd Meeting 24th May, 2018.

- The Commission ratified the decision taken by the Chairman, UGC for establishment of the Department of National Security Studies and up-gradation of existing Department of Defence Studies to the Department of National Security Studies in four Central Universities i.e. University of Allahabad, Central University of Gujarat, Manipur University and Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh and creation of teaching positions under Department of National Security Studies also ratified that Proposal of Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi may also be considered along with existing cases.
- The Commission considered and ratified the decisions of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges for grant of fresh/extension of autonomous status to colleges and resolved as under:
 - The case of St. Stephen's College, New Delhi was considered and it was decided that legal opinion on this issue be obtained to examine to resolve the conflict between the UGC Act, University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous Status upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 and the Section 9A of the Delhi University Act. Further action may be taken after receipt of legal opinion.
 - ii Colleges be asked to submit compliance on the discrepancies pointed out by the UGC Expert Committee.
 - iii Rest of the fresh cases (06) approved.
 - iv All the extension cases (18), except Dr. SNS Rajalakshmi College of Arts and Science, Coimbatore, approved.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission considered the recommendations of the UGC Fact Finding Committee constituted to look into the issues raised in the sting operation by News 24 Channel against Sunrise University (Private University), Alwar, Rajasthan as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved as under:
 - Show Cause Notice be issued to Sunrise University (Private University), Alwar, Rajasthan.
 - State Government of Rajasthan be requested for immediate action including criminal measures/ proceedings for having acted in a fradulant manner and giving of fake degrees.
 - Advice from legal expert be obtained on further course of action.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University), Gultekadi, Pune-411037 (Maharashtra) during 29-30th March, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved NOT to recommend to MHRD. Further, a Show Cause Notice be served to the Institution regarding withdrawal of the Deemed to be University status and seek reply within one month. Additionally, the Deemed to be University also be asked to submit point-wise reply in respect of the observations of the UGC Expert Committee along with the reply to the Show Cause Notice.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Punjab Engineering College (Deemed to be University), Sector 12, Chandigarh 160012 during 20-22nd March, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved NOT to recommend to MHRD. The Commission decided to advise the Institution to immediately apply for NBA accreditation. It was further observed that the Institution must have NBA accreditation for its half of the courses. On submission of the compliance of the NBA accreditation, the matter may be placed before the Commission.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Karpagam Academy of Higher Education (Deemed to be University), Pollachi Main Road, Eachanari Post, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) during 24-25th March, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and approved with the condition that the suggestions of the visiting Expert Committee, if any, will be addressed within a period of 6 months and the compliance report would be submitted alongwith documentary proof to UGC.
- The Commission considered the recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Commission to look into all aspects of the off-campuses of the Institutions Deemed to be Universities Recommendations about the off-campuses of Birla Institute of Technology (Deemed to be University), Mesra, Ranchi (Jharkhand) and resolved that Inspection of all Campuses be done by Expert Committee at the earliest. Further, Institution be advised to get approval for its (Patna and Deoghar) off-campuses and also obtain NAAC accreditation before accepting admissions.
- The Commission considered and accepted the report of the Committee constituted by the Commission to look into the issues related to creation of a Separate Society and transfer of assets by Institutions Deemed to be Universities and resolved that as these Institutions Deemed to be Universities were created prior to UGC Regulations 2010 they do not come under the purview of UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016. Therefore, all such cases which were declared Deemed to be Universities before UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2010, may be granted exemption from the provision of creation of separate society/trust.

- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Kalasalingam Academy of Research and Education (Deemed to be University), Anand nagar, Krishnankoil 626126, Virdhunagar District, Tamil Nadu during 28-29th April, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and approved with the condition that the suggestions of the visiting Expert Committee, if any, will be addressed within a period of 6 months and the compliance report would be submitted alongwith documentary proof to UGC.
- The Commission considered the Categorization of Institutions Deemed to be Universities under University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018 and approved grant of Graded Autonomy to (09) Institutions Deemed to be Universities. Further, it was decided that letter of Graded Autonomy to IARI, New Delhi be issued after the issue of separate society is resolved and in case of BITS, Pilani letter be issued after the matter relating to off-campuses is resolved.
- The Commission further considered the reply submitted by the Sumandeep Vidyapeeth and decided to approve the same for Graded Autonomy.
- The Commission also suggested to invite all the Universities, which have been awarded autonomy under Category I and II so far, to make a presentation about how they would propose to use the autonomy and their action plan for the next five years.
- The Commission considered and approved the courses and manpower for establishment/ strengthening of School of Education/Faculty of Education in Central Universities/Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the creation of teaching positions in central/deemed to be universities. Further, it was suggested that the process of rationalization for creation of new positions and starting of the new courses should be done by inviting proposals well in advance.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC Notification on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates.
- The Commission considered and resolved to authorize the Chairman, UGC to form a panel of Experts to review the functioning of Central Institute of Buddhist Studies (Deemed to be University), Choglamsar, Leh (Ladakh), Jammu & Kashmir and all such cases in future..
- The Commission considered and approved the Report of the UGC Committee on rationalization of cadre structure and designations, pay & allowances and rationalization of pay scales of non-teaching employees of Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar on conversion into a Central University.
- The Commission considered and approved the proposal of JNU for "Establishment of Pashto Chair".
- The Commission considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Sri Devaraj Urs Academy of Higher Education and Research (Deemed to be University), Tamaka, Kolar, Karnataka during 16-18th April, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and approved with the condition that the suggestions of the visiting Expert Committee, if any, will be addressed within a period of 6 months and the compliance report would be submitted alongwith documentary proof to UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Expert Committee to finalise the guidelines of the "Malviya Commonwealth Chair for Cross Border Teacher Education" at BHU.
- The Commission considered amendment in the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degree) Regulations 2016 and decided to partially amend these Regulations while

incorporating the following provisions to the clause 5.4.1 and 5.4.2 of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degree) Regulations 2016 for the purpose of admission into M.Phil/Ph.D. Programme:

- A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 50% to 45% be allowed in the entrance examination only for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/Differently abled Category(5.4.1)
- There shall be a weightage of 70% to the written test, and 30% to the performance in the interview/ viva-voce. (5.4.2)
- These provisions will be applicable prospectively from the date of notification in the official Gazette.
- The Commission considered and approved with some modifications UGC (Online Courses) Regulations, 2018.
- The Commission considered the recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Commission to look into all aspects of the off-campuses of the Institutions Deemed to be Universities Recommendations about the off-campuses/courses started by Institutions Deemed to be Universities and decided that off-campuses which are not visited by Expert Committees must be visited at the earliest by the Expert Committees constituted by the Chairman, UGC. The reports of the Expert Committees be considered by the Commission and forwarded to MHRD for approval. The Commission also resolved that Institutions running approved course by respective statutory bodies should be allowed to continue.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes ETC)

- The Commission considered and approved establishment of an Inter-University Centre for Yogic Sciences. It was also resolved that the Inter-University Centre for Yogic Sciences may be located in Bengaluru on the 10 acres of land to be donated by Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana, Bengaluru.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC List of Journals. Further, it was resolved that a Grievance Redressal mechanism be developed. It was suggested that Representatives from Councils, Academies and other institutions, such as ICSSR, ICHR, ICPR, ICMR, NCERT, IGNCAA, IIPA, etc., be invited during Standing Committee meetings as special invitees as and when required to resolve the issues judiciously.
- The Commission deliberated over the various Quality Improvement Programmes initiated by UGC for Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs). After due discussions, the Commission approved the draft guidelines for preparing 'Learning Outcomes based Curriculum for Under Graduate Education.' These draft guidelines can act as template for HEIs to initiate revision in curriculum defining minimum levels of learning outcomes for various undergraduate and post-graduate programmes.

The Commission also approved the UGC Mandate for improving quality of Education in Higher Educational Institutions containing (5) objectives to be achieved by every HEI by 2022 and a set of (10) initiatives for achieving them:

- 1. Improve the graduate outcomes for the students, so that at least 50% of them secure access to employment/self-employment or engage themselves in pursuit of higher education.
- 2. Promote link of the students with the society/industry such that at least 2/3rd of the students engage in socially productive activities during their period of study in the institutions.

- 3. Train the students in essential professional skills such as team work, communication skills, leadership skills, time management skills etc; and Inculcate the spirit of innovation/entrepreneurship and critical thinking among the students and promote avenues for display of these talents.
- 4. Ensure that teacher vacancies at any point of time does not exceed 10% of the sanctioned strength; and 100% of the teachers are oriented about the latest and emerging trends in their respective domains of knowledge, and the pedagogies that translate their knowledge to the students.
- 5. Every institution shall get NAAC accreditation with a minimum score of 2.5 by 2022.

The following initiatives shall be undertaken by every HEI in pursuit of the above objectives:

- 1. Induction programme for students
- 2. Learning outcome-based curriculum framework revision of curriculum in regular intervals
- 3. Use ICT based learning tools for effective teaching-learning process
- 4. Soft skills for students
- 5. Social and industry connect for every institution: Each University shall adopt at least 5 villages and each College shall adopt at least 1 village, for exchange of knowledge and for the overall social/economic betterment of the village communities.
- 6. Examination reforms test the concept, and application; student participation in Exit examinations
- 7. Tracking of the career progression of students after completion of course
- 8. Induction training for all new teachers, and annual refresher training for all teachers and mandatory leadership/management training for all educational administrators
- 9. Promoting quality research by faculty and creation of new knowledge.
- 10. Mentoring of non-accredited institutions, so that every institution can get accreditation by 2022.

All the Universities may be asked to prepare Action Plans for implementation of the above initiatives and achievements of the stated objectives and submit the same to UGC before July 2018.

- The Commission considered and approved the proposal of NISG for providing a Detailed Project Report (DPR) for e-Governance Project of UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Search Committee for the post of Director, National Assessment and Accreditation, Bengaluru.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Search Committee for the post of Director, INFLIBNET, Gandhinagar, Gujarat. It was resolved to re-advertise the post at the earliest. Further, it was resolved that the term of present Director be extended for six months or till the joining of the new Director, whichever is earlier.

(Grants to Universities and Colleges)

- The Commission considered and approved the Extension of time for Utilization of XII plan General Development Assistance scheme beyond 30.09.2017.
- The Commission considered the continuation of grant-in-aid under the UGC NSQF schemes *viz* Community Colleges, B.Voc degree programme and DDU KAUSHAL and approved the revised guidelines for vocational schemes by integrating all the existing schemes and following common standards. It was also decided to set a target of skilling 1.5 lakh students during the academic year 2018-19 in non-technical HEIs.

533rd Meeting 9th July, 2018. (Matters Relating to Standards)

• The Commission Considered and approved to delegate the power and authorize the Chairman to send advice of the Commission to the Ministry of HRD in respect of the off-campus proposals of the

Institutions Deemed to be Universities–Reference–Ministry of HRD letter No.F. 15-1/2018-U3(A) dated 05.06.2018.

- The Commission Considered the recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted by UGC to assess the proposal for manpower requirement in newly established Centenary Super Speciality Complex, Sir Sunderlal Hospital, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi and approved with a suggestion that positions be filled up in a phased manner, keeping in view the readiness of the logistics and infrastructure so that positions filled up are optimally utilized.
- The Commission Considered and approved draft UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2018. It was also resolved that the draft Regulations be put up on the UGC website for the comments of the stakeholders giving them 15 days' time and UGC Chairman was authorized to incorporate the important suggestions received from the stakeholders in the Regulations and thereafter send it to MHRD for concurrence.
- The Commission Considered and approved the recommendation of the Standing Committee on the legal opinion regarding the grant of Fresh Autonomous Status to Tagore Shiksha Mahavidylaya, Indore.
- The Commission considered the report and recommendations of the Empowered Expert Committee (EEC) for grant of status of Institutions of Eminence (IoE) for three Private Institutions and recommended the same to the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) for its approval. The recommended Institutions are as follows:
- 1. Birla Institute of Technology and Science, Pilani (Brown Field Institution)
- 2. Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Brown Field Institution)
- 3. Jio Institute (Reliance foundation Institution of Education and Research) (Green Field Institution)

Further, keeping in view the principle of equal weightage for both Private and Public Institutions, out of the Eight Public Institutions recommended by the EEC, the Commission recommended following three institutions with highest rank in the QS World University Rankings (2018) for grant of IoE status:

- 1. Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (QS Ranking 172)
- 2. Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (QS Ranking 179)
- 3. Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru (QS Ranking 190)

However, the Commission reiterated that the remaining five Public Institutions recommended by the EEC for granting IoE status shall be considered by the Commission at a later stage.

The Commission noted the observations of EEC about eight sectoral institutions which hold greater potential to reach national and international prominence in their respective fields and the recommendation that the Government may initiate a separate programme to invest in them. The Commission resolved that MHRD may consider having specific strategy for these sectoral institutions.

The Commission appreciated the invaluable suggestions given by the EEC for empowering Higher Educational Institutions in the country and resolved that MHRD may take in to account these suggestions and may spell out appropriate strategies for the same.

The Commission placed on record its deep appreciation for the EEC for undertaking the task of evaluating the proposals of Institutions of Eminence and submitting its report and recommendations.

The Commission resolved further that the EEC may be requested to continue its process of identification of suitable institutions for declaration as IoEs, till all the 20 institutions are identified.

534th Meeting 2nd August, 2018 (Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission Considered and approved amendment in Clause 4.3 and 5.2 of the University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018 Reference Ministry of HRD letter No. F. 15- 1/2018-U3(A) dated 05.06.2018.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Nehru Gram Bharati (NGB) [Deemed to be University], Kotwa-Jamunipur, Dubwali, Dt. Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh during 04-05th May, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved NOT to recommend the case of Nehru Gram Bharati to MHRD for continuation of Deemed to be University status. Nehru Gram Bharati may be asked to get affiliated with a University within one year i.e. till next academic session. However, the presently admitted students will continue to get their degree from Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University). From next academic session, the students should be admitted only after the Nehru Gram Bharati gets affiliation.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal for Deemed to University status under de-novo category to Indian Institute of Mass Communication (IIMC), New Delhi alongwith its five regional Campuses at Jammu (J&K), Amravati (Maharashtra), Aizawl Mizoram), Kottayam (Kerala) and Dhenkanal (Odisha) under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 and resolved to recommend to MHRD for the status under de-novo category to Indian Institute of Mass Communication, New Delhi.
- The Commission considered the request of the B.H.U. to extend the Pay Scale of PB-3 Rs.15600-39100 + GP 6600 (under 6th CPC) as notified by M/Finance under schedule Part-B 'XIX' to the cadre & Nursing Superintendent in B.H.U. regarding. The Commission considered the agenda as well as the observations of Additional Secretary, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance and resolved to send a detailed proposal to Ministry of HRD for onward submission to the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance for approval.
- The Commission considered the response received from Meenakshi Academy of Higher Education and Research (MAHER) [Deemed to be University], Vembuliamman Koil Street, West K.K. Nagar, Chennai-600078 (Tamil Nadu) in respect of the show cause notice issued by UGC. and resolved to revisit Meenakshi Academy of Higher Education and Research (MAHER) to validate the reply to show cause notice by another Expert Committee. However, some of the members from the earlier Committee may also be included in this Committee. The Committee should also look into fee/capitation fee and availability of faculty with medical background.
- The Commission considered the response received from Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (Deemed to be University), Gandhi Vidya Mandir, Sardarshahr, Dt. Churu, Rajasthan 331403 in respect of the show cause notice issued by UGC. and resolved that UGC Expert Committee Report, Reply to Show Cause Notice, Affidavit, Academic Outcomes etc. be reviewed holistically by a Committee constituted by the Chairman, UGC. Further action be taken on the basis of the recommendations of the Committee.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited National Institute of Food Technology, Entrepreneurship & Management (NIFTEM) (Deemed to be University), Kundli, Sonepat (Haryana) during 12-13th July, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to recommend to MHRD

- for Deemed to be University status to National Institute of Food Technology, Entrepreneurship & Management (NIFTEM) (Deemed to be University), Kundli, Sonepat (Haryana) for 2 years till 2020. The Institution Deemed to be University may be asked to get NAAC accreditation within two years and submit compliance to UGC during this period.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited All India Institute of Speech and Hearing, Manasagangothri, Mysuru, Karnataka during 04- 05th May, 2018 to assess the proposal for Deemed to University status under de-novo category under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 and resolved to recommend to MHRD for giving Letter of Intent (LoI) to All India Institute of Speech and Hearing, Manasagangothri, Mysuru, Karnataka under de- novo category. The Institution may be asked to fulfill requirements mentioned in the Report of UGC Expert Committee.
- considered and approved the categorization of Swami Vivekananda Yoga The Commission Anusandhana Samsthana (Deemed to be University), Bangalore (Karnataka) under Category – I of the University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018.
- The Commission considered and approved to continue Travel Grant Scheme for college teachers/college Librarians/Vice Chancellors/Commission Members and UGC Officers. Further, it was resolved that under the scheme: (i) The Vice-Chancellors be allowed to travel in the 'Class' as per their entitlement; (ii) The UGC Commission Members be allowed to travel by Business Class/Executive Class.
- The Commission considered the response received from Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation (Deemed to be University), NH-47, Sankari Main Road, Ariyanoor, Salem, Tamil Nadu - 636308 in respect of the show cause notice issued by UGC and resolved that UGC Expert Committee Report, Reply to Show Cause Notice, Affidavit, Academic Outcomes etc. be reviewed holistically by a Committee constituted by the Chairman, UGC. Further action be taken on the basis of the recommendations of the Committee.
- The Commission considered the appeal against rejection of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) programme/withdrawal of recognition and approved the following:
- The HEIs shall be given 30 days' time to make representations in case of programmes where rejections 1. along with grounds for rejections have been communicated.
- 2. There shall be an Expert Committee, to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC, for examining the representations received. The Committee, if needed, may call the HEIs for hearing.
- 3. There shall be a Standing Appellate Committee to be nominated by Chairman, UGC. The composition and terms of references of the Standing Appellate Committee and the appeals disposal process shall be decided by the Chairman, UGC.
- The fee for appeal shall be Rupees ten thousand per programme. 4.
- 5. The Chairman, UGC is authorised to take decisions based on the recommendations of the Committee as mentioned at Sl.No.2 and 3 above. The decisions so taken shall be communicated to the HEIs and shall be reported to the Commission in its forthcoming meeting.
- The Commission considered and approved the Recommendations of the Interface Committees for A. recognition of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) alongwith learning support centres/study centres, period of recognition, programmes to be offered through ODL mode from the year 2018-19 onwards and it was decided to communicate recognition or otherwise, with the following decisions:-

- 1. MBA/MCA/B.Ed/M.Ed/B.Ed (Special Education)/M.Ed (Special Education)/Hotel Management Programmes in ODL mode shall not be accorded recognition without prior approval of the respective Regulatory Authority; valid for the year 2018-19 & onwards.
- 2. HEIs without NAAC, who have not applied for NAAC within 3 months as per 2nd amendment of ODL Regulations 2017, shall not be accorded recognition.
- 3. Programmes of Private Universities not running same/similar programmes in regular mode for last 5 years shall not be accorded recognition.
- *In case of Tamil University, UGC shall get confirmation on the recommendations (programmes in regular* 4. mode and availability of complete SLM for each programme duly approved by its statutory authorities) of the Interface Committee and take appropriate decision with the approval of the Chairman.
- 5. In case of programmes with invalid nomenclature as per UGC specification of degrees, UGC may convey the approval with correct nomenclature.
- 6. In view of the above decisions, changes in the recommendations of the Interface Committees shall be carried out with the approval of the Chairman, UGC and shall be reported to the Commission in the forthcoming meeting.
- 7. HEIs shall be given 30 days' time period to submit representations along with documentary evidence in respect of reason(s) indicated in the Commission's decision communicating programme-wise deficiencies and shall be processed as per the relevant provisions of the UGC(ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments.
- 8. The Commission decided that only for the current academic year 2018- 19, the HEIs shall complete admission process by 1st October, 2018 and no admission shall be made after this.
- The Commission noted the quality provisions in the UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments В. so as to ensure quality of open and distance learning education in the country. The Commission observed that the 2nd amendment(ODL) regulations in relations to principal (ODL) regulations have created an anomalous situation where the universities without even having NAAC accreditation and also some universities having low NAAC score have become eligible, whereas universities having NAAC score even upto 3.24 are not eligible. The Commission also took note of the similar concern raised in writing by Prof. (Mrs.) Sushma Yadav, Commission Member, & Prof. I.M. Kapahy, Former Commission Member, while doing first stage screening of the ODL proposals received, on 22nd& 23rd May, 2018. In addition, the commission also observed that, as per the NAAC data available, at present only 61 universities have CGPA 3.26 and above, out of 865 UGC recognised universities. This defeats the very purpose of enhancing accessibility, thereby enhancing gross enrolment ratio. However, expansion shall have both the components i.e. qualitative and quantitative. The Commission deliberated above in length along with the quality assurance provisions of the UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments, the impact of NAAC accreditation and decided the following:
- 1. The imposition of NAAC as an eligibility condition, right in the beginning shall not be there and shall be enforced in a time bound manner. HEIs shall be assessed based on the all other provisions stipulated by the UGC(ODL) Regulation, 2017 and its amendments.
- 2. Accordingly UGC (ODL) Second Amendment Regulations, 2018 shall be amended and in regulation 3, in sub-regulation 1, for clause (viii), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:- "(viii) The Higher Educational Institution has completed five years of existence. Provided that the HEI shall submit

an undertaking to the effect that it will attain a NAAC score of 3.26 on a 4-point scale by the end of academic session 2019-20, failing which, the Commission shall not accord any approval to the Open & Distance Learning Programmes of the HEI. Provided further, that this clause shall not be applicable to Open Universities till the time they become eligible for NAAC accreditation and it shall be mandatory for Open Universities to get NAAC within one year of their becoming eligible for the same. Provided further, that an institution Deemed to be a University so declared by the Central Government shall offer the Open and Distance Learning courses or programmes as per the extent Deemed to be a University Regulations and other relevant Regulations notified by the University Grants Commission from time to time. Provided further, that the Higher Educational Institutions which are Deemed to be a Universities shall be permitted to impart Open and Distance Learning Education subject to University Grants Commission specifically allowing the Deemed to be a University to conduct Open and Distance Learning Courses for specific programmes and after off-campus centres, study centres are individually inspected and found adequate by the University Grants Commission and the approval will be course or programme specific."

- 3. The Commission also decided to amend relevant provision in point 6 of Annexure X of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017; provisions related to Restricting total capacity of ODL programme to that of capacity in similar conventional programme and also total capacity in main campus; as per the following:
 - (i) There shall not be any restrictions on the intake in ODL programme at the learner support centre/ study centre and in Main Campus.
 - (ii) The ratio of qualified counsellor to number of students shall be 1:100
 - (iii) Rest of the contents of point 6 will remain as it is.
 - (iv) Accordingly, point 6 shall be modified.
- 4. The Commission, in view of the decision as at S.No. 2 above and to maintain parity in the Distance Education, decided that similar amendment shall be carried out in UGC (Online Courses or Programmes) Regulations, 2018 and accordingly in regulation 4, in sub-regulation (1), for clause (ii) and (iii), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:-
 - "(ii) The Higher Educational Institution shall submit an undertaking to the affect that it will attain a NAAC score of 3.26 on a 4-point scale and should be in the Top-100 in overall category in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) for at least one year during the previous 3 years, till the end of academic session 2019-20, failing which, the Commission shall not accord any approval to the Online Programmes of the HEI." Provided further, that this clause shall not be applicable to Open Universities till NAAC or similar accreditation system and NIRF are made available for such Open Universities.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University), Airport Road, Pratap Nagar, Udaipur, Rajasthan 313001 during 18-19th June, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to recommend to MHRD for continuation of status of Deemed to be University to Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth, Udaipur, Rajasthan.
- The Commission considered and approved the request of Dr. Hari Singh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar for grant of the minimum of the scale of pay plus DA as per 7th CPC to the daily wage employees of the Vishwavidyalaya.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes etc.)

- The Commission considered the guide to Induction Programme for non- technical higher education and approved with following modifications: (i) Issues and requirements of SC/ST/OBC students should be assessed and addressed. (ii) Requirements of newly admitted students with regards to linguistics and quantitative course(s) should be assessed, and bridge/preparatory courses may be offered for weak students in such subjects.
- The Commission considered and approved the updated Guidelines of State Eligibility Test (SET).
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Search Committee regarding the appointment of Director, IUAC, New Delhi. Prof. Avinash Chandra Pandey may be appointed as Director, Inter University Accelerator Centre, New Delhi.

(Grants to Universities and Colleges)

- The Commission considered and approved extension of utilization of Block Grants to state Universities upto 31.03.2019 against the XII Plan allocation.
- The Commission considered and approved granting of ex-post-facto approval in extension of fellowship in respect of the Kashmiri Migrant Teacher Dr. Nirojini Bhan Bhat from the period 01.04.2006 to 31.03.2018 working as visiting faculty in University of Jammu (Jammu).

535th Meeting 27th September, 2018

- The Commission ratified the action taken on approval of institutions under sections 2(f), 12 (B) and compliance under Section 13 of the UGC Act, 1956 and decided that:
- The Universities be advised to submit the compliance at the earliest instead of expert committee visits to i. the Universities after two years.
- ii. Higher Educational Institutions be advised to put all the relevant information about their institution on their website with supporting documents, photographs, videos and geotagging.
- Physical visits to the Universities for this purpose be minimized. iii.
- The Commission considered and ratified the decisions of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges for grant of fresh/extension of autonomous status to colleges and decided to grant extension of autonomous status to all the 19 colleges.
- The Commission considered and ratified the review status of Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies (Deemed to be University), V.L. Mehta Road, Vile Parle (West), Mumbai (Maharashtra) as required in the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission considered Ph.D. degree directly after B.Tech. (without possessing Master Degree) for the Appointment as Assistant Professor in Indian Universities as per UGC Regulations and it was decided that a clarification may be issued. Also this may be reported in the Anomaly Redressal Committee.
- The Commission considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Maharishi Markandeshwar (Deemed to be University), Mullana, Ambala (Haryana) during 08-10th August, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.

- The Commission considered and approved the Categorization of SRM Institute of Science & Technology (Deemed to be University), SRM Nagar, Kattankulathur – 603203, Kancheepuram Dist., Tamil Nadu under Category - I of the University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018.
- The Commission considered and approved extending the date of participation in Orientation/Refresher Course in respect of Teachers/Assistant Registrar/Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian/ Deputy Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education/College Director of Physical Education upto 31.12.2018 for the purpose of career advancement.
- The Commission considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Institute of Armament Technology (Deemed to be University), Girinagar, Pune – 411025 (Maharashtra) during 23-24th August, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.
- The Commission considered and approved the issue for creation of non-teaching positions in central / UGC funded Deemed to be universities on the basis of the recommendations of the Committee.
- The Commission considered and approved for establishment of Special Cells for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in newly centrally funded universities.
- The Commission considered the requests received from the Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to extend the cut-off date of 1st October, 2018 for completing the admission process in the current academic year 2018-19 and decided to extend the cut-off date for admission in the recognized programmes to be offered by the HEIs under ODL mode for the year 2018-19 and onwards to October 20, 2018. The HEIs shall complete the admission process by 20th October, 2018 and no admission shall be made after this.
- The Commission considered the reply to show cause notice submitted by the Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University) and resolved NOT to recommend the case to MHRD for continuation of Deemed to be University status. Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth may be asked to get affiliated with a University within one year i.e. till next academic session. However, the presently admitted students will continue to get their degree from Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University). From next academic session, the students should be admitted only after the Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth gets affiliation from a University.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the UGC Standing Committee constituted to consider the proposals received from Institutions Deemed to be Universities for starting new course/ programme/ department/ school/ centre.
- The Commission considered and accepted the recommendations of the Committee to reject the proposal under de-novo category of the proposal submitted by Society for the Study, Survey and Conservation of Nature, Parnkuti, Anantpur, University Road, Rewa, Madhya Pradesh for Deemed to University status in the name of Keshav Vishwavidyapeeth under de-novo category (yet to be established) under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission considered the recommendations of the Expert Committee whose recommendations are based on the reports of the Visiting Expert Committees, those visited Deemed to be Universities / Private Universities for offering Programmes / Courses through ODL Mode from the academic sission 2018-19 and onwards and decided the following. In addition, for the recognized programmes like MBA, MCA, Travel and Tourism, an undertaking in the prescribed format as per the letter from the AICTE shall be taken before the issuance of the Commission decision.

- 1. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Expert Committee i.e. approval of two programmes as mentioned in the recommendations sheet to be offered by HEI at Head Quarters and approved off-campuses at Delhi, Mumbai, Guruvayur, Allahabad, Lucknow, Jaipur, Jammu, Garli (HP), Bhopal, Puri and Sringeri. The NAAC condition was exempted on the basis of NAAC letter No. NAAC/F No. 22-5/GH/DO/2016 dated 22nd August, 2016 wherein it was mentioned that "UGC and NAAC may set up a separate set of norms for grants and accreditation purposes for Sanskrit Universities/Institutions".
- 2. Jain University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Expert Committee i.e. approval of twelve programmes alongwith other details as mentioned in the recommendations sheet.
- 3. SRM Institute of Science & Technology: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Expert Committee, recommending five programmes with overall recommendations that 'not eligible due to non-compliance to the NAAC requirement'. The Commission also noted clarifications through e-mail from NAAC stating that the SRM Institute of Science and Technology was having NAAC at the time of submission of ODL application to the UGC and also at present having NAAC CGPA of 3.55 valid till 15.8.2023.

In view of the above, the Commission decided that the recommendations of the Expert Committee on programme-wise recognition shall be communicated.

- 4. Jagadguru Shri Shivarathreeswara University

For all the four HEIs mentioned at Sl. No. (4), (5), (6), and (7) above, the Commission considered the recommendations of the Expert Committee and observed that recommendations of the Committee vis-a-vis the recommendations of the Visiting Expert Committee and the facts mentioned in the report need re-confirmation and accordingly decided that the HEI shall be called for interface meeting with the same Expert Committee which considered the report of Visiting Expert Committee. The decision, based on the recommendations of the Expert Committee and with the approval of the Chairman, UGC, shall be communicated. The decision so taken shall be reported in the forthcoming meeting of the Commission.

- 8. Sikkim Manipal University
- 9. Jamia Hamdard
- 10. MATS University

For all the three HEIs mentioned at Sl. No. (8), (9) and (10) above, the Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Expert Committee i.e. not to recognize any programme based on the reasons mentioned in the respective recommendation sheet.

For the programmes found deficient in case of HEIs mentioned at Sl.No. (1) to (10), as applicable, the HEIs will get 30 days' time to submit representations as per provision contained in the UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its Amendments and Commission's decision in its 534th meeting held on 2nd August, 2018.

- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committees for recognition of programmes to be offered by the HEIs under ODL mode from the year 2018-19 and onwards. The decision of the Commission on special cases, as referred in the Agenda, are given below:-
- M.G. Chitrakoot Vishwavidyalaya: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of a. the Interface Expert Committee; i.e. the recognition of the programmes to be communicated first and the University should be visited for verifying the existence of labs and other facilities within 2018-19.
- Madras University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations, related to b. nomenclature of two programmes, of the Interface Expert Committee.
- U.P. Rajarshi Tandon Open University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee.
- d. Swami Vivekanand Subharti University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee related to six M.A. programmes.
- Pt. Sundarlal Sharma Open University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee. It was observed that the Expert Committee has recommended Master of Science/M.A. (Mathematics). The M.Sc. (Mathematics) and M.A. (Mathematics) are two independent programmes and faculty requirement as per the Regulations is six (three per programme) faculty members. In the assessment sheet, against M.Sc. (Mathematics), three faculty members have been indicated and accordingly this programme is approved.
- Lalit Narayan Mithila University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface f. Expert Committee and approved the programmes of M.Sc. (Botany), M.Sc. (Zoology), M.Sc. (Physics), *M.Sc.*(Chemistry) and M.Sc.(Mathematics).
- University of Kalyani: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert g. Committee and approved M.A. (Education) and M.A. (Geography) programmes.
- Guru Jambeshwar University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface h. Expert Committee and observed that out of six programmes, four programmes have been rejected on the basis of inadequate faculty and two programmes on the basis of inadequate faculty and SLM.

The Commission noted that the Registrar of the University has sent an email informing the selection/ appointment of the faculty program-wise (a copy of each of the appointment letter has also been submitted). In view of this, the programmes which were found deficient only on account of inadequate faculty should be recognized and other programmes will remain not-recognised. The MCA (five year integrated) programme should also comply to integrated programme related provisions mentioned in the UGC Notification of Specification of Degrees, 2014.

Indira Gandhi National Open University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee. The Commission observed that Indian Nursing Council has accorded permission to IGNOU for offering Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme for in-services Nurses. As per INC, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing is a programme for Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery qualified Nurses for upgrading Diploma to a Graduate Level.

The Commission noted that UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 prohibits Degree Nursing programme at UG and PG levels. In view of this, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme shall not be recognized.

The Commission also observed that IGNOU is a Central University established by an Act of Parliament for imparting education under ODL mode and till 2012-13, erstwhile Distance Education Council under IGNOU was the Regulator of the Distance Education. IGNOU has been contributing in various areas of National Importance and relevance by providing quality distance education with an outreach across the Country. Considering all these factors, the Commission suggested that MHRD may be requested to issue a direction thereby keeping IGNOU outside the ambit of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017.

Rest of the recommendations of the expert committee were approved.

- j. SNDT Women's University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee and noted that seven programmes indicated as 'Withdrawn' in the absence of two full time dedicated faculties per programme. The Commission also noted the Office Order dated 24th September, 2018 of SNDT Women's University thereby informing the faculty appointment, one faculty per programme for the 15 (fifteen) programmes. After detailed deliberations, the Commission decided that the programmes shown as 'withdrawn' programme shall be treated as 'withdrawn' only.
- k. Maulana Azad National Urdu University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee.
- l. Kashmir University & Mumbai University: The Commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee and directed that necessary action as per the relevant provision of the Second Amendment shall be taken. The HEIs without NAAC, who have not applied for NAAC within three months as per the Second Amendment ODL Regulations, 2018; extended later on till 7th August, 2018 in view of the closure of the NAAC window for 67 days in the window of three months, shall not be considered eligible.
- m. C.V. Raman University: The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee; i.e. the recognition of the programmes to be communicated first and the University should be visited for physical verification of infrastructure and facilities at the earliest.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes ETC)

- The Commission considered and approved accreditation to Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune for conducting SET on behalf of the States of Maharashtra & Goa.
- The Commission considered and approved for extension of time upto 31.03.2019 for utilisation of funds released under OBC expansion scheme to University of Delhi and its affiliated Colleges to complete the ongoing building projects.

(Grants to Universities and Colleges)

• The Commission considered and approved to restore the Plan grant to Gurukul Kangri Vishwavidyalaya (GKV), Haridwar which was stopped due to Tandon Committee report.

536th Meeting 14th November, 2018.

- The Commission ratified the inclusion of Colleges (as approved by the Chairman, UGC) under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956 and it was resolved that under the scheme:
- 1. The time of processing of the application for the inclusion of the colleges under Section 2(f) and 12B of the Act, 1956 be reduced by adopting the online process.
- 2. Higher Education Institutions(HEIs) shall put all the details on their websites before applying for 12B status.
- 3. The Commission resolved that the UGC Regulation for the inclusion of colleges under section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act, 1956 be revised.

- The Commission ratified the review status of Shanmugha Arts, Science, Technology & Research Academy (SASTRA), Deemed to be University, Titumalai Samudram, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu as required in the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016
- The Commission considered and ratified the decisions of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges for grant of fresh/extension of autonomous status to colleges. The Commission decided that comments on the report of Expert Committee be invited from the following colleges for the: (a) Grant of Autonomous Status to (i) Sri Shakthi Institute of Engineering and Technology, Coimbatore, Tamilnadu affiliated to Anna University, Chennai and (ii) PES College of Science, Arts & Commerce, Mandya, Karnataka affiliated to University of Mysore, Mysore, and (b) Extension of Autonomous Status of Institute of Advanced Study in Education, Saidapet, Chennai, Tamilnadu affiliated to Tamilnadu Teachers' Education University, Karapakkam, Chennai.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA) (Deemed to be University), 17-B, Sri Aurobindo Marg, New Delhi to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.
- The Commission Considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Vignan's Foundation for Science, Technology and Research (Deemed to be University), Vadlamudi, Guntur Dist. - 522213, Andhra Pradesh during 27-29th September, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.
- The Commission Considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal submitted by Dr. M.G.R. Educational and Research Institute (Deemed to be University), Chennai (Tamil Nadu) for inclusion of Raja Rajeswari Medical College and Hospital, Bengaluru under its ambit.
- The Commission Considered and approved the matter regarding admissibility of non-compounded advance increments for possessing Ph.D. Degree and benefit of number of years required for promotion under CAS to candidates enrolled / registered / completed Ph.D. degree before 11th July, 2009 under UGC Regulations, 2010 and its 4th amendment 2016.
- The Commission Considered and approved to revisit UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2012.
- The Commission Considered and approved the report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal submitted by Manav Rachna International Institute of Research Studies (Deemed to be University), Faridabad (Haryana) for inclusion of Manav Rachna Dental College, Faridabad (Haryana) under its ambit
- The Commission Considered and approved the Categorization of JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, (Deemed to be University), Mysore (Karnataka) under Category –I of the University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018.
- The Commission Considered and approved the Categorization of Koneru Lakshmaiah Education Foundation (Deemed to be University), Green Fields, Vaddeswaram, Guntur District – 522502, Andhra Pradesh under Category–I of the University Grants Commission [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018.

- The Commission Considered and approved draft UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2018. and after indepth discussions, decided that the draft Regulations be finalized keeping in view the suggestions of the members and the legal opinion and authorized the Chairman for its approval.
- The Commission Considered and approved the matter regarding granting of fresh autonomous status to the 1. Guru Nanak Khalsa College of Arts Science & Commerce, King's Circle, Matunga, Mumbai-400 019 Maharashtra affiliated to University of Mumbai, Mumbai. 2. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Mahavidyalaya, Karmaveer Path Pandharpur-413 304 Dist., Solapur Maharashtra affiliated to Solapur University, Solapur.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes etc.)

- The Commission considered the review of UGC list of Approved Journals and approved the constitution of the CARE (Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics) for preparation of a new list of credible quality journals for disciplines such as Social Sciences, Humanities Languages, Arts, Culture, Indian knowledge system etc.
 - The CARE should involve relevant Statutory Councils/Academic Bodies. It will prepare and maintain lists of quality journals in various disciplines within a defined time-frame with the help of INFLIBNET and entrusted institutions to analyze journals suggested by the CARE members. It was also proposed to issue advisories to create awareness amongst the students, academia and other stakeholders about the issue of predatory/sub-standard journals.
- The Commission considered the Mentoring of Non Accredited Institutions by a well performing Institution (PARAMARSH) and approved the scheme of PARAMARSH. However, the scheme guidelines be modified suitably in the light of the suggestions of the Members. The Commission authorised the Chairman, UGC to approve the modified guidelines.
- The Commission considered the administrative matter related to NAAC, Bengaluru and resolved that NAAC should assess its complete requirement of manpower in view of the future expansion and submit a comprehensive proposal. The proposal should include justification for additional manpower requirement in existing positions and creation of new positions along with their CRRs duly approved by the Finance Committee and Executive Committee.

(Grants to Universities and Colleges)

• The Commission considered and approved the balance grant to the Universities which have completed the projects approved under the scheme of "One time catch up grant to uncovered (Non 12 B) State Universities".

537th Meeting 10th December, 2018.

• The Commission ratified equivalence of ARPIT (Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching) programme to Refresher course to be eligible for the purposes of Career Advancement Scheme of teachers and further resolved that UGC should write to the Vice-Chancellors of all the Universities informing that the successful completion of the MOOCS courses offered under the ARPIT programme, consisting of 40 hrs. of instruction with proctored examination leading to e-certification be treated as equivalent to a Refresher Course for the purposes of Career Advancement. For wider promotion of the programme, the UGC Regional Offices should be involved.

- The Commission noted the progress made in terms of the processing of applications received from the HEIs under UGC (ODL) Third Amendment Regulations, 2018. The Commission authorized the Chairman, UGC to take decisions on the recommendations of the Expert Committees and the same shall be communicated to the HEIs. The decisions so taken shall be reported to the Commission.
- The Commission noted the information related to appeal disposal process, constitution of Standing Appellate Committee with Terms of Reference and the opinion of ASG, Shri Vikramjit Banerjee that new evidence may be considered by the UGC at the appellate stage.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission considered and approved enhancement of the age of superannuation to 65 years in the
 case of Dr. S.N Ojha, Senior System Programmer-Cum-Reader (re-designated post) on the Judgment/
 order and directions to UGC by Hon'ble Court of Calcutta.
- The Commission considered and approved the Report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal submitted by Christ (Deemed to be University), Bengaluru (Karnataka) for starting off-campus centres at Ghaziabad (Uttar Pradesh) and Lavasa (Pune).
 - The Commission decided to recommend to MHRD that Letter of Intent(LoI) be issued to the Christ (Institution Deemed to be University), Bengaluru for starting Off Campus Centres at Ghaziabad (Uttar Pradesh) and Lavasa(Pune) subject to the compliance of the suggestions given by UGC and AICTE Expert Committee.
- The Commission considered and approved the compliance report submitted by Dr. MGR Educational and Research Institute (Deemed to be University), Maduravoyal, Chennai, Tamil Nadu for continuation of Deemed to be University status beyond 30.06.2019.
- The Commission considered and approved the extension/continuation of Deemed to be University status to Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University), Institutional Area, Janakpuri, New Delhi from 07.05.2012 onwards.
- The commission considered the recommendations of the Interface Expert Committee on representations of Deemed to be Universities (DTBUs) and Private Universities for recognition of programmes to be offered through Open and Distance (ODL) Mode from 2018-19 onwards; session beginning from January, 2019 and approved the recommendations in respect of the following HEIs:.
- (i) Dayalbagh Educational Institute, Dayalbagh, Agra(UP)
- (ii) Jain University, Bengaluru, Karnataka
- (iii) Jamia Hamdard, Hamdard Nagar, New Delhi.
- (iv) Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Sector-7, Nerul, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra.

The Commission directed that HEIs shall be informed that admissions for the programmes being recognized now can only be done from the academic session beginning January, 2019 and onwards.

In the cases of Sikkim Manipal University and MATs University, the Commission observed that the Interface Expert Committee has strongly recommended that Expert Committee visit should be conducted before taking the admissions in the 2019-20 academic session so as to ensure compliance with UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017. This means that the concerned HEI has only January, 2019 academic session for admissions. Considering this and also the fact that the earlier Committee gave conditional recommendations, the Commission resolved that an Expert Committee visit should be conducted and further necessary actions as per UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 shall be taken.

• The Commission Considered and approved the time limit for completion of admission process for the academic session for January and July for offering ODL programmes by HEIs and also directed that HEIs shall be asked to upload the admission details within ten days from the last date of the admissions in the respective academic session i.e. 10th September for July academic session and 10th March for January academic session.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes etc.)

- The Commission Considered and approved the recommendations of the Search Committee regarding the appointment of Director, INFLIBNET, Gandhinagar Prof. J.P. Singh Joorel be appointed as Director, Information and Library Network Centre (INFLIBNET), Gandhinagar.
- The Commission decided that the revision of "Guidelines for establishment of Chairs in Universities and establishment of new Chairs." be revisited.
- The Commission considered enhancement of the Rates of Honorarium of Guest Faculty in Universities and Colleges and decided **the matter and approved as follows:**
- 1. The honorarium for Guest Faculty be enhanced to Rs. 1,500/- per lecture subject to a maximum of Rs. 50,000/- per month.
- 2. The Guest Faculty be appointed only against sanctioned post. However, for the universities where the sanctioned posts are not adequate as per the teaching work load, the number of Guest Faculty to be appointed can be up to 20% over and above the sanctioned posts.
- 3. The qualifications for Guest Faculty shall be the same as those prescribed for the regular Assistant Professors of Universities/Colleges in the UGC Regulations.
- 4. The selection procedure for appointing Guest Faculty should be the same as those of a regularly appointed Assistant Professor. However, the composition of the Selection Committee shall be as follows:
- i. The Vice-Chancellor or his/her nominee shall be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
- *ii.* One Expert in the concerned subject nominated by the Vice Chancellor
- iii. Dean of the concerned Faculty; wherever applicable
- iv. Head/Chairperson of the Department/School
- v. An academician representing SC / ST / OBC / Minority / Women/Differently-abled categories to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor or Acting Vice Chancellor, if any of the candidates representing these categories is the applicant and if any of the above members of the selection committee do not belong to that category.

At least four members, including one outside subject expert shall constitute the quorum.

- 5. The Guest Faculty will not be treated like regular teachers for the purpose of voting rights or for becoming the members of the various statutory bodies of the university.
- 6. The superannuated teachers may also be considered for engagement as Guest Faculty subject to a maximum age limit of 70 years.
- 7. The Guest Faculty will not be given the benefit of allowances, pension, gratuity and leave etc. as admissible to the regular teachers.

• The Commission considered and ratify the decisions of the Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges for grant of fresh/extension of autonomous status to colleges and also resolved to grant extension to Govt. Girls PG College of Excellence, Sagar.

- The Commission ratified the revised mechanism for disbursement of scholarships/ fellowships
- The Commission ratified the review status of Sumandeep Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University), Pipariya, Taluka Vaghodia, District Vadodara, Gujarat as required in the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016.
- The Commission noted the developments in respect of UGC (Online Courses or Programmes) Regulations, 2018 and also informed that the last date for submission of applications for Online Programmes is extended upto 31.03.2019.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Shobhit Institute of Engineering & Technology (Deemed to be University), Dulhera Marg, Roorkee Road, Meerut, Uttar Pradesh 06-08th December, 2018 to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to seek compliance from Shobhit Institute of Engineering & Technology (Deemed to be University), Dulhera Marg, Roorkee Road, Meerut, Uttar Pradesh on the observations/suggestions of the Expert Committee. The compliance of the Institution Deemed to be University be placed before the Expert Committee to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC. The Report of the Committee will be placed before the Commission.
- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Chaitanya Degree College, Warangal (Telangana) during 14-15th December, 2018 to assess the proposal for Deemed to University status under general category under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 and resolved to seek compliance from Chaitanya Degree College, Warangal (Telangana) on the observations/suggestions of the Expert Committee. The compliance of the Institution be placed before the Expert Committee to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC. The Report of the Committee will be placed before the Commission.
- The Commission **Considered and approved t**he recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted to look / re-examine the matter of audit observation captioned "Excess payment and undue financial benefit to Dr. Neelima Mondal, Associate Professor of Jawaharlal Nehru University.
- The Commission considered the response received from St. Peter's Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed to be University), Avadi, Chennai 600054, Tamil Nadu in respect of the letter issued by the UGC for action as per Clause 22.2 of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to revisit St. Peter's Institute of Higher Education & Research (Deemed to be University), Avadi, Chennai 600054 Tamilnadu to validate the reply to UGC letter by another Expert Committee to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC.
- The Commission considered the response received from Vel's Institute of Science, Technology & Advanced Studies (VISTAS) (Deemed to be University), Pallavaram, Chennai (Tamil Nadu) in respect of the letter issued by the UGC for action as per Clause 22.2 of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to revisit Vel's Institute of Science, Technology & Advanced Studies (VISTAS) (Deemed to be University), Pallavaram, Chennai (Tamil Nadu) to validate the reply to UGC letter by another Expert Committee to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the UGC Committee constituted to look into all aspects of the off-campuses and courses started by Institutions Deemed to be Universities

- Reference Ministry of HRD letter No. F. 10-24/2018-U3(A) dated 16.10.2018. Further action as per MHRD's letter regarding approval of courses from UGC be taken.
- The Commission considered the response received from Ponnaiyah Ramajayam Institute of Science & Technology (PRIST), (Deemed to be University), Thanjavur 613403, Tamil Nadu in respect of the letter issued by the UGC for action as per Clause 22.2 of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to revisit Ponnaiyah Ramajayam Institute of Science & Technology (PRIST), (Deemed to be University), Thanjavur 613403, Tamil Nadu to validate the reply to UGC letter by another Expert Committee to be constituted by the Chairman, UGC.
- The Commission considered the different stages of approval process as per UGC (Online Courses or Programmes) Regulations ,2018 and time period proposed for each stage. In view of extension of time given upto 31.03.2019 to apply for online programmes, the proposed time period for approval process will delay the recognition for HEIs to start the online programmes for 2019-20 session. After discussion it was decided that:
- (I) The processing of applications received from HEIs for online programmes be a continuous process, preferably monthly Expert Committee Meetings/Visits to HEIs based on the completed proposals received. The HEIs be asked to submit three hard copies of the proposal immediately after submitting applications online.
- (II) In order to avoid delay in recognition process, the Commission authorised the Chairman, UGC to give approval to the recommendations of the Expert Committee to eligible HEIs for offering Online programmes or for the visit to HEIs, as the case may be. The decision on the applications of HEIs shall be communicated to the HEIs and the same shall be reported to the Commission for ratification.
- The Commission Considered and approved the Regulations and Report finalized by the Committee Constituted by UGC on formulation of minimum qualification for appointment of Registrar, Finance Officer, Controller of Examination in Universities and Colleges regarding. The Commission also resolved that a Committee be constituted by the Chairman, UGC for formulation of minimum qualifications and other terms and conditions for appointment and promotion avenues for Engineer, Programmer, System Analyst, Network Analyst, Security Officers etc. and other isolated posts. The Committee shall also address anomalies and/or grievances related to these posts.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendation of the Committee constituted to resolve the anomaly cases of non-teaching staff of Central Universities /Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission deliberated on the recommendations of the Working Group on the issues of ODL on Category -I HEIs and Resolved as under
- (i) All Category-I HEIs be instructed to upload all the details ensuring compliance to the relevant clauses of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments, on their website and also submit the affidavit to UGC.
- (ii) These details shall be verified by the UGC and in case, any deviation is observed, action(s) shall be initiated against the HEIs as per the provisions mandated in UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017.
- (iii) The Commission resolved that the conflicting provisions of UGC Graded Autonomy Regulations, UGC (ODL) Regulations, Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and recommendation of Justice Reddy Committee shall be referred to the MHRD for further directions.
- (iv) All Category-I HEIs should also be instructed to inform UGC regarding programme-wise enrolment details of students in their ODL programmes as has been sought from other HEIs.

- (v) Interface meeting of Category-I HEIs, as decided by the Commission in its 536th meeting, shall not be conducted at present.
- (vi) Further necessary action, if any, shall be taken by the UGC based on the directions of the MHRD as per point (iii) above.
- The Commission Considered and approved the Common Examination for regular and ODL programmes.
- The Commission Considered and approved the ODL Programmes through affiliating Universities.
- The Commission Considered the Applicability of received proposals for the academic year 2019-20 & Timeline for uploading of recognition list / issue of Commission order and noted that
- (i) since this is the first year of implementation of UGC (ODL) Regulations, the HEIs to whom Commission order is issued / recognition list is uploaded on the UGC website by 20th February 2019, they shall be allowed to offer ODL programmes from January 2019 academic session, to give at least one week for admissions considering that the last date of admission is 28th February, 2019.
- (ii) The recommendations of the Working Group to define a timeline regarding communication of recognition status shall be implemented from 2019-20, (academic session beginning July 2019) onwards.
- (iii) Such appeals / representations / visits etc. for whom Commission order is not issued / recognition list is not uploaded on the UGC website by 20th February 2019, they shall be considered for July, 2019 session and onwards.
- The Commission Considered the Review of SLM and resolved that all recognised HEIs shall be directed to upload details of the syllabi being followed for their recognised ODL programmes on their websites. A complaint / grievance based mechanism for review of SLM shall be devised by DEB.
- The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines of the New Research Scheme for Transdisciplinary Research through Higher Education Institutes for National Development and Entrepreneurship (STRIDE).
- The Commission considered and approved the different NAAC benchmark for Higher Educational Institutions in 'Special Category States' (North Eastern and Hilly States).
- The Commission considered and approved the proposal for extension and induction of SAP Department from 01.04.2019 to 31.03.2024 to Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai (Deemed University) subject to availability of funds.
- The Commission Considered and approved the following i.r.o. Jamia Millia Islamia University ODL Programmes:
- 1. To consider and decide the status of Hony. Director of the Centre for Distance and Open Learning, Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) as per UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and recommendation of Expert Committee.
- 2. To consider and approve the recommendation of Expert Committee in respect of Jamia Millia Islamia for offering thirteen ODL programmes.
- 3. To consider and decide the academic session for start of ODL programmes in respect of Jamia Millia Islamia.
- The Commission considered the letter No.5-25/2017-DL dt 28.01.2019 received from the Ministry of HRD for the amendment in UGC (Online Courses or Programmes) Regulations, 2018 in Regulation 4, sub regulation (1), after clause (ii) and (iii) and after first proviso, as under:-

"Provided further that higher educational institutions which have been running online courses prior to the date of notification of these Regulations, shall be allowed one-time opportunity to apply for offering Online Courses or programmes, with an undertaking that they will attain a NAAC score of 3.26 on a 4-point scale before the end of academic session 2020-21, failing which the Commission shall not accord any further approval to the online programmes of such a higher educational institution beyond 2020-21."

After discussion and considering the 'Explanation' under clause 6(3), as detailed in the agenda, the Commission approved the amendment as per the following:

- i. Since there were no regulations for online education before the UGC (Online Courses or Programmes) Regulations notified on 4th July, 2018, the HEIs conducting online programmes with due approval of their statutory bodies cannot be kept out of the purview of Online Regulations for want of eligibility criteria defined in the Online Regulations and need to be given time to acquire the prescribed standards.
- ii. As the proposed amendment is to come by way of inserting proviso in Regulation 4, Sub regulation (1), after clause (ii) and (iii) and after the first proviso, it applies to both the eligibility criteria defined in clause (ii) & (iii) under sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 4.
- iii. Only those HEIs who conclusively prove by way of documentary evidence or any other evidence by way of approval of their statutory bodies, details of programmes conducted online, details of admissions taken, online examination procedure, pass out details, security standards etc. being followed, may be considered under the amendment now being made in Online Regulations.
- The Commission considered engaging senior academicians/officers as Visiting Faculty in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and resolved that the Committee, constituted for considering the enhancement of honorarium of guest faculty, may examine this issue also and give its recommendations for consideration of the Commission.
- The Commission considered the 2nd report and recommendations of the Empowered Expert Committee (EEC) constituted for the purpose of identifying Institutions of Eminence and resolved to seek clarification from the Government whether additional 10 Institutions (over and above the original mandate of 10 public and 10 private institutions) can be considered? Further decision can be taken after receiving clarification from the Government.

(Reference from Government and other National Bodies)

- The Commission considered the request of Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India on offering of Agricultural degree programmes through ODL mode by HEIs and noted that UGC has not given recognition to any Agricultural programme after the receipt of communication from the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India. The Commission also noted that one HEI i.e. Yashwant Rao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU), Nasik has been given recognition for Agricultural Programmes prior to this communication from the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India. This matter was deliberated and the Commission resolved as under:
- 1. UGC shall inform the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India that Agricultural degrees in ODL mode shall not be recognized in future. However, the status of such programmes which have been already approved prior to the receipt of this intimation shall also be conveyed to the Ministry,

with the request to provide all kinds of necessary support in the interest of students already admitted in such courses. UGC shall write to ICAR for hand-holding of universities offering Agricultural degree programmes through ODL mode and co-ordinate with ICAR and the concerned HEI to explore the feasibility of setting up of Learner Support Centres in nearest Agricultural Universities / Krishi Vigyan Kendras etc. (within the territorial jurisdiction of the HEI) where proper facilities for practical and hands on training can be provided to the students.

- UGC shall write to the concerned HEI that the recognition for Agricultural programs in ODL mode is ii. only for the academic year 2018-19 and direct the HEI that no admission shall be made from 2019-20, academic session beginning July 2019 onwards, in any of the Agricultural programs in ODL mode.
- UGC shall also issue a Public Notice mentioning disciplines prohibited in ODL education. iii.

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes etc.)

The Commission considered the report of the Evaluation Reforms submitted by the Expert Committee and resolved that the report may be put in public domain by uploading it in UGC website for obtaining views of the stakeholders and thereafter it can be finalized by the Committee constituted for the purpose.

(Grants to Universities and Colleges)

- The Commission considered and approved SAP grant to institutions where RUSA funding is proposed/ given . Further, it was resolved that the guidelines of SAP Scheme be revised. While considering this item, it was also resolved that the release of grants to state universities selected under UPE Scheme and College selected under the CPE Scheme be continued up to 31.03.2019 subject to availability of funds. Also resolved that the guidelines of UPE and CPE schemes be revised and to be made more competitive.
- The Commission considered and approved the budget estimate for Quality Improvement Programme

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- The Commission considered and approved the budget allocated by CARE-Empowered Committee for UGC Cell for Journal analysis, SPPU, Pune and CARE-Universities.
- The Commission noted the following reply given on regular basis, as applicable, by the UGC based on the approval of the Competent Authority:

"Admission taken in the approved Open and Distance Learning (ODL) program during the recognition period stands recognized till the completion of course even if the University does not have recognition for further years provided the programme is offered as per the UGC norms of territorial jurisdiction and in conformity with the extant guidelines and/or UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and Regulations of respective Regulatory Bodies."

The Commisson discussed the issue related to misplacing of Appeal alongwith fee of Yashwant Rao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU), Nasik. The Commission was briefed that YCMOU had forwarded Appeal for 24 programmes, alongwith DD dated 23.10.2018 for Rs. 2,40,000/-, in the month of October, 2018. However, YCMOU was not invited in any of the Appellate meetings as the said Appeal alongwith original DD has not been received in the DEB Office. Based on the telephonic calls and personal visit of YCMOU authorities and the "Speed Post Tracking Record", it has been observed that the said Appeal was, in fact, received in the UGC Head Office on October 29, 2018 and R&I Section of UGC Head Office had

forwarded this to DEB on 01.11.2018. But the fact remains that Appeal alongwith fee has not been received in the DEB Office. Based on discussion with the YCMOU authorities, it was also informed to the Commission that YCMOU has made the admissions in the "not recognised programmes". After detailed deliberations, the Commission decided the following:

- 1. As the Appeal alongwith fee was submitted by the YCMOU within the cut-off date which got misplaced in UGC; as such, there is no fault of YCMOU and an opportunity of Appeal process should be provided to it. YCMOU shall submit prescribed fee alongwith Appeal immediately. Due to the genuine reasons, the Commission decided that for YCMOU only, the Appeal process should be completed at the earliest and decision with the approval of the Chairman, UGC shall be communicated/uploaded on UGC Website by 11th March, 2019 with admission cut-off date of 18th March, 2019 for the academic session that has begun in January, 2019. For all other HEIs, the last date of admission for the academic session begun in January, 2019 shall remain 28th February, 2019.
- ii. Show Cause Notice should be issued to YCMOU to explain why admissions have been made in the "not recognized programmes" and based on the reply, necessary action including punitive ones, as per the provisions of the Regulations, shall be taken with the approval of the Chairman, UGC. The same shall also be reported to the Commission.
- iii. The Commission decided that a strong mechanism at DEB Office shall be put into place that all the recognized HEIs are monitored on continuance basis; semester after semester; to ensure compliance to the UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its Amendments and take punitive actions, in case of any violations, as per provisions of the Regulations. The Commission directed that this issue should be discussed in DEB Working Group and based on its recommendations, necessary action should be taken with the approval of the Chairman, UGC and later on reported to the Commission.

(Matters Relating to Standards)

- The commission Considered the compliance submitted by the Deemed to be Universities and resolved as under:
- i. Recommended the extension of Deemed to be University status in respect of those Institutions which have complied with the conditions stipulated in the MHRD notification.
- ii. The MHRD may consider extension of Deemed to be University status in respect of those Institutions which have partially complied with the conditions stipulated in the MHRD notification, subject to condition that these Institutions submit full compliance.
- iii. Seek compliance from those Deemed to be Universities which have not yet submitted compliance in respect of the conditions stipulated in the MHRD notification.
- The Commission considered and approved the revisions of Fellowships w.e.f. 01.01.2019 as under:

For other scholarships/fellowships of UGC, the matter be referred to 'Fellowships Rationalization Committee'.

- The Commission considered the report of the UGC Expert Committee which visited Institute of Liver & Biliary Sciences (ILBS), (Deemed to be University), Vasant Kunj, New Delhi to review its functioning as required under the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and resolved to recommend to MHRD for continuation of status of Deemed to be University to Institute of Liver & Biliary Sciences (ILBS), (Deemed to be University), Vasant Kunj, New Delhi. The suggestions by the visiting Expert Committee, if any, will be addressed by the Deemed to be University within a period of 6 months and the compliance report would be submitted alongwith documentary proof to UGC.
- The Commission Considered and approved the framework for Teacher Induction Programme (TIP)
- The Commission considered and approved the revised guidelines for Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) except for the appointments on the posts of the Academic Staff i.e. Director cum Professor, Deputy Director cum Associate Professor, Assistant Director cum Assistant Professor etc. alongwith issues related to their service conditions. It was decided that the guidelines for these positions may be issued separately.
- The Commission considered and approved the creation of teaching positions in Central Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendation of the Committee examining the proposals of Centrally funded Deemed to be Universities for creation of new teaching positions
- The Commission considered and approved the renaming along with minor revisions in the UGC Quality Mandate.

(Reference from Government and other National Bodies)

- The Commission considered a reference received from Rajya Sabha Secretariat regarding the issue of salary and perquisites to the teachers who are elected/nominated as Members of Parliament and agreed with the recommendations of the Committee and approved as follows:
- 1. "As per UGC Circular of 1987 and as stated in the Programme of Action of National Policy on Education, the teachers who wish to take the leave of absence during their term as Members of the Parliament/State Legislature may be allowed to do so while ensuring that they do not lose their seniority or increments in the process. In this case they will draw their salary from the Parliament/State Legislature Secretariat.
- 2. The teachers who wish to continue teaching in the university departments/colleges after being elected/ nominated as Members of Parliament/State Legislation, may be allowed to continue with the teaching and research work in the universities/colleges with the provision that they may be treated as "on duty" when the Parliament/State Legislature is in session for attending the session and when such teachers undertake any other Parliamentary/State Legislative assignments. To ensure that the teaching work does

not suffer, the university may consider assigning appropriate work load to such teachers. However, such teachers should not hold any administrative positions/responsibilities in the university/college during the period they are Members of Parliament/State Legislature.

Such teachers may draw their salary from the concerned university/college. However, the admissible allowances may be drawn from the Parliament/State Legislature Secretariat.

The Commission also recommended that the issue relating to holding of Office of Profit by the Members of the Parliament/State Legislature may be looked into by the respective Secretariat."

(Special Programmes, Quality Programmes ETC)

- The Commission considered and approved the proposal of INFLIBNET for Development and Management of e-Governance Project of UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved draft National Curriculum Framework Guidelines on Fostering Social Responsibility & Community Engagement in Higher Education Institution in India under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA 2.0).
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Search Committee regarding the appointment of Director, Inter University Centre for Yogic Sciences, Bengaluru

1.8 Special Activities / Initiatives

> 2nd April, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that the University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous Status upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 have been notified by the Government of India in the official Gazette on 12th February, 2018, and the same are also available on the UGC website.www.ug.ac.in.

► 6th April, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that UGC has developed Guidelines on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and also the detailed syllabi in consultation with various stakeholders in as many as 109 undergraduate courses as a template. These syllabi of 109 courses are available on the UGC website.

> 9th April, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that the Government of India has planned to establish an on-line national network that lists all the scientific / technical /analytical /research equipment/facilities procured with funds provided by the agencies of the Government of India and installed in academic/R & D organizations around the country.

Accordingly, all the Higher Educational institutions are requested to furnish information about the existing facilities at different centres (including instruments funded under extra mural projects by funding agencies) on the website. http://ww.i-stem.ac.in

The Commission advised all the Universities & Colleges to give suitable preference in admission to graduate courses in Physiotherapy to those candidates having requisite expertise in Yoga "A candidate having at least one year diploma in Yoga may be given preference in admission, subject to the condition that marks secured in the entrance examination and other eligibility conditions are same to a candidate with similar credential by not having said expertise in Yoga.

1st May, 2018

Non-Technology PG MOOCs for SWAYAM

The SWAYAM platform is an indigenous platform of the Government of India which hosts MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) courses to enable students to virtually attend the courses taught by the best faculty; access high quality reading resources. Participate in discussion forums; take tests and earn academic grades. It is aimed at benefitting lifelong learners, students, teachers, researchers to use multimedia on anytime, anywhere basis for acquiring knowledge and skills.

The Government of India has identified eight National Coordinators from School to Higher Education level. UGC has been identified as the National Coordinators for developing PG MOOCs from academic(s)/ Professional associated with Universities/Educational Institutions.

UGC has also issued UGC (Credit Framework for Online Courses through SWAYAM) Regulations, 2016 to enable transfer of credit based on MOOCs Courses up to a maximum of 20%.

UGC invites "Detailed proposal" from higher education institutions and academicians to develop high quality MOOCs comparable to international standards, along with a sample video of about 5 minutes to be uploaded on YouTube giving brief description about the objectives & outlines of the Course, so that good quality proposal for development of MOOCs course is received on regular basis.

While submitting the "Detailed Proposal" the following criteria shall be full filled:

- An academician/faculty having 10 years of PG Teaching Experience in concerned field, can be the Course Coordinator.
- The faculty employed in University/College would be required to submit a consent letter of the host University/College to develop MOOCs Courses.
- As the course, carry credits/certification, they shall be cleared by the 'Host University/Institute', who are authorized to award degrees as per section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956 and also agree to conduct End Examination, assessment and grant credits/certification."
- One Course Coordinator can offer only one course at a time.
- The Guidelines for developing the MOOCs Courses and funding pattern have been laid down by the Ministry of Human Development which can be downloaded from the following links:

The Ministry of Human Resource Development in association with the Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin), M/o Drinking Water and Sanitation has launched a 'Swachh Bharat Summer Internship' Programme. The UGC vide its letter dated 23.3.2018 addressed to Vice-Chancellors of all Universities has informed about the Commission 's decision to have two credits like any elective course' under CBCS for students in Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) undertaking 15 days (100 hrs) Summer Internship under Swachh Bhyarat Abhiyan Activities. The Secretary (Higher Education), MHRD vide letter D.O.No. 11014/02/2018 dated 20th April, 2018 has also written to the Vice chancellors of all Universities to have students' participation in 'Swachh Bharat Internship 'Programme. The detailed guidelines for implementation were also forwarded.

In this regard, it is requested that all Universities may consider implementing the following:

- (i) To give wide publicity of the suggested activities as mentioned in point 3 of the Guidelines on Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018 Programme (copy attached).
- (ii) Students may be asked to submit a project report detailing the activities carried out in 15 days (100 hrs).
- (iii) University may award two credits based on the review/assessment of the work carried out, as mentioned in the project report.

The Commission informed all the Universities that this year, Government of India is hosting he World Environment Day, 2018 at global level in collaboration with the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). The theme for this year is "Beat Plastic Pollution".

The universities advised to conduct awareness campaign during "World Environmental Day 2018 on 5th June."

> 18th May, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities to celebrate the Anti-terrorism Day in a befitting manner in their University and also in the colleges affiliated to University by observance of pledge taking ceremony.

> 28th May, 2018

Anti Ragging

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal NO. 887/2009, the UGC had notified "Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher educational Institutions, 2009". The Regulations are mandatory for all educational institutions in the country. As multiple mechanism are required to ensure a ragging-free campus, here are recommendations and action steps which may be deployed in the university and all institutions under your ambit.

A. Basic Measures

- 1. Constitutions of anti-ragging committee, Anti-Ragging squad, setting up of Anti-Ragging Cell and adequate publicity for these measures through various media are to be under taken.
- 2. Mention of Anti-ragging warning in the institution's prospectus and information booklets/brochures shall be ensured.
- 3. Updating websites of institutions with the complete address of nodal officers related anti ragging committee with contact details.
- 4. In compliance of the UGC Regulations and the 2nd Amendment in the UGC Regulation regarding submission of undertaking by each student and every parent to submit an online undertaking in every academic year.
- 5. UGC has notified the 3rd Amendment in UGC Regulations on 29th June, 2016 to expand the definition of ragging by including the following:
 - 3(i) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of color, race, religion, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
- 6. Installing CCTV cameras at vital points
- B Counseling and monitoring measures

- 7. Regular interaction and counseling with the students can detect early signs of ragging and identification of trouble-triggers
- 8. Surprise inspection at hostels, students accommodation, canteens, rest cum
- C. Creative Dissemination of the idea of ragging –free campus
- 9. Events like Anti-Ragging workshops, seminars and other creative avenues to spread the idea.
- 10. Safety and security apps without affecting the privacy of individuals can be creatively deployed.
- D. Using other UGC initiated measures
- 11. Students in distress due to ragging related incidents can call the National Anti-ragging Helpline 1800-5522(24*7 Toll free) or e-mail the Anti-Ragging at Helpline@antiragging.in.
- 12. For any other information regarding ragging, please visit the UGC website i.e www.ugc.ac.in&www.antiragging.in and contact UGC monitoring agency i.e. Aman Satya Kachroo Trust on mobile No. 09871170303, 09818400116 (only in case emergency).
- 13. The UGC has got developed 4 short films and a documentary film to counsel students on ill effects of ragging. These, films are uploaded on UGC website. All Universities/Institutions are requested to show these films regularly to the students during orientation and other programmes. These movies are available on the following link, ugc.ac.in/page/Videos-Regarding-Ragging. aspx

Any violation of UGC Regulations or if any institutions fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or does not act in accordance with these Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators of incidents of ragging suitably, will attract punitive action under the UGC Act.

Universities and Colleges are requested to implement the recommendations communicated vide letter 15.11.2017 and thereby ensure a ragging-free campus, a fundamental requirement for a supportive and fair institutional climate which is open to change, learning and progress.

→ 4th June, 2018

The Commission circulated to all the Universities/Colleges "Quality Mandate" approved by the commission in its 532nd meeting held on 24.05.2018, for improving the quality in higher educational institutions. The mandate strives to achieve the objective set by the year 2022. Universities & Colleges are requested to initiate appropriate necessary action as applicable.

> 8th June, 2018

The Commission issued a public notice Regarding equivalence of foreign Ph.D degree with Indian Ph.D degree as provided in the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil./Ph.D.) Regulations, 2016.

Any foreign Ph.D Degree which is held equivalent by AIU by following its own procedure may also be treated valid for exemption from NET for appointment as Assistant Professor in Indian Universities and Colleges.

> 19th June, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities /Colleges regarding the need for creating an environment that fosters equal treatment for engagement of Gender Champions in all educational institutions across the country.

Universities are requested to ensure swift implementation of the 'Guidelines for Gender Champions in educational institutions' in your esteemed University and also in the affiliated colleges (available on UGC website). The Ministry of Women and Child Development has also come out with a badge for Gender Champion which is available on its website and also on My Gov Portal.

> 26th June, 2018

EAT-> All the Universities/Colleges receiving grant from UGC are requested to implement all the three modules of PFMS for all its schemes. EAT module shall ensure complete tracking of funds up to the last mile and also ensures just-in-time release of funds. It has, therefore, been decided that all registered agencies to whom payments are being released by UGC under its various schemes to mandatorily use all three modules of EAT module with immediate effect, failing which no further funds will be released to the grantee institutions (Universities/Colleges/Institutions).

Universities/Colleges are to ensure immediate implementation of the "expenditure filing" component of EAT module of PFMS. Further grants will be released based on the balance available with the grantee institution in PFMS as per the EAT module data for the respective agencies which include expenditure up to the end user. The implementation/adoption of EAT module is mandatory for the Universities/Institutions who are receiving grants from the UGC.

> 31st July, 2018

The Commission organized "National University Film Making Competition". 10 Universities are selected for winning short film.

6th August, 2018

UGC informed all the Universities that in order to put a check on plagiarism and to recommend some institutional mechanism to eliminate the scope of this menace in higher education system in the country, University Grants Commission in its 530th meeting held on 20.03.2018 considered and approved the UGC)Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations of have been notified in the Official Gazette of India on 31st July, 2018 and are available on UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in.

> 7th August, 2018

TheCommission issued a public notice on development of Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) at Undergraduate and Postgraduate level. In this regard various subject specific committee have been constituted for developing templates of LOCF. The fundamental premise of LOCF is to specify what graduates completing a particular programme of study are expected to know, understand and be able to do at the end of their programme of study. This approach of learning makes the students an active learner; the teacher a good facilitator and together they lay the foundation for lifelong learning.

To solicit the views/suggestions from all Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) including teachers, students, education personnel, eminent educationists and public at large on Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework.

9th August, 2018

DEB -> The Commission in its 534th meeting held on 02.08.2018 considered the recommendations of the Interface Committees and approved the ODL programmes for 2018-19 onwards.

- A. The important decisions by the Commission in respect of distance education programmes are being notified for the benefit of all stakeholders:
- 1. All professional programmes i.e. MBA/MCA/B.Ed (Special Education)/M.Ed (Special Education) Hotel Management /Travel/Tourism and Management Programmes in ODL mode shall not be accorded recognition without prior approval of the respective Regulatory Authority valid for the year 2018-19 & onwards, as per sub regulations 2(p) of Regulations 1, of UGC (ODL) Regulation, 2017.

- 2. As per UGC(ODL) 2nd Amendment Regulation 2018 notified on 6th February 2018, Higher Educational institutions (HEIs) that were given permission by the UGC to offer ODL programme for the academic year 2017-18 but not accredited with NAAC accreditation within 3 months from the date of issue of 2nd Amendment shall not be accorded recognition.
- 3. As per clause 3.3 of Annexure-X of UGC(ODL) Regulations, 2017, the Programmes of Private Universities , which are not running same/similar programmes in regular mode for last 5 years, shall not be accorded recognition.
- 4. For the current academic year 2018-19, the HEIs shall complete admission process by first October, 2018 and no admission shall be made after this.
- 5. HEIs shall be given 30 days time period to submit representations along with documentary evidence in respect of reason(s) indicated in the recognition letter communicating programme-wise deficiencies and shall be processed as per the relevant provisions of the UGC(ODL) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments.
- 6. As per sub regulation (2) of Regulation 1 of part I, of UGC(ODL) Regulation, 2017, only degree level programmes at Under Graduate/Post Graduate level have been considered. The Certificate, Diploma, PG Diploma programmes have not been considered.
- B. The HEIs which had participated in the Interface Meetings, and whose names are not appearing in the Recognition List, have not been recognized for offering ODL programmes for 2018-19. Such HEIs will be given an opportunity to make representation within 30 days to UGC as per sub regulation (4) of regulation 3 of Part II of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017.
- C. For the HEIs which have recognized for offering ODL programmes, for 2018-19 and onwards, as per the recognition list, recognition letters having details of the programmes recognized/not recognized with reason(s) thereof are being issued separately.
- D. The visits by UGC Expert Committees to Deemed to be universities and its Learner Support Centers/ Study Centers to assess the preparedness of the HEI to offer ODL programmes are under process. The decision of the Commission will be communicated separately.

> 16th August, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges to introduce Induction Programme for students taking admissions at the under graduate and postgraduate level in Universities and Colleges. The Commission in its 534th meeting held on 02.08.2018, has approved, "A Guide to Student Induction Programme." The purpose of Students Induction Programme is to help students adjust and feel comfortable in the new environment, build bonds with fellow students, teachers and institutios.

> 23rd August, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that to enhance the existing capacity of accreditation for meeting the requirements of the HEIs, it has been decided to allow more accreditation agencies to comes into this sphere of activity. Accordingly, University Grants Commission has notified University Grants Commission (Recognition and Monitoring of Assessment & Accreditation Agencies) Regulations, 2018.

> 28th August, 2018

Public Notice -In continuation to the UGC (Minimum Standard and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D degrees) Regulations 2016, UGC has notified University Grants Commission (Minimum Standard and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D degrees) (1st amendment) Regulations, 2018. The above notification is available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that as per "Aadhaar (Target Delivery of Financial and other subsidies, Benefit and services) Act 2016" prohibits publishing and displaying the Aadhaar number publicity. Universities/Colleges are advised not to publish or display the Aadhaar number of the students publicly.

> 5th September, 2018

The Commission issued a public notice for information to all Universities on clarification regarding methodology for calculating API score during leave period of teachers.

▶ 11th September, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that as a precursor to the launch of the 150th birth year celebrations of Mahatma Gandhi and in the run up to the 4th anniversary of Swachh Bharat Mission, it has been decided to observe Swachhata Hi Seva 2018 (SHS) from 15th September to 2nd October, 2018. SHS aims at accelerating the Jan Andolan for realizing the Hon'ble Prime Minister vision of a clean India, further reinforcing the belief that 'Sanitation is everyone's business. The launch of SHS 2018 may be organized on the morning of 15th September 2018, encouraging students to intiate Swachhata Drives.

> 11th September, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges to participate in Unnat Bharat Abhiyan programme of MHRD. Govt. of India to involve Higher Education Institutions (HEI) of the country for indigenous developments of self sufficient sustainable village cluster for inclusive India. The second Phase of the process of selection of institution under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan has commenced w.e.f 1st Sept. 2018.

> 14th September, 2018

EAT->Universities / colleges are informed that UGC has decided to adopt Expenditure Advance and Transfer (EAT) Module on the direction of Ministries of Finance and Human Resource Development , Government of India to ensure complete tracking of funds released and expenditure upto the end mile beneficiary under all theschemes being implemented by the UGC. All the registered agencies implementing, Central Sector Schemes will mandatorily use EAT Module with immediate effect failing which no further fundswill be released to the agencies.

It is requested to take immediate action on the following issues:-

- 1. Implementation of EAT module in ROs, IUCs of UGC and Universities/Institutions/Colleges funded by UGC be ensured by the September 20, 2018.
- 2. Bank Account (s) registered under PFMS for UGC schemeswill not be registered for any other funding agency. This Account (s) shall exclusively be used for UGC schemes only, failing which the UGC will not release any further grant to the beneficiary Institutions.
- 3. Bank Account must be in the full name of the Institution (as mentioned in the UGC 2(f) & 12 B list) and not as UGC Fund or UGC Plan Grant.

14th September, 2018

The UGC on 5th May, 2016 had issued UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure of Award for M.Phil/Ph.D Degrees) Regulations, 2016. The Clause 11 of the Regulations states as under:

- Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations or any other Rule or Regulation, for the time being in force, no University; institution, Deemed to be a University and College shall conduct M.Phil and Ph.D Programmes through distance education mode.
- 2. Part time Ph.D will be allowed provided all the conditions mentioned in the extant Ph.D Regulations are

Thereafter a number of queries were received from various Open Universities seeking permission for starting M.Phil/Ph.D Programme in regular mode. It is hereby clarified that IGNOU and other State Open Universities funded by the Government are permitted to run M.Phil/Ph.D Programme in regular mode only in accordance with the above stated UGC Regulations and its amendments from time to time provided that the acts of these universities include the provision for running academic/research Programmes in regular mode.

This Pubic Notice will supersede the UGC letters issued previously to HEIs recognizing /permitting offering of M.Phil/Ph.D Programme in regular mode; as applicable.

17th September, 2018

The University Grants Commission has notified UGC (ODL) Third Amendment Regulations, 2018 in the official gazette on 6th September 2018. which can be accessed on the UGC Website www.ugc.ac.in

19th September, 2018

UGC issued a letter to all Universities regarding NAD->The Government of India in its endeavor to bring administrative and academic reforms has established National Academic Depository (NAD) which is a digital depository of academic awards on the pattern of securities depository. This NAD is available 24x7 online and enables round the clock access to the stakeholders for retrieval and verification of academic awards (degrees, diplomas, certificates, mark-sheets etc) lodged by the academic institutions/boards/eligibility assessment bodies in digital format. The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) has designated the University Grants Commission (UGC) as an authorized body for implementation of NAD. NSDL Datatbase Management Limited (NDML) and CDSL Ventures, Limited (CVL) two of the wholly owned subsidiaries of the Depositories registered under Securities Exchange Board of India (SEBI) Act, 1992 are the two Digital depositories for NAD who will keep the academic award in the digital format and ensure the data integrity.

The academic institutions viz. universities, school boards, central higher educational institution, AICTE approved standalone professional institutions, eligibility assessment bodies, and institutions approved by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) are required to enter into a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with either of the two depositories i.e CVL and NDML, in order to onboard on NAD for lodging their academic awards. To facilitate the implementation of NAD for especially which are not yet on boarded with NAD and to propup the lodging of academic award by the institutions under gone SLA with CVL/NDML, a National level worskshop was held on 28th September, 2018 at All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi.

19th September, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has prepared a model course curriculum for Masters in Public Health (MPH) and requested to adopt the course curriculum in their University and also convey relevant instructions to all affiliated Colleges Institutions. The approval model MPH course curriculum is available on the official website of M/O H & FW at http://mohfw.gov.in/sites/default/files/MPH-Model%20Course%20Curriculum.pdf.

> 19th September, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that the Government of India has decided to observe 'Surgical strike Day' on 29th September, 2018 to celebrate this occasion in a befitting manner.

DEB-Distance Education Bureau-Important Decision for the HEIs-Public Notice

- a. The commission in tis 535th meeting held on 27th September, 2018 has decide to extend the last date of admission in the recognized 'Open and Distance Learning 'Programme to be offered by the Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) for the academic session 2018-19 to October 20, 2018. The HEIs shall complete the admission process by 20th October, 2018 and no admission shall be made after this.
- b. The revised programme recognition status, based on decision of the Commission on the representations alongwith documentary evidences received from the HEIs, will be available on UGC website www. ugc.ac.in/deb, by October 03, 2018. HEIs may start admission process in the programme recognized as per the revised programme recognition status available on UGC website. The UGC letter detailing programme-wise recognition status to Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) will be issued at the earliest.
- c. For the programmes not recognized (still found deficient), as per revised recognition status at 'B' above, the Higher Educational Institutions may submit an appeal to the Commission, if any, along with a fee of Rupees ten thousand per programme, within 30 days from the date of the UGC letter, as per the provision of sub-regulation (5) of Part-II of the University Grants Commission (Open & Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017.
- d. The programme recognition status based on decision of the Commission on the Expert Committee Visit Reports will be available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in/deb, by October 03, 2018. HEIs may start admission process in the programmes recognized as per the revised programme recognition status available on UGC website. The UGC letter detailing programme wise recognition status to Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) will be issued at the earliest.
- e. For the programme found deficient, as per recognition status at 'd'above, HEIs can submit representations within 30days along with documentary evidence for consideration for recognition in the second stage there after if the programmes still remaining deficient, HEIs have an appeal option.

→ 03rd October, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that UGC has designed curricular structure for Bachelor-level degree program in Aircraft Maintenance as a way of encouraging universities to come forward and offer this programme on their campuses under Choice-based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by UGC. The syllabus is available on the UGC website www.ugc.ac.in for implementation by all the Higher Educational Institutes. However, the universities are requested to obtain the approval of the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) before adopting the syllabi as DGCA is a statutory body responsible for laying down standards and regulations for air safety and airworthiness standards. It is mandatory for all the universities to display the certificate of approval on their websites for information and awareness of the students seeking enrolment in the course.

10th October, 2018

'The Commission issued a public notice on enhancements made on UGC-Canara Bank web portal

UGC has been disbursing scholarship/fellowship under various schemes through a dedicated state of art system which is integrated with Public Financial Management System (PFMS) on DBT platform. The designated web portal has been enhanced of ensuring timely and regular payment to the awardees by streamlining the payment process further.

With effect from 01.10.2018, payments to the awardees are being generated by default for all awardees linked by Universities/Institutions based on monthly confirmation of candidates by the concerned University/Institutions on the designated web portal.

Master data entries need not be approved by UGC and payments would be generated on the basis of monthly confirmations by the 15th of every month. The monthly confirmation option is enabled with a "Maker" and "Checker" functionality. All such Univesities and Institutions who have not acquired login-id and password for accessing the web portal may acquire them on urgent basis by sending a request on fellowshipsa3@gmail. com only. The detailed YouTube tutorial and the guidelines for operating the new functionalities on the web portal are available on UGC website for ready reference.

15th October, 2018

The Commission advised all the Universities/Colleges that a culture of innovation and entrepreneurships must be promoted as there is no dearth of grass-root level innovators in the country and efforts must be made to facilitate their growth. The Commission suggested specific steps need to be taken for this movement.

16th October, 2018

The Commission advised all the Universities/Colleges to observe the Vigilance Awareness Week from 29th October to 3rd November, 2018 in their institution and conduct activities as mentioned in the CVC circular. Every employee/student/teacher may be encouraged to take e-pledge by visiting the CVC website "pledge.cvc. nic.in". Affiliated colleges of the Universities may also be advised to observe Vigilance Awareness Week.

17th October, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that there is a need to initiate sustained mechanism to create awareness in order to reduce the adverse impact on environment and health due to the polluting technologies used in the unorganized sector for recycling e-waste. Higher Educational Institutions are requested to utilize the content appropriately to create awareness among the students about the health hazards of e-waste, best practices for environmentally safe recycling and the related rules/regulations in the country. 22nd October, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that Government of India observes 31st October all over the country as a special occasion to foster and reinforce our dedication to preserve and strengthen the unity, integrity and security of our nation, by celebrating it as Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) to commemorate the Birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbai Patel. Universities & Affiliated Colleges celebrate the occasion and carried out the following events (1) "Run for unity" with message of unified Bharat (2) "Rashtriya Ekta Diwas "(National Unity Day) Pledge taking ceremony (3) Competitions/Quizzes/Debates (4) lectures on National Unity, Integrity, Security related Topics.

▶ 2nd *November*, 2018

The commission issued appropriate instructions in the form of the Notification to all the Universities and other HEIs under the purview of the UGC on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates.

> 5th November, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities that UGC and MHRD have taken initiatives for improving Quality Research and Innovation in Higher Education. MHRD Innovation Cell (MIC) has been established by MHRD to foster the culture and innovation within Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). The Primary mandate of MIC is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students to work on new ideas. MIC has envisioned creation of "Institution's Innovation Council (IICs)" across selected HEIs. Universities take this initiative forward and register online before 20th November, 2018. The link to register in MHRD 'Institution Innovation Council (IIC) is http://www.facilities.aicte-india.org/IC/iic.html.

> 27th November, 2018

The Commission advised all the Universities to actively participate in the scheme "Impactful Policy Research in Social Science (IMPRESS)" for implementation upto 31.03.2021. Under the scheme, 1500 research projects will be awarded for 2 years to support the social Science research in the Higher Educational Institutions and to enable to guide policy making.

Universities are advised to encourage their faculty members to send proposals to ICSSR on the online portal: www.impress.icssr.res.in for consideration.

29th November, 2018

The Universities/Colleges are informed to arrange function/talks for the students in their Colleges/Institutes to generate awareness among the youth, Armed Forces Flag day observed every year on 7th December to Commemorate the supreme sacrifices made by our valiant Armed forces personnel and protecting the sovereignty and territorial integrity of our country and securing our lives against the threats of insurgency and terrorism as well as providing rescue and relief during natural calamities.

P 12th December, 2018

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges to celebrate 22nd December, 2018 the birth anniversary of Srinivasa Ramanujan as "National Mathematics day" by holding talks/Seminars to make students aware of the great contribution made by the legendary mathematician of India.

→ 13th December, 2018

The Commission issued public notice that all such Colleges/Institutions which intend to apply for inclusion under Section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1956 shall upload all the details of their college on their website before applying for the same. The College is required to update their website regularly. UGC may check the details provided by the College on their website anytime. The College which intends to apply for inclusion under section 2(f) and 12() of the UGC Act 1956 shall also submit their proposal through their affiliating University.

▶ 19th December, 2018

The Commission issued a public notice regarding "Smart India Hackathon (SIH) which is a nationwide initiative aimed at providing platform for our technology students to offer innovative solutions for pressing problems, thus inculcating a culture of product innovation and a mind set of problem solving.

> 1st January, 2019

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges to the newly launched ARPIT courses to encourage the faculty to participate in the ARPIT Courses available on SWAYAM platform, not only for keeping themselves abreast of latest developments in their disciplines but also for aiding their career progressions.

▶ 4th January, 2018

The Commission issued a public notice regarding invitation of proposals from HEIs for Recognition of courses/ Programmes to be offered in Online mode from the academic session 2019-20 & onwards.

> 28th January, 2019

The Commission informed all the Universities regarding the revised guidelines for enhancement of the Rates of Honorarium of Guest Faculty in Universities and Colleges consequent upon the implementation of the recommendations of the 7th Pay Commission.

> 11th Feb. 2019

The Commission informed all the Universities/Colleges that UNESCO has declared 21st February every year as International Mother Language Day to promote the dissemination of mother tongues and fuller awareness of linguistic and cultural tradition throughout the world and to inspire solidarity based on understanding tolerance and dialogue. Accordingly it was decided to celebrate MATRIIBHASHA DIWAS on 21.02.2019 to promote the use of mother tongue, with the following objectives:-

- Highlight the linguistic diversity of our country
- Encourage usage, not only of the respective mother tongue, but other Indian Languages as well
- To understand and draw attention to the diversity of culture, in India and the consequent forums of literature, craft, performing arts, scripts and other forms of creative expression.
- To encourage the learning of languages, other than one's own mother tongue.

▶ 19thFebruary, 2019

The Commission issued a public notice on UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2018 placed on the UGC Website calling for the observations & Suggestions of stakeholders.

P 22nd February, 2019

The Commission issued a letter to all the Universities in the context of reports being received through various media regarding the safety of students from Kashmir studying in various higher educational institutions, all Universities and Colleges affiliated to them are advised to ensure the safety and protection of the students on campus. They may keep a watch on the situation and seek support of law and order machinery in case of any untoward incident.

→ 22nd February, 2019

PUBLIC NOTICE -> UGC had constituted a Committee on Evaluation reforms, which is one of the five objectives of Quality Mandate, in order to improve the Quality of Higher Education. The Committee submitted its report considering the reforms that are much needed to ensure credibility and the outcomes of the assessment system. The Commission in its 538th meeting held on 21.01.2019, considered the Report and decided to solicit the views/suggestions from the stakeholders including teachers, students, controller of

examination, eminent academicians and public at large on Evaluation Reform Report for taking a considered view on the report .

P 26th February, 2019

The Commission requested all Universities/Colleges to issue appropriate advisory to all examining bodies under their administrative control to make a panel of scribe/reader/lab assistant at the District/Divisional/State Level in terms of clause V of the guidelines dated 29/08/2019. Till the panel of scribes is not formed, any of the Department who are conducting the exam, shall not conduct the exam in terms of guidelines dated 29/08/2018.

> 11th March, 2019

Public Notice-> Induction Training for all new recruited Teachers

The Commission issued a public notice that one of the mandate set by the University Grants Commission is the development and implementation of a high quality faculty Induction Programmme (FIP) for newly recruited faculty in higher educational institutions to improve their teaching and management skills, adjust to the culture of higher educational institutions and to understand their professional responsibilities better. The UGC has designed a frame work for faculty induction programme for transition of new teachers into the teaching profession, which aims to help new teachers.

> 15th March, 2019

Public Notice-> Programme prohibited in Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode

- 1. The UGC had notified UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 in the Gazette on 23.06.2017. Subsequently 1st Amendment was notified on 11th October, 2017, Second Amendment was notified on 6th February, 2018 and Third Amendment was notified on 6th September, 2018.
- 2. Provisions defined in clause (p) of Sub Regulation (2) of Part-I of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 regarding professional programmes:
 - "Professional programmes" means a program other than programmes in engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, nursing, architecture, physiotherapy and programmes not permitted to be offered in distance mode by any Statutory Councils or Regulatory Authorities to be conducted by the Higher Educational Institutions under Open and Distance Learning mode or Distance Education mode for the purpose of these regulations if any, should be considered only if the same are approved by the respective Statutory Councils or Regulatory Authorities.
- 3. It is for information that as per communication received from Secretary & Director General, Department of Agricultural Research & Education and Indian Council of Agriculture Research, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Government of India, and as decided by the Commission in its 538th Meeting held on 29th January, 2019, Agriculture degree programmes are prohibited in ODL mode from the Academic Session 2019-20 beginning July, 2019.
- 4. All the stakeholders are requested to take note of the same.

> 20th March, 2019

The Commission advised Universities to observe 5th International Day of Yoga on 21st June, 2019 by adopting the following activities in their esteemed University and Affiliated Colleges:

i. To promote Yoga among youth and invoke the sentiment of national pride in proliferating Yoga to the rest of the world.

- ii. To adopt yoga as a part of activities to encourage physical well being.
- iii. To focus on Common Yoga Protocol (CYP) which consists of a 45-minute sequence of relatively simple Yoga drills put together as protocol by some of the most renowned Yoga experts in country. It is designed to provide maximum physical and intellectual benefits to the maximum number of people. Copy of CYP is available at http://yoga.ayush.gov.in/common-yoga-protocol.
- iv. To keep the essential facilities open during summer vacations for Yoga Programme to be attended by teachers and students.

The Commission is empowered under Section 12(h) and under Section 12(i) of the UGC Act, 1956 to collect information on all such matters relating to University education in India and other countries as it thinks fit, and to require a University to furnish it with such information as may be needed relating to the financial position of the University or the studies in the various branches of learning undertaken in that University, together with all the rules and regulations relating to the standards of teaching and examination in that University with respect to each of such branches of learning.

In order to get timely and quality data in the education sector, which is having implications for human development, Ministry of Human Resource Development initiated an **All India Survey of Higher Education to prepare a sound data base on the largely diverse system of higher Education in the Country. The survey compiles and manages the Statistics submitted directly online by the respondent institutions.** Three Categories of Higher Education Institutions namely University, College, Stand Alone Institutions are identified and Surveyed.

A core team of officers from MHRD and UGC were involved in providing technical support, which includes preparation of Data Capture Formats(DCF), training in workshops, assisting National Informatics Centre (NIC) in software development etc. Nodal officers have also been appointed in each state to coordinate the survey work.

A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of National Informatics Centre (NIC) for collection and compilation of the data. All the Institutions need to register on the Portal for accessing the portal and uploading its data. The registration of the Institutions are approved by the appropriate level of officers at State / Central Level and in case of colleges by University nodal officers. The e-version of DCF expands according to the structure / size of the Institution. No investigator is sent to the Institution to collect Data. One unique feature is that the filled in DCF's are always available on the Portal, which can be accessed by the Institutions and higher Level authorities. All the institutions need to register on the portal for accessing the portal and uploading the data. Information and Statistics Bureau of UGC has stopped collecting data directly from the Universities/ Colleges, the compilation and estimation of Data at All India level is being made through portal http://aishe.gov.in

Every year the Survey Report brings out the official statistics on a large number of parameters based on data received from the Universities, colleges and Stand Alone Institutions of Higher Education in the Country.

AISHE 2018-19: The information in AISHE was collected from all institutions of higher education, broadly categorised in these categories namely University, College and Stand alone Institutions that are registered on AISHE PORTAL. Actual response was received from 944 (95.1%) ,36308(91%), 8354(77.9%) of these categories respectively. The data so collected are pooled for estimations by including the AISHE 2016-17 or 2017-18 Data of the institutions of Higher Education that did not upload data in 2018-19 survey. While pooling

it was ensured that the institutions are existing in 2018-19. After pooling, the percentage of data uploading for University, Colleges and Stand alone institutions was arrived at 962 (96.9%), 38179 (95.6%) and 9190 (85.7%) respectively for the year 2018-19.

At the time of independence, there were only 20 universities and 500 colleges in the country with 2.1 lakh students in the higher education system. As on 31.03.2019 there are 1047 Degree Awarding Universities / Institutions (Source AISHE portal and UGC 2(f) list of Universities) including IIMs, 41935 Colleges (Affiliated /Constituent / PG - Off Campus Centers / Recognized Institutions) (Source AISHE portal 2018-19) and Students Enrolment of 373.99 Lakhs in Higher Education. After independence, there has been a phenomenal growth in all these numbers. Now, it is a recorded fact that there is an increase of 52.35 times in the number of Degree awarding Universities/Institutes, 83.87 times increase in the number of colleges, and the students enrolment has gone up to over 178.09 times in the system of higher education as compared to the figures of Independence Year of India. The phenomenal increase in enrolment of this order would not have been possible without the growth in the number of institutions of higher learning, both universities and colleges in particular and increase in intake capacity of courses


2.1 Gross Enrolment Ratio in Higher Education (18-23Years) : Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Higher Education in india is 26.3% which is calculated for 18-23 Years of Age Group. GER for Male Population is 26.3% and for Females it is 26.4%.

Trends in Gross Enrolment Ratio(**GER**): Gross enrolment Ratio (GER) has increased from 21.5 in 2012-13 to 26.3 in 2018-19. The increase is more under SC Category which has increased from 16.0 in 2012-13 to 23 % in 2018-19. In case of ST Category, the GER has increased from 11.1% in 2012-13 to 17.2% in 2018-19. (Source AISHE Report 2018-19)

2.2(i)(a): Universities listed by UGC under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act 1956

During the year 2018-19, UGC listed 51 Central Universities , 397 State Public Universities , 334 State Private Universities, 3 Institution established under State legislature and 126 Institutions Deemed to be University. During 2018-19 17 State Public Universities (list 2.2(i)(a)), 40 State private Universities (List2.2(i) (b)), 3 Deemed Universities (list 2.2(i)(c)) and 3 Central Universities & one State Public University to Central University (list 2.2(i)(d)) were included in the UGC list of Universities. **During the year 2018-19 7 State Public Universities, 23 Deemed Universities and 2 State Private Universities (List2.2(i)(e)) were declared fit to receive central assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act,1956.**

Graph 2.2(i)(f): Type-wise Number of Universities as on 31.03.2019



Graph 2.2(i)(g) State-wise Number of Universities listed by UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGCAct as on 31.03.2019



2.2(ii)(c) Affiliated and Constituent Colleges

- The top 8 states in terms of highest number of colleges in India are Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh which have 28 and more Colleges per lakh population.
- 60.53% Colleges are located in Rural Area.
- Only 2.5% Colleges run Ph.D Programme and 34.9% Colleges run Post Graduate Level Programme.
- 77.8% Colleges are privately managed; 64.3% Private-unaided and 13.5% Private-aided. Andhra Pradesh & Uttar Pradesh have 88% Private-unaided colleges and Tamil Nadu has 87% Private-unaided colleges, whereas Assam has 16%.
- 16.3% of the Colleges are having enrolment less than 100 and only 4% colleges have enrolment more than 3000.
- College density, i.e. the number of colleges per lakh eligible population (population in the age group 18-23 years) varies from 7 in Bihar to 53 in Karnataka as compared to All India average of 28. (*Source AISHE REPORT 2018-19*)

Graph Graph 2.2(ii)(c) Management-wise Distribution of Colleges (Affiliated/Constituent): 2018-19



2.2(ii)(d) Colleges under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC act 1956

The UGC had notified Regulations for recognition of colleges under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. The colleges are brought under the purview of UGC in terms of these Regulations as and when the proposals are received from the colleges for inclusion under the section 2(f) and they are found fit for inclusion as per the provisions contained in the Regulations.

Apart from inclusion of colleges under Section 2 (f), the UGC includes the Colleges under Section 12B of its Act in terms of Rules framed under the Act. This makes the colleges eligible for central assistance from the Government of India or any organization receiving funds from the Central Government.


As on 31.03.2019, the total number of colleges recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 was 12070 (2315 Colleges under Section 2(f) and 9755 Colleges under Section 12B) as compared to 11515 in the previous year(2153 colleges under section 2 (f) and 9362 under section 12B).



The top 6 States in terms of highest total student enrolment are Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Rajasthan, and Karnataka, It is interesting to note these 6 States with highest student enrolment constitute nearly 54.23% of the total student enrolment in India. Rest of the 30 States (including UTs) have only 45.76% of the total student enrolment. So inevitably, the female students in these 6 States is almost 54.43% of the total female students enrolled and male students in these 6 States contributes to 54.05% of the total male students across India.



Students enrolment position in Higher Education (Regular & Distance) programme for the academic year 2018-19 reveals that majority of students in the higher education system had been enrolled for a variety of courses at the under-graduate level. Out of the total enrolment of 3,73,99,388 students, a vast majority of 2,98,29,075 students are enrolled in Under Graduate that is a sweeping 79.8%. On the other hand, second to Under Graduate, 10.8% students are enrolled in Post-Graduation which is approximately 40.42 lakh students. There is a small share of 7.2% students enrolled at Diploma level in India that amounts to around 26.99 lakh students and out of this majority of students are enrolled in Teacher Training, Nursing and Technical streams. However, a small share of 1.62 lakh and 2.24 lakh students are enrolled each at Certificate and PG Diploma levels, respectively, constituting approx. 0.44% and 0.60% of the total share at each level.

Gender Distribution : It may be seen that ratio of male is higher than female in almost every level, except M.Phil., Post Graduate and Certificate. Student enrolment at Under Graduate level has 51% male and 49% female. Diploma has a skewed distribution with 66.8% males and 33.2% females. Ph.D level has 56.18% male and 43.82% female. Integrated levels have 57.50% male and 42.50% female. PG Diploma student enrolment is 54.09% for male students and 45.91% for female students.

Programme-wise Enrolment(Based on Actual Response): As regards to Programme, out of total, 10 programmes having relatively higher enrolment were studied to see the student's concentration. Bachelor of Arts (B.A) has 93.49 lakh students enrolled in it which is the highest enrolment. The percentage of male is 46.96% and female is 53.04%. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc) has 46.80 lakh students enrolled in total and out of them 48.3% are male students and 51.7% are female students. There are 40.30 lakh students enrolled in B.Com and out of them 51.2% are male and 48.8% are female. B.Tech has 21.25 lakh enrolled students out of which 72% are male whereas the percentage of female is 28%. Bachelor of Engineering (B.E) has 16.45 lakh students enrolled out of which 71.14% students are from male category. Master of Arts (M.A) has 15.12 lakh total number of students enrolled with 61.78% female students. B.A (Hons) has 16.39 lakh students with 44.79% male and 55.21% female students. B.Ed. has total number of 12.23 lakh students and out of them 66.39% are female. MBA has total number of 5.88 lakh students with 58.33% male students. B.Sc. (Hons.) has total number of 5.83 lakh students with 55.90% male students. (Source AISHE Report 2018-19)

Discipline /Stream-wise Enrolment (Based on Actual Response): The highest number of students are enrolled in Arts courses. The total number of students enrolled in Arts courses are 93.99 lakh out of which 46.96% are male and 53.03% are female. Science is second major stream with 47.13 lakh students out of which 49% are male and 51% are female. Commerce is the third major stream with 40.3 lakh students enrolled. The share of male students enrolled in Commerce is 51.2% whereas female enrolment is 48.8%. Engineering and

Technology is the fourth major steam with 38.52 lakh students enrolment. The share of male students enrolled in Engineering and Technology is 71.1% where female enrolment is 28.9%. Medical Science stream shows a different picture with higher number of female students, where in out of total 11.96 lakh students, female students are 7.25 lakh. Management stream has 6.5 lakh students with 4.05 lakh male students. The students enrolled in Law stream are 3.98 lakh out of which 2.64 lakh are males. (AISHE Report 2018-19)



2.3(i)(d) Enrolment in Distance Mode

Distance education has become a useful mode of obtaining degrees for a large number of students who are staying in far off and remote areas and for whom accessing universities on regular basis is still a dream.

Distance enrolment constitute 10.62% of the total enrolment in higher education, of which 44.12% are female students.

Looking at the State-wise variation, out of the total reported enrolled students pursuing studies through distance education, 6 States are providing education to around 59.04% of the students. These States are Delhi 16.2%, Maharashtra 16.1%, Tamil Nadu 10.2%, Kerala 6.2%, Uttar Pradesh 5.2% and West Bengal 5.1%.

Graph 2.3(i)(d): Statewise Total Students Enrolment: Distance Education Programmes: 2018-19







The total number of foreign national students enrolled in India is 47, 427. The foreign students come from 164 different countries from all across the globe. Highest share of students come from the neighboring countries of which Nepal contributes 26.8% of the total, followed by Afghanistan 9.8%, Bangladesh 4.38%, Sudan 4.02%, Bhutan 3.82%, Nigeria 3.4%, United States of America 3.2%, Yemen 3.2%, Sri Lanka 2.64%, Iran 2.38% of the foreign students. Among major contributors, Nepal has more male students than female. On the other hand, Sudan, 87.2%, Yemen 90.9% and Afghanistan 87.7% have a considerably higher number of male students. Although maximum number of foreign students comes from Nepal, the maximum number (295) enrolled in Ph.D. are from Ethiopia followed by Yemen (149). Also there are 1518 of Foreign Students form United States of which 53.3% ar female students.

The highest number of foreign students are enrolled in Under graduate courses, that is, 73.4% of the total foreign students, followed by post Graduate with about 16.15% enrolment. Enrolment in rest of the levels constitutes 10.4%. Foreign male students are higher in almost all the levels.

looking at the State-wise distribution, Karnataka has the highest number of students coming from foreign countries which is 10023. Apart from Karnataka, Maharashtra (5003), Punjab (4533), U.P. (4514), Tamil Nadu (4101), Haryana (2872), Delhi (2141), Gujarat(2068) and Telangana (2020) reflects more than 2,000 foreign students.

There are 15 Programmes which have more than 1000 foreign students and accounts for more than 78.2% of the foreign Students. On the top, we have B.Tech with 8861 students with 85% male students, followed by B.B.A having 3354 students with 71.1% male students, B.Sc. having 3320 students with 62.9% male enrolment, B.A. having 2226 students with 49.9% female enrolment. B.E. has 2576 students with 85.3% male students. B.Pharma has total number of 2498 students with 69.45% male students. There are 1873 foreign students enrolled in B.C.A., out of which 83.02% are male students. M.B.B.S. has total number of 1429 students with 58.92% female students (Nursing) has total number of 1174 students out of which 92.16% are female. Ph.D has 1560 students out of which 76.6% are male. MBA has total number of 1574 students with 67.34% male students. At the Post Graduation level, 1486 students are enrolled at M.A. level with 67.36% male students. M.Sc. has reported enrolment of 1391 students with 71.3% of male students. Bachelor of Dental Surgery (B.D.S.) has total number of 738 students with 59.5% female students,. Diploma programme has reported the enrolment of 2026 foreign students with 87.2% male students. BBM has total number of 338 students with 67.15% male students.







As per AISHE 2018-19, the total Number of Teachers in Higher Education are 14,16,299 out of which about 57.8% are Male Teachers and 42.2% are Female Teachers. At All India Level there are merely 73 Female Teachers per 100 Male Teachers. The Lowest gender proportion is recorded in Bihar where female to male teachers ratio is 1:4 which in percentage terms is 78.97% for male and only 21.03% for female teachers. Jharkhand comes close second with 69.8% male teachers and 30.2% female teachers. Uttar Pradesh has 32.3% female teachers of the total teachers in the state. A few states like Kerala, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Meghalya, Nagaland, Delhi and Goa on the other hand have more female teachers than male teacher.



Graph 2.5(a): State wise Number of Teachers: Higher Eduation: 2018-19



3.1 Assistance to Universities

UGC Assist each eligible University for the overall development covering different aspects namely, enhancing access, ensuring equity, imparting relevant education, improving quality and excellence, making their University administration more effective, providing more faculty improvement Programmes, enhancing facilities for students, augmenting research facilities and other plans of the University.

3.2 Central Universities:

University Grants Commission (UGC) provides financial assistance to Central Universities under various schemes/programmes. At present, there are 51 Central Universities out of which 9 Universities namely (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai (iv) Nalanda University, Rajgir, Dist. Nalanda, Bihar (v) South Asian University, New Delhi (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh (vii) Rani Lakshmi Bai Central Agricultural University, NH-75, Near Pahuj Dam, Gwalior Road, Jhansi (Uttar Pradesh) – 284 003 (viii) Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa, Samastipur – 848 003 and (ix) National Sports University, Koutruk, Manipur – 795 146 are not funded by the UGC and therefore, no grant being released to these nine Central Universities. List of the Central Universities is given in Table 2.2(i)(g)(i) of Chapter 2.

There are 42 Central Universities being provided financial assistance by UGC under various schemes.

3.2 (i): Grants to central universities under block grant

From the financial year 2017-18, Plan – Non-Plan classification of the Budget has been discontinued. As informed by MHRD that the expenditure on salary and retirement benefits etc will be met out of funds allocated under Object Head 36 in respect of the Institutions/autonomous bodies and the expenditure on (a) Payment of pension and pensionary benefits; (b) Salary and TA/DA etc. paid to consultants appointed under a scheme and (c) Salary / wages paid to contractual staff appointed under a scheme etc. shall be met out of funds provided under object head 31 – Grants in aid – General.



3.2(ii)(b) Coaching scheme for residential coaching academies for Minorities / SC / ST and women

As the scheme of UGC for remedial coaching and entry into services have not created the desired impact, 'Residential Coaching Academies' for Minorities/SCs/STs and Women was set up at Aligarh Muslim University, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow and Jamia Millia Islamia.

The objective of the Residential Academy for Minorities/ SC/ST and Women is to provide equal opportunities to all section of society for equitable growth which entails affirmative action for Minorities, SC/STs and women by providing Coaching programme to the student, with Hostel facilities with free of cost/nominal fee, without tuition fee of the above category for entry into Central/State Government, private sector jobs and entry into IITs/Medical colleges.

The financial assistance for setting up Residential Coaching Academies under this scheme so far is given as under:-

3.2(ii)(c) Special honorarium of Rs. 15000/- p.m. to the teachers who are fellows of at least two of the four specified science academics.

UGC has initiated the scheme for special honorarium of Rs.15,000/- p.m. to the teachers who have been awarded Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar award or who are fellow of at least two of the following four Academies identified by the UGC:

- 1. National Academy of Science, Allahabad
- 2. Indian Science Academy, Bangalore
- 3. Indian National Science Academy, New Delhi
- 4. Indian National Science Academy of Engg., New Delhi

A teacher can avail only one of the honorarium and not more than one i.e. either from CSIR as Bhatnagar Awardee or UGC Scheme.

Total amount of **Rs.14.59 lakh** has been released to Two Central Universities i.e (i) Pondicherry University (Rs.2.25 lakhs) and (ii) Banaras Hindu University (Rs.12.34 Lakhs) during 2018-2019 under the Scheme.

3.2(ii)(d) Establishment of Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers:-

UGC is providing funds to three central universities namely Aligarh Muslim University, Maulana Azad National Urdu University and Jamia Millia Islamia for establishment of Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers.

3.2(ii)(e) Establishment of Internal Quality Assurance Cell in Central Universities

UGC is providing funds to all Universities which are under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act will be eligible to receive the financial support for establishing and strengthening of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell in them.

As per UGC guidelines, in order to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of the IQAC during the XII plan, the UGC is providing financial assistance of Rs.5.00 lakhs (to be released in two instalments of 90% and 10% of the total assistance) to each University. The expenditure can be incurred on following items:-

3.2(ii)(f) Construction of Women's Hostel in Universities

3.2(ii)(g) Establishment of Centres for Endangered Languages

During the XII Plan, UGC has decided to initiate to establish the Centres for Indigenous Languages in Central Universities for preservation and promotion of endangered Languages with the following Objectives of the Scheme:

- 1. To undertake inter departmental and inter disciplinary research related to endangered languages.
- 2. To undertake fieldwork, research, analysis, archiving and documentation of smaller endangered languages using stat-of-the art speech and language technologies, in formats that are universally acceptable viz. Digitized textual, audio and video formats.
- 3. To produce and publish monographs, grammars, grammatical sketches, dictionaries and lexicon, ethnolinguistic and theoretical descriptions, collection of oral and folk literature and scholarly books on endangered languages.
- 4. To produce language and dialect atlases with special reference to minority and endangered languages.
- 5. To organise workshops and seminars aimed towards promoting advanced research related to endangered languages.
- 6. To train teachers and students from other departments/centres in Field Linguistics, Lexicography and in techniques for data management and documentation. Field linguistics should constitute an indispensable part of the Centre.
- 7. The Centre should serve the indigenous and endangered language communities by making accessible the products of the research of the Centre, i.e. digital and analogue archives of linguistic data, language teaching material, and language artefacts.
- 8. To promote and foster various domains of endangered languages so as to ensure minority/endangered language communities in maintaining and preserving language vitality, including the development of orthographical resources like scripts, book of letters and primers.
- 9. To digitize date collected in the course of the research in the centre and make it available to public by internet.
- 10. In the initial phases this Centre shall and may draw resources (such as manpower, labs, books, students etc.) from other centres of languages, linguistics, folklore, anthropology, and literature in the University but eventually should conceive of forming an independent centres purely devoted to the issues of endangered and indigenous languages.

The UGC has conveyed its approval for Establishment of Centre for Endangered Languages to the following 9 Central Universities as under:-

- 1. Tezpur University, Assam
- 2. Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh
- 3. Sikkim University, Sikkim
- 4. Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, M.P.

- 5. Central University of Jharkhand, Jharkhand
- 6. Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya, Chhattisgarh
- 7. Central University of Karnataka, Karnataka
- 8. Central University of Kerala, Kerala
- 9. Visva Bharati, West Bengal

During the financial year 2018-19, Total Grant of **Rs.130.51 lakh** was released to the Central University of Jharkhand (Rs.13.51 Lakhs), Guru Ghasidas Viswavidayalaya (Rs.27.00 Lakhs) and Sikkim University (Rs.90.00 lakh) for Establishment of Centre for Endangered Languages.

3.2(ii)(h): Strengthening/Setting up of Schools of Education in Central Universities

The UGC has been impressing upon the Central Universities and other Universities to establish Department of Education and conduct programmes for preparation of school on teachers and Teacher Educators. In the wake of the Right to Education Act, 2009 and the various recommendations contained in the report of Justice Verma Commission on Teacher Education (2012), the Government of India requested the UGC to take urgent steps for expanding institutional support of teacher education in the University system and also to bring various qualitative improvements thereof. One such aspect in entailing such initiative was to establish School of Education in Central Universities of the country. With this objective, the UGC sent a communication to all the Central Universities for establishing Schools of Education within them and take various activities relating to teacher education other than pre-service teacher education. These included curriculum research, policy and educational development, learning and pedagogic studies, assessment and evaluation, professional development of teacher educators, etc. A related issue on which Central Universities were requested to work was for reforming the curricula of the various teacher education programmes in the light of the recommendations of the National Curriculum Framework on Teacher Education (NCTE), 2009.

The UGC has sanctioned for expansion and strengthening of teacher education in Central Universities for which approval was given for various teaching and non-teaching posts. The UGC has also invigorated the initiative for reforms in the curricula of the teacher education courses, requesting academic staff colleges to provide refresher and orientation training programmes for teacher educators, to strengthen post-graduate programmes in the teacher education departments and to run integrated teacher education programmes.

As a result of the above efforts, at present 39 Central Universities have Schools/Departments of Education offering various pre-service and other teacher education programmes and they have also intensified their efforts for providing other related programmes of teacher education.

3.2(ii)(i) Establishment of Yoga department in Central Universities

The value of yoga as a means of promoting health, social harmony and discipline is well recognized. It is also acknowledged that for the development of the youth into good citizens who are knowledgeable, confident, balanced and possess strong character and leadership attributes, they require to be exposed to art and science of yoga in its various manifestations. Yoga is our cultural heritage and it promotes physical and mental health.

There is also a growing movement in main stream research on true biological effects of yoga on human health and behaviour. It is imperative that the Indian Universities also engage themselves in strengthening scientific evidence of the positive effects of Yoga and Meditation on human health. In order to pursue education and practice in Yoga, it is proposed to establish Centers/Departments of Yoga in the Public Funded Universities.

1. Objectives

- (i) The purpose of the studies in Yoga is to impart in depth knowledge of traditional yoga with secular and scientific orientation.
- (ii) To institute regular courses at under-graduate and post-graduate levels in various aspects of yoga.
- (iii) To develop a hierarchy of courses in yoga at certificate, diploma and degree levels.
- (iv) To prepare qualified resource persons to teach yoga in schools, colleges, Universities, corporate organizations, central services and to the interested public of all age groups with secular and scientific orientation.
- (v) To give in-depth knowledge of teaching methods in Yoga and application of Yoga in various fields.
- (vi) To provide the basic understanding of applied human anatomy and physiology, Indian Philosophy, Psychology, alternative therapies such as Ayurveda, Naturopathy, Acupressure and in depth knowledge of classical Yoga texts and Yoga therapy relevant to the theory and practice of yoga to help them gain the theoretical and scientific perspective on yoga.
- (vii) To promote Research in Yoga
- (viii) To enable the Post-Graduates students of Yoga to setup their own Yoga centers as self employment and promote health consciousness among the public.

3.2(ii)(j) Expansion of Higher Education Financing Agency to fund Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education (RISE) by 2022

HEFA has been set up on 31st May 2017 by the Central Government as a non-profit, Non Banking Financing Company (NBFC) for mobilising extra-budgetary resources for building crucial infrastructure in the higher educational institutions under Central Government..

Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education (RISE) by 2022

The RISE by 2022 is an attempt to translate the objectives into action plan by making available resources from the market. In order to accommodate the needs of all institutions, especially the institutions set up after 2014, **Central Universities**, and those with limited internal resources, and the school education/health education infrastructure like AIIMSs, Kendriya Vidyalayas, the Government has approved the following five windows for financing under HEFA and the modalities of repaying the Principal portion of the fund (interest continues to be serviced through Government grants in all these cases):

i. Newly established Institutions (started after 2014) and other institutions of MHRD with little scope for fee revision/internal resource generation: Grant would be provided for complete servicing of loan including the Principal and interest.

- ii. Other educational institutions and grant-in-aid institutions of Ministry of Health: All the newly set up AIIMSs and other health institutions, the Kendriya Vidyalayas / Navodaya Vidyalayas would be funded and the Department/Ministry concerned will give a commitment for complete servicing of the principal and interest by ensuring adequate grants to the institution.
- iii. Central Universities started prior to 2014: Repay 10% of the principal portion from internal resources, and receive grant for the balance of the Principal portion.
- iv. Technical Institutions started between 2008 and 2014: Repay 25% of the principal portion from internal resources, and receive grant for the balance of the Principal portion.
- v. Technical Institutions more than 10 years old: Repay the whole Principal Portion from the internally generated budgetary resources

There would be a negative list of projects included in the credit policy of HEFA so that only essential projects are undertaken for financing. Each proposal shall include inter alia, steps to enhance existing capacity utilisation, revenue generation strategies, revenue generation from the assets created and the escrow mechanism. All projects would be monitored through a project monitoring system with a dashboard for monitoring by the stakeholder Ministries/Organisations including NITI.

3.2(ii)(k) Mandatory Accreditation of NAAC by each Central University

Assessment and accreditation in the higher education, through transparent and informed external review process, are the effective means of quality assurance in higher education to provide a common frame of reference for students and others to obtain credible information on academic quality across institutions thereby assisting student mobility across institutions, domestic as well as international.

Assessment is undertaken prior to the commencement of academic programmes in an Institution. Accreditation is undertaken after an institution attains certain years of existence (6yrs)/ passing out of specified number of batches (two batches), whichever is earlier.

The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres or any other units therein, by whatever name called, shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its schemes without having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December, 2015.

Out of 40 Central Universities, 36 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation. 2 Central Universities have obtained the accreditation earlier but accreditation period is over Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya and Mizoram University have applied for reaccreditation. 1 Central University of Jharkhand has applied first time for accreditation. 1 newly established Central University (i.e. Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari) is not eligible for accreditation.

3.2(ii)(l) Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission and appointment in Central Educational Institutions.

MHRD / Govt. of India have implemented the Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions in accordance with One Hundred and Third Amendment of Constitution of India, for its immediate implementation and compliance.

The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM No.20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January, 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and shall be subject to the following:

- a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in Central Educational Institutions, (as defined in clause (d) of section (2) of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006) from the academic year 2019-20 onwards.
- b) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006), increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this O.M.
- c) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the appropriate authority is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not reduce the number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC categories.
- d) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the institution as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March, 2019.

Accordingly, UGC has requested all Central Educational Institutions to implement the Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions.

Similarly, the Govt. of India, DoPT vide its O.M. No. 36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res.) dated 19th January, 2019 has notified 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in central government posts and services and would be effective in respect of all Direct Recruitment vacancies to be notified on or after 01.02.2019. In pursuance of the decision of Govt. of India, UGC vide its letter No.F.25-4/2007 (CU) Pt. file dated 20th March, 2018 extended the above decision in all Central Universities.

3.2(ii)(m) Graded Autonomy to Promote and Institutionalize Excellence in Higher Education

Recognising the need to create an enabling environment whereby Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) can become institutions of global excellence, autonomy is pivotal to promote and institutionalize excellence in higher education. The regulatory framework has recognized this need and towards this direction, the UGC (Categorisation of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 have been notified on 12th February, 2018. These regulations are aimed to provide autonomy to the HEIs based on quality benchmarks.

Under these Regulations, Universities have NAAC score of 3.51 or above or those who have received a corresponding score/grade from a reputed accreditation agency empanelled by the UGC or have been ranked among top 500 of reputed would rankings are placed in Category – I. Universities having NAAC score of 3.26 and above, upto 3.50 or have received a corresponding accreditation grade/score from a reputed Accreditation Agency empanelled by the UGC are placed in **Category – II**. The Universities which do not come under the above two categories are placed in **Category-III**.

3.3 State Public Universities

The UGC provides General Development Assistance to all eligible State Universities which are recognized under Section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956, within the frame work of norms and broad outlays specified by the UGC in order to facilitate the procurement of such infrastructural facilities which are not normally made available to them from the state government or other bodies supporting them. Assistance is given for Buildings, Staff, Books & Journals, Equipment & other items etc.

- General Development Assistance to universities has been provided in the form of Plan Block Grants to State Universities which include construction/renovation of buildings (including renovation of heritage buildings), campus development, staff, books & journals, laboratory equipment and infrastructure, annual maintenance contract, innovative research activities, university industry linkages, extension activities, cultural activities, development of ICT, health care, student amenities including hostels, Travel Grant/ Conferences/Seminars/Symposia /Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor/ Visiting Fellow and Establishment of Career & Counseling Cell, Day Care Centers, Basic Facilities for Women and Faculty Development Programme, etc.
- The extension of time limit for utilisation of grant of existing UGC schemes will continue beyond 31.03.2019 and upto 31.03.2020 against the allocation under GDA during XII plan period. However, the construction work of the building projects should have been started before 31.03.2017.
- The scheme called Encore which was initiated during XI Plan now is now part of XII Plan General Development Assistance. No Separate funds have been provided for this scheme.
- The erstwhile Scheme of XI Plan i.e. Human Rights and Duties Education was also covered under XII Plan General Development assistance Scheme. No separate funding has been provided for this scheme.
- Appointment/Honorarium of guest part time teachers was also a part of XII Plan General Development Assistance scheme.
- Establishment of Rajiv Gandhi Chairs in Universities continued during XII Plan, under the scheme of
 establishment of Chairs in Universities. In addition, the UGC has introduced the following new Chairs
 in Universities during XII Plan (2012-17) in various field in the name of illustrious persons, Nobel
 Laureates and persons of eminence in the areas/fields of their contribution. The following chair are

3.4(i) Development Grant

Development grant is given for the development of 10 identified institutions deemed to be universities. The objective of development assistance is not only to improve and consolidate the existing infrastructure in the university but also to develop excellence in certain identified areas. During the year 2018-19, General Development Assistance to universities is being provided in the form of Plan Block Grant. For Universities, it will include Renovation of Building (including renovation of Heritage Buildings). Campus Development, Staff, Books & Journals, Laboratory, Equipment and Infrastructure, Annual Maintenance Contract, Innovative Research Activities, University Industry Linkages, Extension Activities, Cultural Activities, Development of ICT, Health Care, Student Amenities including hostels, Non-NET Fellowship to Students, Travel Grant, Conference/ Seminars/ Symposia/ Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor/ Visiting Fellow and Establishment of Career & Counseling Cell, Day Care Centre, Facilities for Women and Faculty Development Programme etc.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell and construction of Women Hostel are also being implemented as independent schemes in all identified institutions deemed to be universities.



3.4(ii) Maintenance Grant


The UGC is providing Maintenance Grant to 10 identified institutions deemed to be universities. Out of 10 identified institutions deemed to be universities are receiving 100% Non-Plan grant towards salaries and allowances, retirement benefits and non-salary. The components under non-salary are: consumables, electricity charges, water charges, property tax, house tax, contingencies, maintenance/repairs of buildings and other expenses. Budget estimates / revised budget estimates of 8 identified institutions deemed to be universities are decided on the basis of discussion with the Registrar and the Finance Officer of these Universities.

The remaining 2 identified institutions deemed to be universities viz. Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi and Sri Chandrasekhendra Saraswathi Vishwa Mahavidyalaya, Kanchipuram are receiving Fixed Maintenance grant of Rs.800.00 lakh and Rs.7.00 lakh per annum respectively.

An amount of Rs. **41483.45** lakh has been released during the year 2018-19 under the Non-Plan grant detail is as under:-

3.5 State Private Universities

Private Universities are established by the Acts of State Legislatures concerned. Name of a Private University is included in the UGC list of Universities established as per section 2(f) of the UGC Act,1956 maintained by UGC on receipt of the Act of establishment and Notification issued by the State Government concerned. List of State Private Universities is given in Chapter 2 Table 2.2(i)(g)(iii)

As on 30.03.2019, there are 334 State Private Universities in the country. The growth in the number of Private Universities established during the last ten year is unprecedented. Out of the total 334 State Private Universities, 267 Private Universities have been established after the year 2010.

UGC Regulations for Private Universities

- Private Universities are regulated by the UGC through UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003.
- These Regulations were notified by the UGC for safeguarding the interests of the student community with adequate emphasis on the quality of education and to avoid commercialization of higher education.

Inspection of Private Universities by UGC

These Private Universities are inspected by the UGC with the help of Expert Committees (including representatives from the concerned Statutory Council(s) to assess the fulfillment of minimum criteria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural facilities, financial viability, etc. as laid down by the UGC and other concerned Statutory Bodies.

Follow up action by UGC on the reports submitted by Expert Committees

The reports of the Expert Committee are sent to the University for compliance which are placed before the Committee Constituted by the Commission in its 497th meeting held on 10.01.2014 for approval and subsequently brought before the Commission for reporting.

4.1 Development of Colleges

Colleges which are responsible in a major way for undergraduate education and to a great extent even for postgraduate education, is an important factor in Indian higher education from the point of view of maintenance of proper standards, ensuring optimum utilization of facilities, promoting innovation and change, linking education to emerging career patterns, access, equalization of educational opportunities for the weaker sections of society, particularly the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and those belonging to the educationally backward areas. The focus of development assistance to the colleges is on supporting the teaching-learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure like library, laboratory, connectivity, etc. However, the emphasis is on the expansion and consolidation of facilities in the existing institutions, improvement of standards through modernization, rationalization and diversification of under-graduate courses especially to relate them to career opportunities.

4.2 Colleges Recognized by UGC for Financial Assistance

As on 31st March, 2019 there are nearly 40489 (Affiliated / Constituent) colleges in the country, out of them, only 12070 colleges are recognized by the UGC under section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Out of the recognized colleges 9755 colleges are eligible to receive Central Assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

4.3 Grants to colleges by the Regional offices/NRCB

The UGC decentralized its functioning by opening seven Regional Offices in the country since 1994 in a phased manner for easy access and speedy release of grants and implementation of various schemes/ programmes relating to colleges. Later on, one of the UGC Regional Offices viz. Northern Regional Office (NRO), Ghaziabad was converted into "Northern Region Colleges Bureau" and shifted from Ghaziabad to Delhi at 35, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi w. e. f. 25.09.2001. Eligibility Criteria: The UGC provides grant to the eligible colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 for the above mentioned schemes. The Self Financing Colleges having 12B Status are eligible only for Teacher/Student centric schemes.

4.3 (a): General Development Assistance to Colleges

The UGC provides assistance to colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 for the development of Undergraduate/Postgraduate Colleges which fulfil the eligibility conditions as prescribed in the XII Plan guidelines. Under the scheme, financial assistance is provided to the colleges for strengthening basic infrastructure and meet their basic needs like books and journals (including Book Banks), scientific equipments, campus development, teaching aids which are needed for proper instruction, extension/renovation of existing building and construction of new buildings, extension activities, facilities for women etc.

Released (Rs. in Crore) and Number of Beneficiary Colleges




The Colleges which come within the purview of the UGC and are fit to receive central assistance under Section 12(B) of the UGC Act, are eligible to receive financial assistance under this scheme.



4.4 (b) Autonomous Colleges:-

The objective of the Scheme of Autonomous Colleges is to improve the quality of undergraduate education by de-linking colleges from the affiliating structure. College with more than ten years of existence and having NAAC grade B and above was assisted under the programme and provide assistance as per following ceiling:-

- 1. Rs. 9 lakh for single faculty under graduate college.
- 2. Rs. 15 lakh for multi faculty undergraduate college.
- 3. Rs. 10 lakh for single faculty both undergraduate and postgraduate level.
- 4. Rs. 20 lakh for multi faculty both undergraduate and postgraduate level.

An additional grant of Rs. 1.00 lakh to Rs 2.00 lakh is given for introduction of NCC as an elective subject with credit points from the academic year 2013-2014.

An expert committee visits the college and recommend to the UGC for the granting of autonomy. Autonomy will be granted for six years with the provision to extend further.



4.4 (c) Minor Research Project for Teachers of Colleges:-



Teachers of eligible colleges can apply under the scheme of Minor Research Projects and get financial assistance up to Rs.3.00 lakh for Humanities & Social Sciences and up to Rs.5.00 lakh for Sciences including Engineering & Technology, Medical, Pharmacy, Agriculture etc. During the year 2015-16 the UGC has invited the proposal under the scheme through online mode only.

4.4 (d) Seminar/Symposia/Conference for Colleges:-



4.4 (e) Faculty Development Programme for Colleges:-


UGC provides salary to the substitute the teacher posted in the place of the teacher fellow, in addition to an amount of Rs. 15000 p.a. as contingency to the teacher fellow. The selection committee, constituted at the level of college, scrutinizes the applications in accordance with the provisions of the guidelines and recommend candidates to UGC.

4.4 (f) Internal Quality Assurance Cell for Colleges:-

To monitor standards of the higher educational institutions the UGC has established the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as an autonomous body, under Section 12(ccc) of its Act in September, 1994. Recognizing the importance of such institutional internal quality system the UGC has taken a policy decision to direct all colleges to establish IQAC for which it has decided to provide Rs. 3.00 lakhs as seed money to each college to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of IQAC. The scheme was introduced for colleges during 2014-15.


All Colleges which are under section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act will be eligible to receive the financial support for establishing and strengthening of the IQACs in them. It shall be mandatory for every college to get accredited by the Accreditation Agency, after passing out of two batches or six years, whichever is earlier.

4.4 (g) Development of Sports Infrastructure & Equipment in Colleges:-

The objective of the Scheme is to create and foster amongst the students of Colleges a spirit of healthy participation and cooperative sharing of achievements in games with a capacity to face and effectively deal with challenging situations with courage and determination.

Keeping the above objective in view, the scheme is designed to offer.

(a) Financial support for the development of new or existing outdoor/indoor infrastructure for ensuring greater participation of students in games. While the students would get an opportunity to avail

- themselves of such sports facilities, this scheme specially aims to serve the first generation students both in urban and rural areas.
- (b) Students, depending upon their level of 'attainment' in a particular sport, may be offered opportunities to participate in more advanced level of sport in the same or related area through the availability of better equipment and infrastructure.
- (c) Infrastructure, where already available is intended to be improved/strengthened. Colleges will be assisted in creation of such standard infrastructural and non-expendable equipment facilities so as to facilitate the conduct of such activities for their students.

There are three different stages of financial assistance the ceiling of these stages are as under:-


- (a) Stage $I: Rs. 12.00 \ lakh + Rs. 10.00 \ lakh for equipment = Rs. 22.00 \ lakh.$
- (b) Stage $I: Rs. 170.00 \ lakh + Rs. 10.00 \ lakh$ for equipment $= Rs. 180.00 \ lakh$.
- (c) Stage $I: Rs. 240.00 \ lakh + Rs. 10.00 \ lakh$ for equipment $= Rs. 250.00 \ lakh$.


The ceiling of the assistance under this programme to a college is Rs. 5.00 crore during the 12th Five year plan.

4.4 (i) Visually Challenged Teachers:-


The Scheme has been formulated to help visually challenged permanent teachers to pursue teaching and research with the help of a Reader and by using teaching and learning aids by way of providing Reader's Allowance and funds for purchase of Braille books, recorded materials etc. The objective of the scheme is to provide facility to help visually challenged permanent teachers to achieve self- dependence by using various aids for teaching, learning and research. Allowance to visually challenged permanent teachers will be Rs. 36000/- p.a.

Graph 4.4(i): Scheme of Visually Challenged Teachers during 1.04.2012 to 31.03.2019



4.5 Grants to Delhi Colleges and Constituent Colleges of Banaras Hindu University

The UGC has been providing financial assistance to 53 Colleges & 12 Hostels affiliated to Delhi University and 4 Colleges admitted to the privileges of BHU under Revenue and 64 Colleges affiliated to Delhi University under Capital (53 College + 11 College of Delhi Administration). UGC also provides grant to Colleges & Medical Colleges affiliated to University of Delhi for Seminar/Conference/Workshop at National/International/ State level.

4.5(a) Revenue Grant

Out of 53 Colleges, UGC provides 95% of the maintenance grant to 36 Colleges and 100% to 17 Colleges (8 Evening College + 9 University Maintained College). Among 36 Colleges getting 95% of maintenance grant from UGC, 16 Colleges are managed by Delhi Administration and 20 Colleges are managed by their respective Trusts/Society.

These 53 Colleges & 12 Hostels affiliated to Delhi University meet salary, pension and non-salary expenditure out of the Maintenance Grants received from UGC. To determine the budget of each College, annual meetings are held with the Principals of the Colleges.

The University Grants Commission in pursuit of excellence in teaching and research in the Institutions of higher education has been providing substantial support to selected universities and colleges through various schemes like University with Potential for Excellence (UPE), Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE), Centre with Potential for Excellence In Particular Area (CPEPA) and New Scheme with a view to enable them to reach the world class level and serve as benchmark for other institutions in the country.

5.1(i) University with Potential for Excellence (UPE)

The University Grants Commission introduced this scheme during the IX Plan period to identify few universities which had potential to achieve excellence in teaching and research activities. So far 16 universities have been selected. Tenure of 15 Universities has already been over and extension was granted upto 31.03.2019 to utilize the unspent grant alongwith interest earned on UPE grant on already approved budget heads. The details of existing 16 (sixteen) UPE Universities and grant paid to them so far is given below:-

5.1(ii) Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area (CPEPA)

The University Grants Commission introduced the scheme "Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas (CPEPA) during IX Plan period in order to promote quality and excellence and inter-disciplinary approach in teaching and research activities. The broad objective of this scheme is to encourage and facilitate the chosen departments at the selected universities to work together by associating their faculty members to cooperate and collaborate in their programmes and activities on a regular basis, by cutting across departmental and/or discipline barriers in the emerging, frontier or cutting edge subject areas of regional, national and/or international importance.

As on date 29 Centres from different universities are being supported under this scheme. The details are given here under:

Out of 29 Centres tenure of 20 Centres has already been completed its tenure and extension was granted upto 31.03.2019 to utilize the unspent grant alongwith interest earned on CPEPA grant on already approved budget heads. During the year 2018-2019, an amount of Rs.2.45 crore (Rupees two crore forty five lakhs only) was released to the Centres under the scheme CPEPA. The scheme of CPEPA was discontinued.


5.1(iii) Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)

The UGC has introduced the CPE Scheme during the **X Plan.** Under this scheme, the colleges are financially supported to improve their academic infrastructure, adopt innovations in teaching, learning and evaluation and to introduce a flexible approach in the selection of courses at the degree level. A CPE college acts as a role

model for other colleges in their area of operation. The objective of the scheme is to help selected colleges to achieve excellence mainly in teaching activity and initiate a research culture in such Colleges.

At present 295 Colleges are having the "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE) status and 19 Colleges are having the "College of Excellence" (CE) status. As on date total numbers of colleges are 314 under the scheme CPE.

During 2018-2019, an amount of Rs.14.61 Crore (Rupees fourteen crore sixty one lakh) released to the Colleges under this scheme CPE.

5.2 Special Assistance Programme (SAP)

The SAP scheme was initiated in 1963 by University Grants Commission keeping in view the recommendations of the Education Commission to facilitate the selected number of University Departments having some potential in research and teaching. The programme is intended to encourage the pursuit of excellence and teamwork in advanced teaching and research to accelerate the realization of international standards in specific fields. The first such programme was initially started as the 'Centre of Advanced Study (CAS)' in 1963. Some of these Centres also received recognition and financial support from UNDP/UNESCO. The 'Department of Special Assistance (DSA)' and 'Departmental Research Support (DRS)' programmes were started in the Departments during 1972 and 1977 respectively to create feeder departments for CAS.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME (SAP) LEVELS

- 1. Departmental Research Support (DRS)
- 2. Department of Special Assistance (DSA)
- 3. Centre of Advanced Study (CAS)

The tenure of the Special Assistance Programme (SAP) will be for a period of **FIVE YEARS** for a particular phase. The UGC will not provide financial assistance for more than three terms (5 years each) at the same level of DRS and DSA. If the performance of the department improves significantly at the level of DRS/DSA, department shall be considered to be upgraded to the next level of DSA/CAS as the case may be.

The maximum limit of financial assistance for a period of five years at different level of the programme will be as under:



5.3 Autonomous Colleges

The scheme of Autonomous Colleges was formulated by the UGC in the Fourth five year plan (1969-73), in pursuance of the recommendations of the education Commission of 1964-66, with a view to provide academic freedom for potential colleges, specially designing their curriculum, prescribing own courses of study and conducting examinations. The intention was to provide more opportunities to the teachers to play a crucial role in the promotion and development of an intellectual climate, which is conducive to the pursuit of scholarship and excellence. The scheme was implemented in 1976.

The Conferment of Autonomous Status on the colleges and implementation of the same, shall be guided by the University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous Status upon Colleges and Measure of Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018.

Autonomous status shall be granted initially for a period of ten years; further extension shall be for five years at a time except those covered under para given below:

"If an autonomous college has obtained the score of 3.51 and above on a 4-Point scale from NAAC or a minimum of three programmes have been accredited by NBA with a minimum score of 750 individually or a corresponding accreditation Grade/score from a UGC empanelled accreditation agency, the college shall be granted extension of autonomous status for further ten years without on-site visit."

Financial Assistance: Autonomy grant as admissible to the autonomous colleges is being released by the concerned Regional Offices of UGC which are located at Hyderabad, Pune, Bhopal, Kolkata, Guwahati, Bangalore and at Delhi. The Commission shall provide financial assistance to autonomous colleges as per the extant provisions of the scheme guidelines (prescribed separately). However, self-financing colleges shall not be provided autonomy grant. In matters related to utilization of autonomy grant and maintaining the accounts, the college shall remain guided by the scheme guidelines.

As on 31-03-2019 there were 687 Autonomous Colleges spread over in 108 Universities and 25 States as compared to 637 Autonomous Colleges in the previous year.

5.4 Human Resource Development Centres (HRDC) & Regional Centre of Capacity Building (RCCB)

With an aim to maintain high standards of teaching in Universities and Colleges, the Scheme of Academic Staff colleges were introduced in 1986-87. At present, there are 66 HRDCs (formerly known as ASCs) all over India. These colleges, so established, are conducting specially designed Orientation Programmes of four weeks duration for newly appointed lecturers and Refresher Courses of three week duration along with summerwinter school programmes for the eligible in-service teachers to uplift their teaching skills.


- UGC has sanctioned grants to 66 Human Resource Development Centre to all over country for conducting Refresher Courses, Orientation Programme, Short Term Course, Summer/Winter School programme and ASC-Guest House etc. under the scheme of HRDC
- Approximately 25000 Teachers-participants have gone through the programmes/courses conducted by the 66 UGC HRDCs.
- Total sanctioned amount have already been released of Rs.44.22 Crore to HRDC's for 2018-19.
- The fresh sanction letters have been issued to 24 HRDC's of Rs.5,00,000/- each for conducting Refresher Courses, Orientation Programmes through SWAYAM platform being notified NRCs by the M/HRD's on account grant for the year 2018-19.

The Guidelines of the scheme of Human Resource Development Centre is already under process for the year 2019.

Leadership for Academicians Programme (LEAP)

LEAP launched by MHRD, is a three weeks Flagship leadership development training programme (2 weeks domestic and one week foreign training) for second level academic functionaries in public funded higher education institutions. The main objective is to prepare second tier academic heads who are potentially likely to assume leadership roles in the future. The programme would provide senior faculty, with high academic credentials, the required leadership and managerial skills including skills of problem-solving, handling stress, team building work, conflict management, developing communication skills, understanding and coping with the complexity and challenges of governance in HEIs, financial & general administration.

5.6 Promotion of Rajbhasha

In the year 1963, the Central government declared Hindi as per official languages Act as the official/ language used for official purposes of the Union of India and directed all the departments of Central Government to setup "Rajbhasha Cell" in order to promote working in Hindi, which in 1992 converted into a full-fledged Rajbhasha Section.

The University Grants Commission has been making all efforts to inspire the officials to do more and more work in Rajbhasha Hindi. For the promotion of Hindi language, approval has been granted by the Commission for establishment of Hindi Cell at Central University and for establishment and up gradation of Hindi Department in Central / Deemed / State universities, receiving grants from the commission.

- Circulars have been issued to the effect that the documents under the clause 3(3) of Rajbhasha Act, 1963 (General orders, Memorandum, Resolutions, Notifications, Rules, Agreements, Tender Notices, Parliament Questions etc.) must be issued bilingually.
- During the year 2018-19, four meetings of Rajbhasha Implementation Committee were held on 27-06-2018, 04-10-2018, 22-12-2018 and 19-03-2019 respectively.
- In order to promote Hindi, four workshops were organized on 20.06.2018,28.12.2018, 01.02.2019 and 24.04.2019 respectively.
- During the year 2018-19, Five staff members were nominated for Hindi typing. Out of which 1 emloyee got first position, 1 employee got second position.
- The University Grants Commission website is bilingual and Hindi & English contents are updated timely.
- The materials received from various sections of University Grants Commission were translated into Hindi by the Rajbhasha section, such as: Annual Report 2017-18, Annual Accounts 2017-18, Administrative Tender information, the various formats of leave set by administration (Earned Leave/Casual Leave/Child Care Leave/Medical Leave, Earned Leave Encashment, Performa for taking charge, Resignation etc), information pertaining to Right to information act and documents, Administrative Official Order, Memorandum, Transfer, Postings, Retirement, Orders pertaining to maintain discipline, Demy-official Letters and Advertisements and Circulars received from other Sections.
- During the year 2018-19 for the officers /employee of the University Grants Commission, different competitions such as Essays, debates, Hindi noting and drafting, and Hindi typing on the Computer were organized. A cash prize of Rupees 5000/-, 4,000/- 3000/- and 2000/- were distributed among the participants securing first, second, third and one consolation prize was also given.
- During the period from 1st to 14th September, 2018 'Hindi Pakhwada' was celebrated and on 7th September, 2018 Hindi Divas was Organized. For celebrating Hindi Divas and for the prize distribution function, a total amount of Rs. 4,12,351.00 were spent.
- Two meetings of 'Nagar Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti' (TOLIC) are held in the year in which the Commission regularly participates.
- During the yea 2018-19, approval has been granted for up gradation of Hindi Department of 02 Universities out of the Central / State / Deemed Universities receiving grants from the Commission. The final and balance amount of Rs. 1,00,00,000/- has been released for the construction of the building under non-recurring expenditure by the Commission.

• 13 universities out of total Central/ State/ Deemed Universities receiving grants have been sanctioned for up gradation by University Grants Commission- it will benefit each and every person including various Teaching, non-teaching staff and Students.

5.7 Bilateral Cultural and Educational Exchange Programmes

The University Grants Commission, on behalf of the Government of India, has been implementing various collaborative academic programmes between India and foreign countries.

UGC has been running Joint Research Programmes with countries like USA, UK, Israel, Norway and New Zealand, Germany, and has also facilitated Indian scholars to realize their research potential through scholarship, fellowship and research programmes, such as Stipendium Hungaricum scholarships, Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral research in USA, Project-based Personnel Exchange Programme and Exchange of Scientists Programme.

5.7(a): Joint Research Programmes

5.7(a)(i): Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme

The Joint Research Programme aims to encourage research cooperation between Israeli and Indian scientists.

The programme is activated through an agreement of cooperation between University Grant Commission (UGC) and Israel Science Foundation (ISF), and is funded by the Indian and Israeli governments, through the two funding agencies, each funding its own scientists according to their respective regulations. The programme is open to all disciplines.

Under India –Israel Joint Research Programme (4th Cycle), 11 joint research projects were awarded in the year 2018 for a period of three years i.e. 1st May, 2018 to 30th April, 2021.

5.7(a)(ii): UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships

The UK India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) was started in April, 2006 with the aim of enhancing educational link between the two countries.

In recognition of the substantial achievements and building on the success of this initiative, the Programme was extended till 2017.

University Grants Commission (UGC), on behalf of Indian universities and institutions of higher learning and supported by the Ministry of Human Resource Development and British Council (BC) through the UKIERI Secretariat based in New Delhi are the implementing agencies.

UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships are intended to be between institution-based research teams in UK and India of proven research ability. Under Thematic Partnerships, 18 joint research projects were awarded in the year 2018 for a period of two years i.e. from 15th March, 2018 to 14th March, 2020.

5.7(a)(iii): Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP)

An MoU was signed between the MHRD, India and Federal Ministry of Education and Research, Germany on 11th April 2013 at Berlin on the occasion of 2nd Indo-German Inter-Governmental Consultation.

Through this MoU both the sides agreed on a new funding programme, called Indo-German Partnerships in Higher Education (IGP). The responsibility for the concept and financial and Organizational administration of the programme lies with UGC and DAAD. In this regard, a joint declaration of intent has also been signed between the 2 Ministries concerning the implementation of the Programme,

The two sides declare their willingness to fund the programme for a period of four years from 2016 to 2020, and intend to allocate from each side a total of 3.5 million Euros for this period, respectively.

On the basis of the MoU signed between the Ministries and Joint Declaration Intent, an MoU has been signed on 5th October 2015 between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India and German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), Germany on Indo-German Partnership in Higher Education (IGP) and MoU was Exchanged in the presence on Honorable Prime Minister of India and HE Chancellor of Germany.

In the 1st cycle, 8 Institutional partnerships have been awarded in 2016 for the project period of four (4) years i.e. 1st July, 2016 to 30th June, 2020.

5.7(a)(iv): Project Based Personal Exchange Programme (PPP)

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) in New Delhi have worked out a programme designed to intensify the scientific cooperation through funding of scholars who would participate in cooperative research projects primarily in the fields of humanities and social sciences. Priority is given to young Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral scientists and scholars. In 2018, **one** project was selected for a period of two years programme.

5.7(a)(v): Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme (INCP)

Indo-Norway Cooperation Programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing higher education links between India and Norway. The programme is based on the MoU on Cooperation in Higher Education between India and Norway, signed on February 14, 2014, and on the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC) India and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU).

INCP is jointly financed through matching grants by the Indian Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA). UGC, India and SIU, Norway are the implementing agencies for this Programme.

INCP includes the establishment and administration of a portfolio of new projects aimed at furthering cooperation between Higher Education Institutions in India and Norway.

Eligibility: Public funded Institutions recognized under Sections 2 (f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956 which are fit to receive development grants, and Institutions of National Importance funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development are eligible to apply.

Broad subject areas: Collaboration may be established in any academic discipline, but must deal with any of the following priority areas:

- Energy, especially clean energy
- Climate change, including ocean and arctic/polar research
- Health, especially public health
- Information technology, especially information security
- Urban planning and development
- Environment
- Biotechnology and the medical sciences
- Global development
- Development economics
- Marine sciences

- Management studies, especially in relation to innovation
- Social sciences, humanities and the arts
- Geohazards
- Teacher education

Under INCP, UGC, India and SIU, Norway invited applications for Joint Research Projects, and selected 13 projects in the year 2014 for a period of 3 years. 1st January, 2015 to 31st December, 2017 and extended up to 31st December, 2018.

5.7(a)(vi): Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative

Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative was announced in 2009 as an affirmation of the commitment to build an enhanced India – United States strategic partnership in education. As a part of its implementation, the UGC announced an open competition under Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative and invited proposals for Joint Research from the institutions recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act and Institutions of National Importance in the following areas.

- Energy study,
- Sustainable Development,
- Climate Change,
- Environmental Studies,
- Education and Educational Reforms,
- Community Development and Innovation

5.7(a)(vii): Indo-New Zealand Joint Research Projects

Under the auspices of India-New Zealand Education Council, University Grants Commission, India and Education New Zealand invite applications from Indian and New Zealand academics seeking funding for Joint Research Projects. These Projects can be in any discipline but must focus on or more of the following themes:

- 1. Food security (including agriculture), history, social justice and social change.
- Community development and innovation 2.
- 3. Creative and culture industries, tourism and the new leisure economy
- 4. Health
- 5. Environment and sustainability (including climate change and energy studies)
- 6. Indian Diaspora in the South Pacific and the Antipodes
- 7. India New Zealand trade relations and India's foreign policy in the Asia-Pacific
- 8. Information Security
- Urban Planning and Development, urban-rural land use and related issues. 9.

5.7(a)(viii): Australia-India Educational Council (AIEC)

Australia-India Education Council was established in 2011, focusing on five strands i.e. Higher education and research, skills, quality assurance and recognition, student mobility and schools. Under the ambit of AIEC, one project has been awarded on student mobility to Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.

Another project was approved to National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NEUPA) with a total allocation of AUD 30600 in the field of Higher Education and Research.

5.7(b): Fellowships, Scholarships and Exchange of Scholars

5.7(b)(i): Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in USA

The University Grants Commission has offered these fellowships with the aim to provide excellent opportunity to young Indian researchers and teachers of all disciplines to have international collaborative research training in advance techniques and technologies in emerging fields, thereby furthering their research capacity and ability to contribute to higher education with global perspective and forging long-term relationships with distinguished experts in USA.

5.7(b)(ii): Commonwealth Medical Fellowships

During **2018**, The Commonwealth Scholarship Commission, United Kingdom offered 10 Commonwealth Medical Fellowship Awards to enable promising faculty members in Universities & Medical Colleges in India to do research work at the Universities/Institutions in the United Kingdom. The University Grants Commission had worked as a nominating agency for these fellowships. Last year, UGC nominated **10** Indian doctors, out of which **3** Indian doctors were selected by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission, UK for these fellowships.

5.7(b)(iii): Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme

As per the provisions mentioned in the Indo-Hungarian Educational Exchange Programme, signed between the Ministry of Human Capacities of Hungary and The Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Republic of India on 19th November, 2014, UGC invite applications from Indian students to pursue graduate, post-graduate and doctoral studies in Hungary. Under this agreement, Hungarian Government provides scholarship to 200 Indian Students, and the expenditure towards their air fare is borne by UGC after completion of their studies. In the year 2018- 2019. 166 Indian students were selected by the Hungarian Scholarship Board under this scholarship programme. The Indian Government through UGC offers 35 scholarships for Hungarian students. Against this, 3 Hungarian scholars visited India to pursue their studies in select Universities of Higher Education in India.

5.7(b)(v): Indo-Bulgarian CEP

During 2018, the UGC had nominated four scholars to visit Bulgaria for participation in International Seminar in Bulgarian language and culture organized by "St. Kliment Ohridski: Sofia University from 15th July to 4th August 2018 and "St. Cyril and St. Methodius" University of Veliko Turnovo from 16th July to 5th August 2018. All visits have been materialized.

5.7(c) Foreign Language Teachers

The UGC has collaborative programmes which, inter-alia, provide for the appointment of foreign language teachers in Indian universities to teach foreign languages. They are appointed in the Universities in consultation with the Mission of country concerned and the respective Universities. While providing language teacher to a university, it is generally ensured that the university has proper infrastructure for teaching foreign languages.

As per the EEP and CEP appointment of 22 foreign language teachers have been approved in various Higher Education Institutions in India.



5.8: National Educational Testing: Development of Human Resource for Teaching and Research

National Eligibility Test (UGC-NET) is conducted to determine eligibility for Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowships (JRF) in order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research in several subjects of Humanities (including Indian and some foreign languages), Yoga, Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences. The Test is conducted twice every year, generally in the months of June/July and December in 81 subjects (excluding Paper-I)in several cities, spread across the country.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) was conducting a test for determining the eligibility for the award of Junior Research Fellowships (JRF)since1984 in order to ensure greater comparability as well as higher degree of validity and reliability in the field of research. In order to maintain a uniform standard of teaching and research in the country, the Government of India, as per its New Education Policy, 1986 envisaged that "only those candidates who, besides fulfilling the minimum academic qualifications prescribed for the post of

lecturer, have qualified in a comprehensive test to be specifically conducted for the purpose will be eligible for appointment as Lecturers". The University Grants Commission held wide-ranging consultationsonthe issue of evolving the qualifying test for appointment as Assistant Professor / Lecturer with groups of academicians and educational administrators like State Education Secretaries. Accordingly, UGC combined it with the test for JRF already being conducted by it and conducted the first National Eligibility Test for Junior Research Fellowship and Eligibility for Lectureship (UGC-NET) on 24th December, 1989 in the subjects falling under Humanities including languages, Social Sciences and some science subjects. The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) conducted the Joint CSIR-UGC Test for JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship on 31st December, 1989 for disciplines falling under the basic sciences. Since then, UGC-NET and Joint CSIR-UGC Test have been mostly conducted twice every year in the months of June / July and December.

The University Grants Commission conducted the UGC-NET by itself till June 2014. Thereafter, the conduct of UGC-NET was outsourced to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) from December 2014 to July 2018. Subsequently, the conduct of UGC-NET has been entrusted to National Testing Agency (NTA) constituted by the Government of India. Consequently, the UGC-NET held in December, 2018 was conducted by NTA.

On its part, CSIR is conducting the Joint CSIR-UGC Test in 5 core science subjects, viz., ChemicalSciences; Earth, Atmospheric, Ocean and Planetary Sciences; Life Sciences; Mathematical Sciences and Physical Sciences in the months of June and December.

The candidates, who desire to pursueresearch and avail fellowship from UGC, can opt to appear for Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) either under the UGC-NET or under the Joint CSIR-UGC Test. The candidates with higher merit who qualify for JRF, can pursue research in the UGC recognized universities and institutions. They are also eligible for being considered for the post of Assistant Professor in the universities and colleges throughout the country. Over 3200 JRFsare awarded by UGC under each UGC-NET and 1500 JRFs(including 300 fellowships of Basic Science Research Bureau of UGC) are awarded through each Joint CSIR-UGC Test. Fellowship is available for a maximum period of five years.

In the UGC-NET conducted on 08.07.2018, 3972candidates were declared eligible for Junior Research Fellowship, while 3946 candidates have been declared qualified for JRF in UGC-NET held in December 2018.

5.8(a) Performance in UGC-NET

A brief overview of candidates registered, appeared and qualified for Eligibility for Assistant Professor and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in UGC-NET is presented in Table 5.8(a)

5.8 (a) (i) Reforms/Improvements in the Scheme of UGC-NET in 2018-19

The Commission, in its 527thmeeting held on 22.12.2017, introduced several landmark reforms in thescheme of UGC-NET, which have been made applicable from the UGC-NET held on 8th July 2018. They are as presented below:

Number of Candidates

- The upper age limit for appearing in JRF has been raised by two years, i.e. from the pre-existing upper age limit of 28 years to 30 years. There continues to be five years' relaxation in age for candidates belonging to SC/ST/PWD/OBC (falling in the non-creamy layer) categories and for women candidates. Relaxation is also provided, as presently in existence, to the candidates having research experience, limited to the period spent on research in the relevant/related subject of post-graduation degree, subject to a maximum period of 5 years, on production of a certificate from the appropriate authority. Three years' relaxation in age is permissible to the candidates possessing L.L.M. Degree. Total age relaxation on the above ground(s) shall not exceed five years under any circumstances irrespective of category or gender.
- The validity period of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) has been increased by one year, i.e., from the pre-existing two years to three years. This shall provide tremendous relief to candidates who encounter considerable hardship in getting admission within the earlier stipulated period of two years to M.Phil. or Ph.D. courses in suitable universities offering research programmes in their discipline.
- Candidates belonging to the third gender, in other words, trans-genders are now allowed to appear in UGC-NET under their category. They are also eligible to draw the same relaxation in fee, age and qualifying criteria for NET (i.e. Junior Research Fellowship and Assistant Professor) as are available to SC/ST/PWD categories. The subject-wise qualifying cut-offs for this category would be the lowest among those for SC/ST/PWD/OBC (belonging to non-creamy layer) categories in the corresponding subject.

- The candidates who have served in the armed forces are eligible for age relaxation while applying for JRF by a maximum period of five years subject to their length of service in the armed forces up to the first day of the month in which the concerned UGC-NET is to be held.
- ii) Sindhi has been introduced as a NET subject by UGC after getting its syllabus framed from UGC-NET UGC held in December 2018.
- iii) UGC has updated the syllabi of all subjects of UGC-NET including that for Paper-I on 'General Awareness'. The updated syllabi have been uploaded on the UGC website for wide public dissemination and are applicable from June 2019 UGC-NET onwards.
- iv) The UGC-NET has been conducted through online mode by National Testing Agency (NTA) for the first time in December 2018. The number of cities with UGC-NET examination centres has been increased from 91 in July 2018 to 264 in December 2018. NTA deserves plaudits for making available the examination centres within easily approachable distance for the candidates.

5.8 (a) (ii) Concessions / Relaxation for the Under privileged Categories

i) In Fee

In conformity with the policy of Government of India, the UniversityGrantsCommission has been providing considerable concession in fee for applying in UGC-NET, now being conducted by NTA,to all under-privileged sections of the society. While the fee for candidates belonging to the General category isRs. 800/-, it is only Rs. 400/- for OBC candidates as per the Central Government list who are not covered under the creamy layer. The candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, trans genders and the persons with disability (PWD) are required to pay a nominal fee of Rs. 200/- only.

ii) In Age for JRF

The upper age limit for the General category in order to appear in JRF is 30 years. A relaxation of upto 5 years is provided to the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC(Non-creamylayer)/PWD/transgender categories and to women applicants.

iii) In Eligibility Conditions for NET

iv) In Qualifying Criteria for UGC-NET

The candidates are required to obtain the following minimum marks in aggregate of Paper-Iand Paper-II to be considered for final preparation of result as presented in Table 5.8(a)(ii):-

As is apparent, the minimum required marks for OBC, SC, ST and PWD categories in NET are lower than that for the General category. Moreover, the reservation policy of Government of India is being employed in the UGC-NET to allocate the slots for JRF as well as for Eligibility for Assistant Professor.

5.8(b) Joint CSIR-UGC Test

The Joint CSIR-UGC Test is conducted by CSIR twice every year in the months of June and December. Among the candidates declared qualified for Both JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship / Assistant Professor by the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR), 1500 JRFs are awarded under the UGC scheme. CSIR declares certain number of candidates qualified for Eligibility for Lectureship / Assistant Professor only on behalf of UGC.

Table 5.8(b)(i) depicts the core science subjects in which the Joint CSIR-UGC Test is conducted by CSIR and Table 5.8(b)(ii) displays the number of candidates qualified for JRF and Eligibility for Lectureship through the Joint CSIR-UGC Test.

5.8(c) Recognition of UGC-NET Qualified Candidates in the Public Sector

The UGC-NET has come to be recognized as an authentic source of talent pool in the last few years; being viewed with prestige among public sector undertakings of the Government of India. The University Grants Commission has been formally approached by several premier government bodies for permission to utilize the UGC-NET scores of candidates in various disciplines for recruiting its officers. They are:

- ii) Oil and Natural Gas Commission (ONGC)
- iii) Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)
- iv) Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited
- v) Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited

- vii) Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd.
- viii) Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers Limited
- ix) THDC India Limited
- x) RashtriyaIspat Nigam Limited
- xi) Power System Operation Corporation Limited

The UGC has already conveyed its willingness to share its data in this regard.

5.8(d) State Eligibility Test (SET)

In accordance with the mandate of the Government of India through its notification dated 22-07-1988, UGC, on request of State Governments, proposed to have State Level Eligibility Test (SLET), now known as **State Eligibility Test (SET)** duly accredited by UGC for a fixed term. The pattern of SET is same as that of UGC-NET.

In response to the proposal of some states/groups of states to conduct SET, University Grants Commissiongrants accreditation to them for conducting SET for Eligibility for Assistant Professor for a fixed term not exceeding three yearsonly after examining their proposals and thorough assessment of their competence and capability. The performance of SET agencies is reviewed periodically by UGC with the assistance of expert committee(s).

The candidates who have cleared the State Eligibility Test (SET), accredited by UGC for Lectureship prior to 1st June 2002, are exempted from appearing in the NET. For SET scheduled in or after June 2002, the qualified candidates shall be eligible to apply for the post of lecturer only in the universities/colleges situated in the state from where they have cleared their SET. However, such candidates are also eligible to apply for NET, if they so desire.

The criteria for allocating slots for Eligibility for Assistant Professor as per the reservation policy of the Government of India, as being applied in UGC-NET now, has been extended to the SET scheme with the difference that in SET, the total slots for Eligibility for Assistant Professor, derived as per the qualifying criteria prescribed by UGC, are allocated in accordance with the reservation policy of the concerned state.

Till now, the following states/ clusters of states have conducted SET:

i Andhra Pradesh ii. Bihar iii. Chhattisgarh iv. Gujarat v. Haryana vi. Himachal Pradesh vii. Jammu & Kashmir viii. Jharkhand x. Madhya Pradesh xi. Maharashtra & Goa xii. North Eastern states ix. Karnataka (participating states: Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Tripura & Sikkim xiii. Rajasthan xiv. Tamil Nadu xv. Telangana xvi. Uttarakhand xvii. Uttar Pradesh xviii. West Bengal

From among these, the states/groups of states that conducted SETor declared its result during the year 2018-19 are as presented here:

i) Andhra Pradesh ii) Chattisgarh iii) Gujarat iv) Himachal Pradesh v) Jammu & Kashmir vi) Karnataka vii) Madhya Pradesh viii) Maharashtra & Goa ix) North Eastern states x) Tamil Nadu xi) Telangana xii) West Bengal

During 2018-19, the SET agency of Maharashtra, that is, Savitribai Phule Pune University was granted accreditation by the University Grants Commission to conduct State Eligibility Tests for another three years, once in each year.

5.9 Travel Grant

Travel Grant scheme is for providing financial assistance to permanent teachers and librarians of colleges and vice-chancellors of state universities, deemed to be universities and central universities, recognized under section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act. The objective of the scheme is to encourage the college teachers to present research papers at international conferences conducted by foreign educational institutions abroad and to study the working mechanism of higher education in those countries. In addition, this facility is available to

the permanent teachers of Institutions of National Importance with a cap of 10% of the total approved cases in a year. The Commission members and UGC Officers at the level of Education Officer/Under Secretary and above are also eligible to apply under this scheme. The maximum age limit for College Teachers/College Librarians/ UGC Officers is up to the age of superannuation and for Vice-Chancellors and Commission Members they should be in position.

The permanent Teachers and Librarians of the Colleges enlisted under Section 2 (f) and 12 B of the UGC Act, 1956 are being provided with 100% grant for travel, registration fee, per diem allowance and visa fee etc. once in a period of three years. Whereas, Vice-chancellors of State Universities, deemed to be Universities and Central Universities recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act,1956 Commission Members, UGC Officers and SC/ST/OBC (non creamy layer) College Teachers will be provided financial assistance on 100% basis once in a period of two years. Applications for assistance under the UGC Travel Grant scheme are to be submitted two months prior to the commencement of the Conference along with research paper to be presented and acceptance letter from the organizers of the Conference.

Proposals received under the said scheme are evaluated by the Travel Grant Committee constituted by Chairman, UGC and the recommendations given by the subject Experts are being considered by the Commission.

UNESCO Programme: Various circulars regarding scholarship/training programmes abroad, offered by the UNESCO in different member countries received from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, New Delhi are being circulated by UGC among the Universities and Educational Institutions in India. On some matters of UNESCO, related of the development of higher Education and coordination among the member countries, the Ministry of Human Resource Development seeks the view/comments of the UGC which are being offered after due consideration/study of the documents.

5.10 Inter University Resources for Promotion of Quality

5.10(a) Inter University Centres (IUCs)

The University Grants Commission has established various Inter University Centres (IUCs) since 1984 under section 12(ccc) of the UGC Act, 1956. The Inter University Centres are autonomous bodies within the University system with a view to provide centrally the state-of-the-art equipment and facilities, which are not generally available at many Universities due to cost factor, for the benefit of researchers working in different Universities. UGC has established 9 Centres, so far, mainly in the field of Science, Technology & Education. The Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC), New Delhi (formerly Nuclear Science Centre) was the first among such Centre established in 1984 in New Delhi. The main objectives to establish these Inter University Centres were/are:-

- To provide common & advanced centralized facilities/services for universities which may not invest the larger shares of their receipts in infrastructure and other inputs.
- To play a vital role in offering the best practices & expertise in each field of higher education to teachers and researchers across the country.

To provide access for the research community and teaching faculty to the state-of-the-art equipment and excellent library facilities which are comparable to International standards.

The UGC remained instrumental since long in producing more than a thousand educational films and programmes through various Educational Multimedia Centres established in selected Universities in the country under the guidance and co-ordination of Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), New Delhi. The first countrywide classroom (CWCR) programme was telecasted on the National Network on 15th August, 1984.



Highlights of Various Inter Univesity Centres 5.10(i) Inter University Accelerator Centre – New Delhi

Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC) was set-up by the University Grants Commission as first Inter-University Centre (IUC) called Nuclear Science Centre after due approval of the Planning Commission and the Prime Minister in October, 1984. The Centre became the first National User Facility of its kind on July 8, 1991 after a series of beam tests and optimization of the operating parameters of the India's largest Tandem Accelerator known as 15UD PELLETRON Tandem Accelerator. Subsequently, IUAC developed other accelerators, like state-of-the-art Superconducting Linear Accelerator (SC-LINAC) using Niobium Quarter Wave Resonators (QWRs), 1.7MV PELLETRON Tandem Accelerator, 0.5MV PELLETRON Tandem Accelerator based Accelerator Mass Spectrometer (AMS), Electron Cyclotron Resonance (ECR) ion source based Ion Beam Facility, Negative Ion Beam facility, etc. More than one thousand research scholars completed their Ph.D degree using the world class ion accelerator based research facilities at IUAC. IUAC Delhi is presently the premier Ion Accelerator Facility in the country. In addition to the various Ion Accelerator Facilities, IUAC provides following state of the art experimental research facilities for experimental research facilities for research in the area of Nuclear Physics, Materials Science, Radiation Biology, Atomic and Molecular Physics and Earth Sciences. A High Power Computing (HPC) facility (70TF) has been set up at IUAC which is being used by more that 400 researchers from all over India.

Under the outreach program, the compact computer interface for science experiments (ExpEYES), developed at IUAC has been extensively used by the academic community. The teachers and researchers from all over the country are being trained regularly on computer interfaced science experiments, Python programming based data analyses, visualization and installation of open source educational software.

In order to attract young researchers and sustain the academic activities of University researchers, the University Fellowship for Research (UFR) programme is also being managed by IUAC:-

University Fellowship for Research (UFR): During the year 2018-19, total 201 projects including approx. 15 from SC/ST category were sanctioned by Accelerator Users' Committee (AUC) of IUAC. There were total of 43 Ph.D projects sanctioned to pursue utilizing IUAC experimental facilities.

University Fellowship for Research (UFR) grants are released out of Revenue Grants allocated by University Grants Commission and no separate grant is received for UFR from UGC.

5.10(ii) Inter University Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics, Pune

The University Grants Commission (UGC), under section 12ccc of the UGC Act of 1956, established the Inter University Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics in Pune. It has set up in 1988 as an autonomous centre of excellence to help initiate nurture and grow teaching, research and development activities in astronomy and astrophysical in university sector.

Objectives for which IUCAA has been established:

- To conduct vigorous research programme of its own, and to provide a centre of excellence within the Indian University sector.
- To promote nucleation and growth of active groups in Indian Universities.
- To function as a field station and resource centre, and provide general guidance and help for Astronomy and Astrophysics (A & A) activities in India and neighboring countries.

To fulfill the objectives, IUCAA has devised many programmes, and a few of them are mentioned below:

- (a) Basic Research in A & A.
- *(b) Teaching A & A to postgraduate students.*
- (c) Vacation Students' Programme and Summer School for University/College students.
- (d) Refresher Course for University/College teachers.
- (e) Associateship Programme for University/College teachers.
- (f) Visitor Programmes for National and International researchers.
- (g) IUCAA Resource Centres in different regions of India.
- (h) Conducting Schools, Workshops, and Conferences in and outside IUCAA.
- (i) Operating IUCAA Girawali Observatory for members of Indian Universities.
- (j) Access to Southern African Large Telescope (SALT) for University/College faculty and students via partnership.
- (k) Extensive Public Outreach Programme for University/College, School students and general public.
- (l) Leading role in National Mega-Projects in Astrophysics:
 - I. Science and Computing in Laser Interferometric Gravitational-Wave Observatory (LIGO) India.
 - II. Thirty Metre Telescope.
 - III. Square Kilometre Array India.

- (m) Leading role and University users interface in ISRO scientific activities:
 - I. AstroSat Multi-purpose astronomical satellite, launched in 2015.
 - II. Aditya L1 Observatory in space to study Sun, to be launched in 2020.
- (n) Operating Data Centres.
- (o) Teaching Learning Centre in A & A (under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching Scheme, by MHRD).
- (p) National Resource Centre in A & A (under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching Scheme, by MHRD), through which, first 57 video lectures along with supplementary materials have been offered on SWAYAM platform for University/College faculty.

5.10(iii) UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research, Indore.



The main objectives of the IUC DAE are (i) to provide all the possible support to the students & teachers from the Universities &Instts. of higher learning for making use of the major research facilities of the deptt. of Atomic Energy. (ii) to initiate collaborative research programme between the University researches and the DAE Scientists (iii) to provide facilities for basic research in the fields of materials science, Nuclear physics, condensed matter physics and other related fields.

The Consortium had the mandate of making three major "Big-Science" facilities of DAE available to the researchers in the University system. These three facilities are the Dhruva Reactor at BARC, the Variable Energy Cyclotron at the Kolkata, and the Synchrotron Radiation Source at Indore. Accordingly, the Consortium established three Centres at Indore, Kolkata and Mumbai, with the head office at Indore. In the recent past a Node at Kalpakkam has been established that caters the need of Materails Science as well with relevance to the IGCAR facilities.

As a part of our effort to provide state-of-the-art research facilities to university and college teachers and Ph.D. students, the Consortium has installed highly sophisticated and advanced research facilities at its three Centres at Indore, Kolkata and Mumbai also. These facilities are expensive and difficult to maintain, and are not available in most of the Indian universities. Over the years, the Consortium has also enlarged the ambit and university researchers were provided access to the Low Energy Ion Accelerator facilities of DAE at IGCAR Kalpakkam and IOP Bhubaneswar. A low energy heavy ion ECR based accelerator has also been made available at VECC, Kolkata. CSR in general and Indore Centre in special has carved out a unique place in the country for Low Temperatures and High Magnetic Fields facilities that are available to the universities.

- (i) Major facility development: The availability of polarized x-ray beam from the synchrotron radiation sources has led to the development of the very powerful technique of X-ray Magnetic Circular Dichroism (XMCD). XMCD measurement will allow quantitative estimation of various physical parameters and contribution which are essential quantities to make a complete understanding of various phenomena in magnetic materials. We have developed a beamline for X-ray magnetic circular dichroism (XMCD) measurements at Indus-2 Synchrotron Radiation Source. This new addition of XMCD measurement facility (unique in the country) by UGC-DAE CSR is going to be a very powerful unified tool for materials science research community to probe and comprehend the microscopic origin of various magnetic phenomena (see below photograph).
- (ii) Efforts to increase usage of Indus synchrotron (DAE mega facility): The Indus Synchrotron User Meeting (ISUM) was organized jointly by UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research (CSR), Indore alongwith DAVV and RRCAT at UGC-DAE CSR, Indore during March 27-29, 2019. The aim of ISUM was to highlight the on-going research & developmental efforts on Indus Synchrotrons and the utilization of synchrotron radiation sources by different researchers from Universities and academic institutes. During this meeting invited lectures by eminent experts were be delivered focusing on the development and utilization of Indus synchrotron facility. Also, conceptual Collaborative Research Scheme (CRS) project proposals aiming for utilization of Indus SRS were invited from faculty members of Universities and Research Institutions. In response, more than 350 participants registered for this meeting. During ISUM 38 Invited talks were delivered, 45 contributory papers and 80 CRS projects proposal were presented through poster presentations by the scientific community throughout the country.
- (iii) Workshop on Natural process of learning: A one day Workshop on "Natural Process of Learning" was organized on 24th August at Convention Centre RRCAT, Indore. The keynote speaker on this occasion was Prof H C Verma, a well known teacher and ex- Professor from IIT Kanpur. Prof. Verma is popular among the students and teachers for his ability to communicate physics in very basic language. He gave a

seminar on "Role of Experiments in Development of Physics". He enthralled the students with his natural way of explaining several fundamental aspects of Physics. He highlighted various examples to suggest enormous amount of knowledge that one get by simply thinking beyond the box. He lamented at the nature of the school education system, which is not allowing students to naturally learn from the events happening around them. He demonstrated several on-site illustrations of simple experiments which explained several nuisances of mechanics, optics, magnetism etc. Around 750 students from various schools and colleges of the city participated in the workshop.

5.10(iv) National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)



The University Grants Commission (UGC), under section 12ccc of the UGC Act of 1956, established the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) on 16th September 1994 with headquarters at Bangalore.

In India, there has been a tremendous quantitative expansion in the number of higher education institutions. The profile of education providers vary in types, programmes, curricular offerings, mode of delivery and funding pattern. In fact, higher education throughout the world is in a flux. Under such conditions, variations in standard and quality are natural outcomes. Arising out of the need for establishing standards in education in the context of the proliferation of colleges all over the country, the National Policy on Education (NPE, 1986) and the Program of Action (PoA, 1992) has emphasized the need for a mechanism to be setup, which will encourage self-assessment in institutions and also Assessment and Accreditation by an external agency. In this context of consolidating the gains of our educational system and to ensure quality education, the setting up of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council(NAAC) was a historic step. The NAAC was established in the year 1994 as an autonomous institution of the University Grants Commission(UGC) with its prime agenda to assess and accredit institutions of higher education in the country. NAAC is located at Bangalore. Quest for Quality in Higher Education has become the prime agenda of the countries world over. Establishing external quality assurance (EQA) agencies to maintain and improve the standard of higher education is considered the best means of responding to the need for Quality in imparting of higher learning and such agencies have been established in many countries of the world. This is relatively a new concept to be adopted, perhaps just a decade old except a few developed countries. By establishing the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 16th September 1994, India has joined the international movement for Quality in higher education. An indicator of its impact is that "Quality", "NAAC Accreditation", "Internal Quality Assurance Cell(IQAC)", are the most commonly used term and topic for discussions in colleges and universities today.

The main objectives of assessment and accreditation are to:

- a) grade institutions of higher education and their programmes;
- b) stimulate the academic environment and quality of teaching and research in these institutions;
- c) help institutions realise their academic objectives;

- d) promote necessary changes, innovations and reforms in all aspects of the institutions working for the above purpose;
- e) encourage innovations, self evaluation and accountability in higher education.

In order to meet its mandate NAAC will:

- a) Review periodically and revise and update as and when considered necessary in the light of experience gained the techniques and modalities of assessment;
- b) Communicate the results of assessment and grading to the concerned institution in a form and manner appropriate for corrective action, rectification and self improvement;
- c) Help and encourage the institutions in developing their own procedures, techniques and modalities for self evaluation:
- d) Initiate research studies, in planning and evaluation of educational institutions, programmes etc.;
- e) Ensure an optimised use of resources and the achievement of the identified goals of institutions of higher learning;
- f) NAAC may collaborate with institutions, Indian and foreign, engaged in work of a similar nature and may also undertake on request assessment and accreditation of institutions of higher education, abroad.


The NAAC functions through its General Council (GC) and Executive Committee (EC), where educational administrators, policy makers and senior academicians of a cross section of the system of higher education are represented. The Chairperson of the UGC is the President of the GC of NAAC and the Chairperson of the EC is an eminent academician, nominated by the President GC. The Director is the academic and administrative head of NAAC, and is also the member-secretary of both, the GC and the EC. The NAAC has a core staff supplemented by consultants, to undertake its various functions.

The target group for the NAAC are the Universities and Colleges in India, for the purpose of Assessment and Accreditation, 12126 Colleges and 586 Universities were assessed and accredited.

Inauguration of NAAC office, Delhi, at Anuvrat Bhavan, Deen Daya Upadhyay Marg, New Delhi

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Delhi office was inaugurated by Prof D P Singh, Chairman, UGC on 14th, May, 2018 at Anuvrat Bhavan, Deen Dayal Upadhyay Marg, New Delhi. Prof Virander Chauhan, Chairman, Executive Committee, NAAC, Dr Latha Pillai, Director, Acting, NAAC & Prof Rajnish Jain, Secretary UGC and a host of other senior officials of NAAC and UGC were present on the occasion.

As approved by the Executive Committee of NAAC, the Delhi, NAAC office will focus on coordinating Assessment and Accreditation process, carry out awareness programme in the Northern Region for Universities & Colleges, Development of Promotional Materials in Hindi, Maintaining database of assessors, liaison, Government, Statutory and Regulatory bodies for enhancing the brand image of the organization and thereby serve as a nodal unit for day-to-day activities, Promotion of Rajya Bhasha and Translation work, besides other routine activities.

Termination of NAAC-NCTE MoU for Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs)

As approved by the Executive Committee (EC), the NAAC-NCTE MoU stands terminated w.e.f Dt.16/05/2018 and Assessment and Accreditation (A&A) of Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs) by NAAC is discontinued forthwith.

Discontinuation of Assessment and Accreditation of Pharmacy Colleges

NAAC is in the process of developing a Manual for Health Sciences. It has been resolved by the competent authority that till the Manual for Health Sciences is finalised, NAAC will be discontinuing the accreditation of Pharmacy colleges. Hence applications from Pharmacy colleges will not be accepted.

NAAC Documentary

NAAC Documentary Awareness about NAAC was required on the field. The best way to give an effective awareness is to promote a short documentary film on NAAC highlighting all the essential activities and achievements of NAAC. The same is IPR protected and hosted in NAAC website for the access of stakeholders and have proved far reaching effects amongst the Higher Education Institutions

MHRD Dashboard

In order to have synchronization and to share the day-today progress of work with MHRD, a dashboard was designed and shared with MHRD. This dashboard is dynamic dashboard and represents concurrent work status of different activities like IIQA, SSR, DVV, Peer Team Visits and Results. The dashboard covers end to end work status with NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation.

Online Assessor Module

Streamlining the assessor data was a herculean task. Keeping the present and future requirements a database for assessors were designed. The legacy of assessor details in NAAC did not fit in the requirement of the database. Also, there was an immediate need to expand the assessors. Assessor registration was made provisional online, and the data base was scrutinized to prepare clear details of assessors so as to enable the system to auto-select the assessors for the Peer Team Visits. This was achieved in less than six months time with constant follow ups with dedicated team. An Exclusive Dash board is also maintained to follow the status of assessors.

In-house Development of Issue Management Software

An innovative way of addressing the day-to-day problems of the HEI was a first job at hand with NAAC. Though provisions were made earlier with email and phone calls, did not effectively work with issues related to RAF since it involves different facet of coordination. Hence an Issue Management System (IMS) was designed and integrated with the dashboard of HEI, process owners and academic coordinators. Institutions are enabled with a system to raise their doubts, concerns and 8 apprehensions through portal at any point of time. The same is allocated to the concerned based on the field in which the concerns or issues are raised. The turnaround time is within a day and are been closely monitored by dedicated team. This feature has achieved great response from the HEI and has been appreciated the most by the HEIs. Issues being raised online, and solutions provided by the concerned online, the status being monitored by NAAC and MHRD has raised the transparency level of functions of NAAC. More specifically, NAAC takes pride in announcing that this module was an in-house preparation which was developed and deployed by the ICT team of NAAC without outsourcing the work, talks about the efficiency of the team.

• NAAC Video Tutorials

Hand holding of the HEIs to the digital RAF was a great challenge. Digital literacy with the HEI in remote landscapes was an issue of concern to NAAC. In order to overcome the same, video tutorials were prepared to guide the institutions step-by step in the process of assessment and accreditation and the know-how of the portals were also provided in the same. These videos were also produced in-house by the newly recruited Assistant Advisers. This has proved to be the sigh of relief for the institutions and guides them end to end giving them the glimpses of the portal, and 9 frequently asked questions are addressed here. These videos are elaborate and are hosted in NAAC website of the institution's download and use.

• Streamlining DVV

Data Validation and Verification is the heart of RAF and is the crucial component in determining the quality of the institution. The process of DVV is well streamlined and stabilised. The Standard Operating Procedures are finalised and hosted on the website to bridge the gap between the understanding of the metrics and sharing of the documents. Through this, it is being ensured that the DVV partners who verify the institution's data and the institution who provide the data are in the same page of understanding with the metrics that NAAC has provided. It is also being ensured that the DVV process of the institutions complete within 30-40 days.

• Mechanism to Deal with Appeals

The modalities to process appeals were finalised and implemented. Appeals also are being made ICT enabled from end to end. Any aggrieved institution is been enabled to appeal within stipulated time. The Appeal Committee can suggest course of action and the same can be implemented online. The end results of appeal also is being planned to be communicated to the institution online. Since one year, the appeal issue was pending with NAAC, since it would be a new process under RAF. This was taken up on priority and was cleared. The first results of the appeals are being announced.

Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning in DVV

DVV need to be elevated to a new level of ICT. Potentials for artificial intelligence is DVV in the means of document reading, identification for numbers in whole list of documents etc. was realised. Opportunities are being identified to deploy Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning with the data of 1200 institutions to explore the metrics where automated verification is possible.

Infrastructure Development

Media Centre

Efforts are initiated to establish Media Centre with professional consultation and project execution services of Broadcast Engineering Consultants India Limited (BECIL), a Government of India Enterprise to reach to the

nook and corner of the country to deliver awareness regarding quality enhancement and sustenance in higher education and the role and importance of NAAC. An MOU has already been 11 signed with BECIL, and blue prints on the course of actions are charted out for the same.

• Divyang Friendly Office

The office of NAAC is a legendary architecture, modern and unique to the envy of any Government Office. However, the shortfalls in the design was realised that there were no provisions of lift made in the design to suit the use of office for senior citizens and Divyangs. Hence, lift provisions are designed incompliance with the architecture and is expected to take its position be operational.

• Establishment of Digital Library

For an Inter University Centre such as NAAC, which is in the helm of affairs in Higher Education of the Country, the Library of NAAC needed upgradation. Presently, NAAC digital library is enabled with good collection of books. Processing and procedures are being devised to make the NAAC's library towards State of Art library. The ambience and space utilization has been reorganised to have a visually motivated appeal and appearance.

Modernization of Infrastructure

From discussion rooms, to rest rooms, ultimate care has been taken to re-structure and accommodate the growing needs of NAAC. Gender sensitive needs are being fulfilled and accommodated. Exclusive gate for entry and exist is under construction. The water needs of NAAC is addressed by augmenting the existing bore well and establishing new bore wells to ensure un interrupted water supply to NAAC Office and residential establishments. While all these are new infrastructure being brought at place, nevertheless to mention, it is also ensured that the existing facilities are being used to optimal extent possible.

Promoted Green Initiatives at NAAC

NAAC has declared to be plastic free zone and hence plastic water bottles are banned in NAAC. As a promotional move, and commemorating the 25th year of existence of NAAC, the officers were gifted with Copper water bottles and were encouraged to use the same in office. The Plastic water bottles for meeting are also replaced with the same. NAAC has made it a practice to promote the same even with visitors.

5.10(v) The Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, Gandhinagar:



The Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, setup in May 1996, is an autonomous Inter-University Centre (IUC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) located at Infocity, Gandhinagar. Major activities and services of the Centre are geared towards modernization of academic libraries and information centres, to promote information transfer and access, to support scholarship, learning and academic pursuits. The Centre acts as a nodal agency for networking of libraries and information centres in universities, institutions of higher learning and R & D institutions in India.

The technology is a driving force in the contemporary education system, the Centre has taken up a number of initiatives for the benefit of the academic community in India. These initiatives can broadly be grouped as following 12 categories:

- **Automation of University Libraries:** The Centre proactively helps universities to automate their libraries by various means. The INFLIBNET Centre signed MoU with 166 universities for library automation which provides for universities to contribute their bibliographic records of documents available in their libraries to the IndCat: Union Catalogue of the INFLIBNET Centre.
- IndCat: Union Catalogue of Indian Universities: IndCat consists of a union catalogue of Books, Serials and PhD theses available in university libraries. It contains bibliographical records of 142 lakh books from 184 university libraries, 0.35 lakh unique journals with holdings information for 223 universities and 2.74 lakh bibliographic records of theses from 317 universities.

• Software Development: SOUL 2.0: Integrated Library Automation Software

SOUL 2.0: INFLIBNET Centre contributes towards the automation of libraries through in-house developed SOUL software. SOUL has more than 3,500 + installations across the country.

• Open Access and Open Data Initiatives

Shodhganga: Launched in January 2010, Shodhganga, a reservoir of Indian Theses, at present it hosts 2.22 lakh full-text theses contributed from 397 institutes, during the period under report 0.35 lakh full-text theses from 72 universities have been added. The initiative got momentum when eligible universities were provided access to plagiarism detection software and at present 203 institution are availing subscription for plagiarism detection software.

Shodhgangotri: Initiated in 2013, Shodhgangotri is a repository of research in progress that hosts total 6,450 synopsis contributed by 63 institutes, during the period of report 2,550+ synopses have been added, where as 12 more institution have been enveloped.

ICSSR Data Service - Indian Social Science Data Repository: The project assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in 2015 by the ICSSR, hosts 140 datasets from MoSPI on the platform customized using NADA software, This has been quite popular in research community and having over 30 lakh resource downloads.

• Library Consortium and its By-products

e-ShodhSindhu: Launched in 2015, e-Shodh Sindhu provides access to more than 7,000 e-journals and 31 lakh books to more than 300 institutions that includes universities, centrally-funded technical institutions. NLIST which is a college component of e-Shodh Sindhu that provides access to more than 6,000 electronic journals and 31.65 lakh e-books to more than 5.43 lakh users spanned across 3,200 colleges.

INFLIBNET Access Management Federation (INFED): Started in full-fledged manner during 2017, INFED provides off-campus access to e-resources to users in institutes covered under e-Shodh Sindhu.

InfiStat: InfiStats, a by-product of e-Shodh Sindhu launched in 2015 facilitates monitoring and evaluation of usage statistics of subscribed e-resources made accessible to the member institutes under e-Shodh Sindhu.

Plagiarism detection software (PDS): On behalf of MHRD,INFLIBNET Centre is will provide web-based Plagiarism Detection Software/Tool (PDS) (variably called anti-plagiarism / duplication screening/similarity check tool) to 960+ Universities/Institutions which include all Private Universities and CFTIs. The PDS facilitates easy detection of plagiarized content in the academic and research works.

• E-learning, Content Development and MOOCs

e-PG-Pathshala: Initiated in 2012, e-PG Pathshala picked-up momentum from 2014 onwards. INFLIBNET coordinates development of e-content in 70 subjects across all disciplines. Presently it hosts 23,900+ modules contributed by 5000+ experts.

Vidya-mitra: Project assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in May 2014, Vidya-mitra is an online learning portal for all the e-content projects developed under the NME-ICT, MHRD. Vidya-mitra hosts 66,000+ Video (Self-learning / e-Tutorial) and 44,000+ e-Text.

SWAYAM (for PG Course): Launched on July 9, 2017, the INFLIBNET Centre is a nodal agency for coordinating for MOOCs for PG courses. More than 80 courses are being prepared for the MOOCs and60 non-technical PG courses were offered on SWAYAM platform during the year under report. The INFLIBNET Centre is also the nodal agency for offering seven courses in library and information science on SWAYAM Platform. These seven courses in LIS, launched on SWAYAM platform in the month of November 2017 have been successfully completed in March 2018. These seven courses have also been approved for re-run during 2019 on popular demand.

SWAYAM-PRABHA: Launched on July 9, 2017, the INFLIBNET Centre has developed a portal for SWAYAM-PRABHA and is hosting and archiving videos for 31 DTH channels devoted to telecasting of high-quality educational programmes. During the period under report, INFLIBNET was exclusively assigned Channel No. 29 (PG Subjects & YOGA) for management.

FASSAI'S FSKAN: A System of the network of organizations with the aim to facilitate a scientific cooperation framework by the coordination of activities, the exchange of information, the development and implementation of joint projects within the Food Authority's responsibility. FSSAI has established Food Safety Knowledge Assimilation Network (FSKAN).

Ranking of Institutions and Accreditation Work for NBA and NAAC

India Ranking 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 (NIRF): Launched in September 2015, the first edition of India Rankings was launched in 2016. The INFLIBNET Centre developed a portal to capture data required for ranking of institutes. The Centre also provided data on publications, citations and patents for all applicant institutes.

e-NBA: National Board of Accreditation (NBA) has assigned the task of developing a full-fledged online platform for accreditation workflow management system for technical institutes since December 2017.

ARIIA: ARIIA is an initiative of MHRD to systematically rank all major higher educational institutions and universities in India on indicators related to "Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development" amongst students and faculties. INFLIBNET is a technical partner.

NAAC: NAAC has assigned the job of providing publications, citations, H-index and other related bibliometric data to NAAC for institutions that are to be accredited since November 2017.

• VIDWAN and Indian Research Information Management System (IRINS)

VIDWAN: Project assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in May 2014 by NME-ICT.VIDWAN consists of detailed profiles of more than 0.30 lakh Indian scientists and faculty members working in 4,151+ academic institutions.

Indian Research Information Network System (IRINS): Project proposal was accepted by MHRD and assigned to the INFLIBNET Centre in December 2018 under NMEICT Phase II.IRINS is web-based Research Information Management (RIM) service that facilitates the academic, R&D organisations and faculty members, scientists to collect, curate and showcase the scholarly communication activities and provide an opportunity to create the scholarly network.

Website Development and Maintenance

The Centre maintains a comprehensive website in English and Hindi for all its activities. RSS (Real Simple Syndication) technology is used to facilitate users and bloggers to harvest recent updates from the Centre's website. Web 2.0 features and functionalities including Wiki, Blog, Chat and Discussion Forum, RSS feed, etc. have been incorporated in the Website.

• Web Portals on Various Government Initiatives (on behest of MHRD in the year 2018 - 2019)

Study in India: Study in India is a web portal designed for foreign students seeking to study in India. It provides all the information one needs on Indian education institutions in India, how to plan their studies, how and where to stay in India, what kind of events are planned, application processes, etc. The core part of the portal is institute login (where institute can define their seats to the foreign students) and student login (where a registered student can participate in the choice filling, including mock counselling and final counselling).

Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat (EBSB): A portal hosts details of events being organised by different states. Events include a cultural programme, academic programme, etc. EBSB is designed to promote the spirit of national integration through a deep and structured engagement between all Indian States and Union Territories through a year-long planned engagement between States.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) for Institutes: A platform cum database of all institutes who are participating in UBA 2.0.

Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT): PMMMNMTT is a Scheme launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The aim of the scheme to improve the quality of the school and higher education by addressing comprehensively all issues related to more than 1,00,000 college and university teachers, teaching, teacher preparation, professional development, Curriculum Design, Designing and Developing Assessment. INFLIBNET Centre is providing web and technical development support.

Scheme for Higher Education Youth for Apprenticeship and Skills (SHREYAS): SHREYAS is a programme conceived for students in degree courses, primarily non-technical, with a view to introduce employable skills into their learning, promote apprenticeship as integral to education and also amalgamate employment facilitating efforts of the Government into the education system so that clear pathways towards employment opportunities are available to students during and after their graduation. INFLIBNET Centre provides web technology and development support.

National Testing Agency (NTA): INFLIBNET Centre provides website development and technical support to NTA. The portal facilitates platform which automates the complete administrative and management process of "Exam Observer", "Training Practice Centre", Mobile-app, etc.

• UGC Web Site and e-Governance @ UGC.

The UGC assigned the responsibility for the development and maintenance of its website to INFLIBNET, that include automation of its various schemes, Grant Management System and e-Scholarship-Fellowship Award Registration Tracking System (e-SARTS) etc.

e-Governance @ **UGC-Schemes**: INFLIBNET Centre has developed more than 30 web services for UGC for its scholarship, fellowships, travel assistance, General Development Assistance, women hostel, Autonomous and Heritage institutions, Distance Education, etc.

• Capacity Building Programme.

Since its establishment INFLIBNET Centre has actively involved in various capacity building programmes i.e. in-house and offsite workshops, conferences, seminars, specialized training programs etc., till now the Centre has trained 0.61 lakh professional through 797 such programmes. During the period under the report, the Centre conducted 29 training programmes, workshops and other events that were attended by 769 participants.

5.10(vi) Consortium for Educational Communication(CEC)/Media Centres



To produce quality programmes indigenously and on sustained basis for countrywide classroom (CWCR), UGC set up Media Centres in premier University of India. The academician working in various departments of universities and Scientist in laboratories were invited to share their knowledge with the nation on the Indian Television Network from 6 Media Centres in the beginning the number has now grown to 22. The programme production facilities are in the form (e) Educational Media Research Centre (EMRCs) located in various parts of the country.

The Consortium for Educational Communication popularly known as CEC is one of the Inter University Centres set up by the University Grant Commission (UGC) of India. Established in 1993, it serves the goal of addressing the needs of Indian Higher Education through the use of electronic and new media along with the appropriate use of emerging Information and Communication Technologies (ICT). CEC is a nodal agency to address the educational needs of the country by creating and disseminating multimedia content and educational videos for higher education through broadcast and non- broadcast modes. It has 21 Educational and Multimedia Research Centres (EMRCs) as consortium members also known as Media Centers.

Production

CEC and its media centres engage in the production of various types of educational video programmes-both curriculum based and Enrichment based (for supplementary learning). These programmes cover different subjects across four bands/streams:

- 1. Language/ Literature/Art and Culture
- 2. Social Sciences
- 3. Management and other professional subjects
- 4. Sciences/ Technology

Courseware e-Content

CEC by now has a knowledge repository of approx. 39759Educational Videos. Also, 24,000 e-content courseware are produced in 87 non-technology undergraduate (UG) subjects covering above mentioned 4 knowledge streams and available in English largely and in Hindi. The entire collection is being digitized to render the video programme more user friendly and digitally compatible ensemble with a long shelf life and enhanced portability.

Enrichment Videos

A total number of 19003 enrichment videos were produced by CEC and Media Centres covering different subjects as supplement educational content.

Short Learning Objects (SLOs)

In additional with these educational and enrichment videos, CEC has also produced a total no of 19000Short Learning Objectives (SLOs). These are short duration videos embedded with text and multimedia content based on frequently asked questions on varied topics across different subjects for the enhanced learning experience.

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)

CEC has developed 330 MOOCs by repurposing existing e-content and in process of producing 50 MOOCs by developing fresh content. Till date CEC has offered 61 MOOCs on SWAYAM having more than 70,000 registered students for Jan.-June 2019 Semester and 91 courses are proposed for July – Dec. 2019 semester.

• Dissemination

Today, CEC is the Largest Digital Educational Content Repository in India with a wide range of educational content/ program formats available for the benefits of lakhs of learners. The production of such learning content has not only risen exponentially but also more innovative formats of learning have been included. It has developed unique and diverse range of media platforms for making digital educational content within the reach and access of learners across India and beyond. Today CEC uses following learning platforms:

CEC has played a key role in bringing academicians and media professionals on a common platform by organizing conventions, workshops and seminars for the advancement of education through media and the use of ICT. CEC is regularly organizing training programmes and workshops as a part of its capacity building efforts in the field of higher education; it trains educators and media professionals working in various colleges, institutions and media centres in ICT applications in education. Besides this, in order to instill optimum productivity in its employees, CEC organizes training for the technical staff of the media centres which are functioning in different universities/institutions all over the country. CEC also organizes training workshops and educational programs for its employees, aiming at better productivity, competence and efficiency. CEC and EMRCs also offer hands on training / internship programs for media students in the areas of media production and broadcast. The Consortium undertakes Teacher training in production of e-learning material and its adoption in pedagogy. More than 2000 teachers from universities and colleges across the country are associated with CEC as resource persons for educational content development. Additionally, CEC is associated with reputed agencies like Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA), Media Lab Asia, National Institute of Education, Government of Sri Lanka, Asia-Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development (AIBD), Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia etc. and has organized/participated in conferences and seminars in India and abroad from time to time.

UGC-CEC educational video competition is being organized by CEC since 1988 to encourage excellence in the field of educational video programme production, involving its media centres and other educational institutes. The award includes a cash prize, trophy and certificate given in the following categories such as-Best Educational Programme of the year, Best E-Content Programme of the year, Best Formative Research and Best Script etc.

• Prakriti International Documentary Film Festival

CEC has been organizing an annual documentary film festival, Prakriti, since 1997. For more than two decades, Prakriti as a non-competitive event has travelled acrossthe country, to involve, award and directly encourage local and national film and television producers, and bring forth talent galore. However, for the 1st time ever, Prakriti became a competitive as well as an International festival in year 2018-19, and its reach has expanded up to the entire South-East Asian region. In the past, Prakriti invited entries across 3 categories of Environment, Human Rights and Development. However, the Swachh Bharat category has been introduced as the 4th category for the 1st time. The 3-day festival is organized every year at different institutions /locations across the country. The objective is to create ICT enabled learning environment and spreading awareness about the educational content.

Inter University Centre for Teacher Education (IUCTE), BHU came into existence with its launching by the Honourable Prime Minister of India on 25th December 2014 at Swatantrata Bhawan, BHU, Varanasi. The IUCTE is an autonomous body Registered under society Registration Act 1860 and Established by the University Grants Commission U/S 12 (ccc) of its Act (No. 3 of 1956).

The Honorable Prime Minister also launched the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission for Teacher and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) on the same day. The objectives of IUCTE is to provide impetus to the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission for Teacher and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) that envisages addressing comprehensively all issues related to Teachers, Teaching, Preparations of Teachers, Teachers Educators and their Professional Development, Curriculum, Assessment and Evaluation and developing Effective Pedagogy.

During 2018-19 the IUCTE has undertaken many Academic activities that include Academic Meetings, Conferences, Interactive Sessions and Outdoor activities to benefit large stake holders in School Education and Higher Education as well as the Community. The Institution has very limited facilities, currently running from rented accommodation with meagre space and trying its best to establish own Infrastructure, Human Resource to a way to create a State of Art in the Institutional level to take forward its Objectives & Function.

We are also in process of crystallizing the Vision of the IUCTE which clearly delineating its Short Term & Long Term Goals with a view to instil and nurture Professionalism in Teacher Education and improve Quality Teaching & Learning.

Major Activities in the Academic Calendar of 2018 -19

• International Yoga Day

Inter University Centre for Teacher Education (IUCTE) BHU, organized the International Yoga Day on 21St June, 2018 involving students, teachers and community members. The programme was organized in Swami Shradha Nand Saraswati Inter College Rohaniya, Varanasi. Yoga Instructor conducted Yogic practices as per the protocol of AYUSH, GoI. Around four hundred people participated in the program including teachers, students, officers, staff members and social workers.

Honorable Shri Surendra Narayan Singh MLA, District Magistrate, Prof. B.K. Tripathi, Director IUCTE, District forest Officer, Dr. Anil Singh Social Hesitates, Prof. Alok Rai BHU, Dr. G.N. Tiwari Sr. Consultant, Dr. Anil Tiwary Sr. Administrative Officer from IUCTE participated in the Yoga program.

• Quality learning in Science and Mathematics (23rd June, 2018)

A meeting on "Quality learning in Science and Mathematics" was conducted in the IUCTE, BHU on 23rd June 2018 with the DIETs of the Seven Districts i.e. Varanasi, Bhadohi, Chandauli, Mirzapur, Jaunpur, Ghazipur and Sonbhadra to take the stock of the progress in "Quality Learning in Science and Mathematics" project. Prof. B. K. Tripathi, Director, IUCTE chaired the meeting. The outcome of the Baseline and Terminal Surveys of the program on Science and Mathematics Learning were discussed with all the members to strengthen the project:

- A significant improvement in the achievement score after Terminal Survey was observed.
- The qualitative improvement in the teaching- learning practices of the teachers were reported in all the seven Districts and the DIET principles were of the opinion to extend this program in few more schools in each block of the seven Districts.
- Accordingly, it was proposed to hold a combined meeting of all the principals of the DIET and BSAs by
 the end of July to provide a detailed guideline for the extension of the project in at least ten more schools
 in each block.

• Health and Education: School Based Programme (20th August, 2018)

In a view to review the outcomes of "Quality learning in Science and Mathematics" QLSM programme and to integrate Health with School Education, a meeting on 20th August 2018 was conducted in the IUCTE, BHU with the State Education officers at district level of the Seven Districts i.e. Varanasi, Bhadohi, Chandauli, Mirzapur, Jaunpur, Ghazipur and Sonbhadra, academicians of the Faculty of Education, BHU, Medical Officers and Academicians from Faculty of Modern Medicine, Faculty of Ayurveda, IMS, BHU, and IUCTE. The members made their observations/suggestions on the modified and future course of action regarding extension of ongoing QLSM Programme and inclusion of Health component according to Ayushman Bharat and Health Programme of AYUSH. Further, discussion on Integrated Proposal on Education & Health (IPQHE) was taken up by Director, IUCTE. The components of Ayushman Bharat i.e. Health &Wellness were discussed in which Internet, tele-medicine facilities and Yoga room in the Wellness Centres are used. It was suggested that Asana, Pranayama along with Yamaand Niyama should be adopted for healthy life style among the school going children. Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation are the three basic component of Health Awareness. In the meeting emphasis was given on the uniform implementation of the action plan. The focus was on maintaining same pattern of intervention or a standard package among all these selected schools and on making the programme more accessible by networking among the key players through electronic and digital ways. Qualitative assessment of the teacher could be done by measuring the learning outcome. The performance assessment through Learning Outcome (LOs) was emphasized.

• National Meet of HRDCs (27th to 28th August, 2018)

IUCTE played a mentoring role by providing a platform for Teacher Education for the improvement of the Quality Teacher and Teaching. In this regard, a meeting with HRDCs was organized on $27^{th} - 28^{th}$ August 2018 at IUCTE, BHU. The chief guest of this meeting was Prof. D. P. Singh, Chairman, University Grants Commission, Prof. Rakesh Bhatnagar, VC, BHU, Prof. H.C.S. Rathore, VC, Central University of South Bihar, Gaya. Prof. B. K. Tripathi, Director, IUCTE, BHU, Dr. Archana Thakur, JS, UGC, Prof. G. C. Upadhyay, Academic Consultant, IUCTE, BHU.

In this meeting role of HRDCs in transformation of teachers was emphasized. Directors and the faculties of the HRDCs may be provided opportunity of training in leadership programme, development of MOOCs, Multimedia and other Web based program.

• Teacher's Day (5th September, 2018)

Teachers' day celebrated every year throughout the country on 5th September. It is celebrated to express their gratitude and appreciation for teachers on this day. This day is dedicated to Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan – second President of India. The great academic philosopher, and one of the most well-known diplomats, scholar, president of India and above all a teacher. As a tribute to this great teacher, his birthday has been observed as teachers' day. A celebration conducted by Inter University Center for Teacher Education, BHU on 5th September 2018.

• "Swachhta Hi Seva" (15th September to 2nd October 2018)

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is a campaign by the Government of India to keep the streets, roads and infrastructure of the country's 4,041 statutory cities and towns and its rural areas clean. Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was launched on 2 October 2014 at Rajghat, New Delhi (145th birth anniversary of the Mahatma Gandhi) to fulfil the vision of clean India of Mahatma Gandhi. In continuance of the same IUCTE BHU observed "Swachhta Hi Seva" fortnight from 15th September 2018 to 2nd October 2018 to celebrate the 4th anniversary of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. On this occasion Inter University Center for Teacher Education, BHU organized the informal function of Swachh Pakhwada in Sunder Bagiya, Varanasi on 15th September 2018. National Unity Day (or Rashtriya Ekta Diwas) was introduced by the GoI in 2014 on his to pay tribute to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who played a significant role in uniting India after independence. It is to be celebrated on 31st October everyyear.

The occasion provides us with an opportunity to reaffirm the inherent strength and resilience of our nation so as to withstand the actual and potential threats to the unity, integrity, and security of our country.

• 1st Vision Document Meeting of IUCTE (19th February, 2019)

The Meeting on Vision Document of IUCTE was held at UGC, New Delhi on 19th February, 2019. At the outset Prof. B. K. Tripathi, Director, IUCTE, extended warm welcome to Honourable Chairman UGC, Prof. D.P Singh, Vice Chairman UGC, Prof. Bhushan Patwardhan, Secretary UGC, Prof. Rajnish Jain, officers of UGC and MHRD and esteemed Experts. Prof. Tripathi presented the draft of the Vision Document of IUCTE. Prof. Tripathi, further elaborated that the state of art of In-Service Teacher Education both in school system and higher education institution is to fulfil the need of quality learning. Classroom transaction and the profile of learning achievement clearly reflect deterioration in the quality of teaching learning. Prof. D.P. Singh, Chairman, UGC focused on building teachers in Indian Context The Chairman, further added that advancing new knowledge for teacher educators and development of need based instructional modules may be taken up by the IUCTE. Identification of Phase out targets for present and futuristic context of Indian Teacher should be clearly spelt out in the document. IUCTE may have collaboration with different IUCs like CEC, IUAC, INFLIBNET, IUCYS in the context of Teacher Education

IUCTE has to play major role in identifying possible linkage, collaboration and partnership with the International agencies like Common Wealth Learning. 

5.11(ii) Western Regional Instrumentation Centre (WRIC), Mumbai

Western Regional Instrumentation Centre (WRIC), Mumbai is an autonomous institute and was established in the year 1977 as a part of UGC's comprehensive programme to promote instrumentation. It is fully funded

by the University Grants Commission (UGC). WRIC has been functioning as a Registered Society with a Governing Council of which the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Mumbai is the ex-officio chairperson and which is now been recognized as a National Facility Centre in Instrumentation by UGC.

The major responsibilities of WRIC are to conduct various activities in the field of instrumentation in association with various colleges, universities, national research institutes and industries in the country.

In-House Projects undertaken and completed at TSD during 2018-19

- Instruments designed and developed in-house at WRIC
- 1. Portable calibrator for pH meter, conductivity meter using mobile charger as a power source
- 2. Design and development of Control card for DC Motor speed control with thermal protection
- 3. Design of temperature calibrator source (Thermocouples) for the calibration Temperature controller using mobile charger as a power source
- Instruments designed and developed in-house at WRIC for Training Programmes
- 1. Micro controller base Timer for AC Energy Regulator using Mobile charger as a power source.
- 2. Mille volt Source /Thermocouple and RTD based Temperature Controlled Simulator
- Instruments designed and developed by students as a part of their curriculum at WRIC
- 1. Current source (0-200ma) for the study of spectral response of RGB LEDs
- 2. Digital Temperature calibrator for PID and Digital Temperature controller using PIC microcontroller
- 3. A novel approach for water conservation in agriculture using wireless sensor network

WRIC conducted training programmes / workshops at different colleges, university departments and institutes. This has resulted into a strong interaction between WRIC and various academic institutes and industries that has benefited all.

During the training programmes repaired electronic laboratory, electrical, analytical and optical (microscopes & others) instruments were repaired.

WRIC has various types of calibration standard equipment which is used for calibration of a variety of instruments from educational institutions, Government Organizations and Industries. For the report period, out of 258 instruments received for calibration, 222 instruments were calibrated, 11 tested and 25 instruments were returned to the users as they were beyond repairs.

WRIC offers its expertise in repairing and servicing of laboratory electronic, electrical, analytical and optical instruments to various colleges, institutions and universities in the country. During the report period, out of 173 instruments received for repair, 143 instruments were repaired.

WRIC organizes maintenance camps at K.J. Somaiya College. Aim of this activity is to repair & maintain instruments at an affordable cost.

Workshop Activities

In the Mechanical Workshop, WRIC designed & fabricated various mechanical components required for training programmes, student's projects, R&D Division, Maintenance Section, Calibration Section & other activities of the Centre.

- 3. Mechanical fitting of solar panel on stepper motor.

Library and Information Services

The total number of books in the library is now 4538. In addition to WRIC staff, the Library facilities were used by project students and others.

Internet connectivity been setup and is being used by staff members and other users. This gives access to many full-text e-journals, other related documents, and need-based information about solar panel, solar cell, photovoltatics, solar simulator, electronic components, instruments, circuits, etc.

5.11(iii) Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla

The Inter-University Centre for Humanities and Social Sciences came into existence in January 1991 at the Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla, with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Institute. The IIAS, in its forty-eight old years of existence, has created a niche for itself in the world of scholarship by way of pursuit of higher research and life of scholarly reflection and contemplation. It has a residential scholarly community of over thirty-five Fellows, each engaged in his or her research, but, at the same time, taking active part in the academic life of the community. The Associates of the Inter-University Centre are drawn from colleges and universities across the country and in addition to benefitting from the academic ambience; they also gain from the culture of interdisciplinary.

OBJECTIVES: The academic programme of the Centre has three basic components: (i) scheme of Associateship; (ii) organization of Research Seminars in different parts of the country; and (iii) holding of Study Weeks on issues of national and international interest at the Institute in Shimla.

ASSOCIATESHIP: During the year 2018-19, Seventy Six (76) university and college teachers visited the Institute as IUC Associates from all over the country for a month each at the Institute. All the Associates, who visited the Institute, were highly appreciative of the IUC programme, as is evident from their feedback. The IIAS provides an Associate with adequate library facilities, a quiet, natural academic ambience, an opportunity to interact with the best academic minds – the Associates leave the Institute refreshed and intellectually recharged to pursue their teaching career. The Associates use this period to (a) complete research they might have been engaged in for some time; (b) revise their doctoral dissertation; (c) catch up with their reading in the Institute's library; and (d) write a paper what is presented to their peers and (e) interact with Fellows of the Institute and distinguished occasional visitors from India and abroad. The Associates take part in the Seminars and Conferences, both national and international, which are among the regular activities of the Institute.

IUC Associates: The Associates who visit the Institute have to make one presentation on the topic of their choice specialization before the academic community of the Institute. During the period under report the 76 IUC Associates, who visited the Institute, gave their presentations from 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019. Out of 76 IUC Associates,25 were women (Gen. 22; SC 1; ST -1 and OBC-1) and 51 Men (Gen.32; SC -6; ST-2 and OBC -11) visited the Institute during the period.

5.11(iv) MST Radar Centre, Tirupati

To create scientific awareness about the potential use of the sophisticated radar and other instrumentation facilities for advanced research in the area of atmospheric sciences and to attract bright and young researchers to utilise the MST Radar, Lidar and other co-located Facilities available at NARL, Gadanki; University Grants Commission (UGC) has established an UGC-SVU Centre at S.V. University, Tirupati, to serves as a common platform for the University system in India for the exchange of scientific knowledge and the centre is accessible to scientist and researcher from Indian Universities working in the area of Atmospheric Sciences.

Objectives& Salient Features:

- UGC-SVU Centre is accessible to scientists and researchers from Indian University working in the area of Atmospheric Sciences.
- UGC-SVU Centre provides necessary facilities for research and basic computational and other support for carrying out such research.
- UGC-SVU Centre offers a forum for exchange visits in the area of Atmospheric Science so that the Indian Atmospheric Scientific Community will benefit from such co-operation.
- UGC-SVU Centre helps in training postgraduate students and research fellows in a number of challenging tasks in the thrust area of Atmospheric Physics.
- UGC-SVU Centre assists in coordinating the experimental programme in the area of Atmospheric Dynamics using MST Radar and other co-locatable instrumentation facilities with special reference to the location of these facilities.
- UGC-SVU Centre organizes comprehensive National data bank/archrivals in specified areas of Atmospheric Sciences especially out of the large volume of processed data obtained from MST Radar and other collocated facilities.

 UGC-SVU Centre helps in the generation and updating models for the middle atmosphere over Indian latitudes. Use of such models and data in turn will help in forecasting and prediction by IMD and other concerned national organizations

Budget

Allocation: Rs.41.00 Lakh Grant Released: Rs.40.25 Lakh

5.12 Development of Sports Infrastructure and Equipment in Universities.

The UGC introduced the Scheme of Development of Sports Infrastructure and Equipment in Universities during 2014 with the aim to enhance capacity building in various universities for promotion of sports which would broad base the sporting pyramid and would ultimately produce enough sports persons to participate in elite sports of international and national events to bring pride to the country. 101 Sports Proposals were received from the Universities. The Expert Committee recommended 69 proposals.

Keeping in view the objectives of the Scheme as mentioned above, the Scheme has been designed to offer:

- a) Stage-wise support for gradual development of sports infrastructure starting from the basic to the optimal keeping in view the participation of students in particular games.
- b) The previous performance of the students in particular sports will be taken into consideration for providing support in the form of infrastructure and equipment.
- c) All eligible universities will be provided basic infrastructure facilities as mentioned in stage I, subject to their proposal being found in order by a duly constituted Expert Committee. Subsequent up gradation of grant to stage II or stage III, as the case may be, will be done keeping in view the optimal utilization of the support already provided and /or facilities available in the institution; and
- d) The whole gambit of the Scheme is to provide stage-wise development of infrastructure with proper monitoring every level.

An amount of Rs. 5.72 Crore released during 2018-2019.

Total amount of Rs. 73.68 Crore were released to 69 Universities during 2015-16 to 2018-19.

5.13 Institutions of Eminence

The Government approved the scheme of providing Regulatory Architecture for setting up / upgrading of 20 Institutions (10 from public sector & 10 from private sector) as world class teaching and research institutions called as 'Institutions of Eminence'. The Regulatory Architecture has been provided in the form of UGC (Declaration of Government Institutions as Institutions of Eminence) Guidelines, 2017 for public Institutions and UGC (Institutions of Eminence Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2017 for private Institutions, details for which are available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in/ioe

The selection shall be made through challenge method mode by Empowered Expert Committee constituted for the purpose. The institutions will have freedom to choose their own path to become world class institutions. It is expected that the selected Institution will come up in top 500 of the world ranking in 10 years and in top 100 eventually over the time. To achieve the top world ranking, these Institutions shall be provided with greater autonomy viz. to admit foreign students up to 30% of admitted students; to recruit foreign faculty upto 25% of faculty strength; to offer online courses upto 20% of its programmes; to enter into academic collaboration with top 500 in the world ranking Institutions without permission of UGC; free to fix and charge fees from foreign students without restriction; flexibility of course structure in terms of number of credit, hours and years

to take a degree; complete flexibility in fixing of curriculum and syllabus, etc. Public Institution to be selected as 'Institutions of Eminence' will get financial assistance uptoRs. 1000 Crore each under this scheme.

The Empowered Expert Committee (EEC) constituted to effect the selection of 20 high potential institutions under the provisions of the UGC's 2017 Regulations and Guidelines had submitted its first report (May 10, 2018) to the UGC wherein it had identified and recommended the following 8 Public Institutions and 3 Private Institutions to be covered under the scheme.

However the UGC, invoking a principle of equal weightage to both Private and Public Institutions, gave its approval to only 3 Public Institutions and 3 Private Institutions and further action was initiated by UGC in those cases by issue of LOIs and calling for MoUs, which work is nearing completion.

The EEC has submitted its second list of recommended institutions to the UGC which are as follows.

The Commission in its 538th meeting held on 29th January, 2019 considered the 2nd report and recommendations of the Empowered Expert Committee (EEC) and resolved to seek clarification from the Government whether additional 10 Institutions (over and above the original mandate of 10 public and 10 private institutions) can be considered? Further decision will be taken after receiving clarification from the Government.

Financial Progress - The application fee of ₹ one crore each was deposited in IoE account. A total of 30 institutions were recommended by EEC. The non-selected institutions i.e. 83 institutions are to be refunded with Rs.75 lakhs each as per the guidelines and regulations of IoE. Funds will be allocated by the MHRD directly to the approved IoE public institutions.

5.14 Promotion of Quality Research Papers

Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE)

With a view to redefine and consider issues related to UGC approved list of journals, agenda item was placed in the 536th meeting of the Commission held on 14th November, 2018, dissolving the Standing Committee for "UGC approved list of Journals" and suggested for constitution of the Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE).

The Commission considered and approved the constitution of the Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE) for preparation of a new list of credible quality journals for disciplines such as Social Science, Humanities Languages, Arts, Culture, Indian Knowledge System etc. The Commission also suggested that the CARE should involve relevant Statutory Councils/Academic Bodies.

In response to the above decision of the Commission, a public notice dated 28th November, 2018 was issued with pointwise details about the approach to be adopted with a view to refine and strengthen UGC list of approved journals. An advisory to all the Councils/Government bodies was also issued on 5th December, 2018. First meeting of the Consortium for Academic and Research Ethics (CARE) was held on 19th December, 2018 wherein representatives of all the concerned councils/academic bodies attended the meeting for way forward. A Sub Committee of two-members constituted for creation of UGC Cell for analysis of journals was held on 7th December, 2018. The committee appointed Savitribai Phule Pune University to establish UGC Cell for Journal Analysis at its campus and identified the following four regional universities to facilitate the process of receiving proposals from institutions in their region concerned for consideration for inclusion of journals in the CARE List of Journals":

- Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi (Northern Region) 1.
- 2. University of Hyderabad, Hyderabad (Southern Region)
- 3. Tezpur University (Eastern Region)
- 4 MS University of Baroda, Baroda (Western Region)

A meeting of the CARE members from various Councils was held on 19th December, 2018 to evolve a process/criteria for evaluation of journal and to maintain/selection of a list of credible and quality journals / streamline academic journal evaluation and promotion of academic ethics. Representatives from the various Statutory Councils/Government bodies attended the meeting.

CARE Committee constituted an Empowered Committee (EC-CARE) to look into the issues pertaining to CARE under the Chairmanship of Vice Chairman, UGC and in its first meeting held on 27th December, 2018, recommended the following:

UGC cell at SPPU and CARE activity at four regional universities should be functional at the earliest. INFLIBNET should work as supporting agency.

- 2. UGC cell at CPE-SPPU should circulate final protocol to the EC members after including suggestions from CARE members from social sciences, humanities and languages.
- 3. A budget of Rs 25 lakh/year for UGC cell at CPE-SPPU and Rs 6 lakh/year for the regional universities is approved. Budgetary needs of INFLIBNET if any may be considered at later stage.
- 4. The four Universities identified for CARE purpose (CARE Universities) should receive suggestions for journals from Universities in their respective regions. A suitable notification may be sent by the UGC to all the Universities to this effect.
- 5. For the purpose better clarity CARE list may be divided in four sections:
- o Group A: Research Journals in disciplines under Science, Engineering, Technology, Agriculture and Bio Medical Sciences indexed in SCOPUS and/or Web of Science (WOS).
- o Group B: Journals already analyzed by CPE SPPU that can be included in CARE list.
- o Group C: Journals from social sciences, humanities, languages and Indian knowledge systems suggested by CARE member councils/bodies.
- o Group D: All new Journals recommended by CARE universities/ councils/bodies.

Chairman, UGC inaugurated UGC Cell for Journal Analysis" at SPPU, Pune on 4th January, 2019.

In the second meeting of the CARE-EC held on 18th March, 2019, the Committee was appraised of the establishment of Centre for Publication Ethics, at S.P. Pune University, and enumerated various activities initiated by the University, as given below:

- The UGC Cell comprising 8 members carry out the journal analysis
- It manages the University portal
- It carry out the plagiarism check
- Designed the two credit course entitled "Research and Publication Ethics" which will be made compulsory for all Ph.D. students in their first year of registration.

Members from the CARE Universities also provided an update on the status of the work done at their Universities for recommendation of the journals. The following were the main recommendations of CARE-EC:

- 1. Necessary amendments should be done in UGC Gazette notifications for consideration of CARE Journals in place of UGC-Approved List of Journals.
- 2. UGC will issue a clear notification on applicability of the CARE List of journals for consideration of various purposes. Being a dynamic list of journals, the list of journals will be applicable as per the date on which respective journal is included / excluded.
- 3. UGC Journal Analysis Cell will also maintain a blacklist of journals for internal use. This list can be made public at appropriate time in future.
- 4. The CARE may consider on specific request, re-evaluation of rejected journals in next year cycle. two-credit course regarding publication ethics and being taken by all research scholars and suggested that UGC may recommend this course for researchers in all universities.
- 5. The two credit course entitled "Research and Publication Ethics" designed by S.P. Pune University should be made compulsory for all Ph.D. students as pre registration course work.

CARE website https://ugccare.unipune.ac.in was opened for the public after the same was finalized by the CARE-EC. The CARE List was uploaded on 14.06.2019 on the CARE website and a public notice on Academic Integrity was also issued and uploaded on 14th June, 2019 covering all the aspects related to CARE.

5.15 Graded Autonomy to Promote and Institutionalize Excellence in Higher Education

Recognising the need to create an enabling environment whereby Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) can become institutions of global excellence, autonomy is pivotal to promote and institutionalize excellence in higher education. The regulatory framework has recognized this need and towards this direction, the UGC (Categorisation of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 have been notified

on 12th February, 2018. These regulations are aimed to provide autonomy to the HEIs based on quality benchmarks.

Under these Regulations, Universities having NAAC scrore of 3.51 or above or those who have received a corresponding score/grade from a reputed accreditation agency empanelled by the UGC or have been ranked among top 500 of reputed world rankings are placed in Category-I. Universities having NAAC score of 3.26 and above, upto 3.50 or have received a corresponding accreditation grade/score from a reputed Accreditation Agency empanelled by the UGC are placed in Category-II. The Universities which do not come under the above two categories are placed in Category-III.

5.16 Quality Mandate: A new initiative of UGC

The Commission, in its 532nd meeting held on 24-05-2018, approved the objectives set for improving the quality in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). All HEIs shall strive to achieve the following Objectives by 2022:

- 1. Improve the graduate outcomes for the students, so that at least 50% of them secure access to employment/self-employment or engage themselves in pursuit of higher education.
- 2. Promote link of the students with the society/industry such that at least 2/3rd of the students engage in socially productive activities during their period of study in the institutions.
- 3. Train the students in essential professional and soft skills such as team work, communication skills, leadership skills, time management skills etc; inculcate human values and professional ethics, and the spirit of innovation/entrepreneurship and critical thinking among the students and promote avenues for display of these talents.
- 4. Ensure that teacher vacancies at any point of time does not exceed 10% of the sanctioned strength; and 100% of the teachers are oriented about the latest and emerging trends in their respective domains of knowledge, and the pedagogies that translate their knowledge to the students.
- 5. Every institution shall get NAAC accreditation with a minimum score of 2.5 by 2022.

The following initiatives shall be undertaken in pursuit of the above objectives:

- (i) **Induction programme** for students.
- (ii) **Learning outcome**-based curriculum framework revision of curriculum in regular intervals.
- (iii) Use ICT based learning tools for effective teaching-learning process.
- (iv) **Soft skills** for students.
- (v) **Social and Industry connect** for every institution: Every institution shall adopt at least 5 villages for exchange of knowledge and for the overall social/economic betterment of the village communities.
- (vi) **Examination Reforms** test the concept, and application; exit examinations.
- (vii) Tracking of the student progress after completion of course.
- (viii) **Induction training for all new teachers**, and annual refresher training for all teachers role of the NRCs; and mandatory leadership/management training for all educational administrators.
- (ix) **Promoting quality research** by faculty and creation of new knowledge.
- (x) **Mentoring of non-accredited institutions**, so that every institution can get accreditation by 2022.

Higher Education is a dynamic Phenomenon. The Teaching and Learning process, which imbibes skills in a learner gets further strengthened if it is integrated with research. Research keeps the process of inequity vibrant and alive. On promotion of Research UGC resolved to enhance research productivity of our respective institutions by orienting teachers and students to participate in competition based funding schemes. The UGC is financially been supporting research projects of various University and College teachers since early seventies.

6.1 Major Research Projects for Teachers

The UGC has been providing financial assistance for the Research Proposals of the permanent, regular, working/retired teachers in the Universities and Colleges which are enlisted under section 2 (f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The Major Research Projects scheme enables them to carry out intensive and in-depth research studies in specific subject areas with their regular job or after superannuation. Research Project may be undertaken by an individual teacher or a group of teachers or by a department as a whole. It can also be undertaken by a retired teacher up to the age of 70, provided the age at the time of applying is not more than 67 years. Priority is given to inter-disciplinary research and inter-institutional collaborative research.

Quantum of Assistance in Maajor Research Project in Sciences including Engineering & Technology, Medicine, Pharmacy Agriculture etc. is Rs.20.00 lakhs and in Humanities, Social Science, Languages, Literature, Arts, Law and allied disciplines is Rs.15.00 lakhs.

The assistance provided for a Major Research Project includes funding for Equipment, Books and Journals, Chemicals and Consumables, Contingencies, Travel & Field work, Hiring Services, Fellowship to Project Fellow and other items required for the project.

During the year 2018-19 there were on going 227 Beneficiaries (Project / Teachers) in Humanities and 861 Beneficiaries (Project / Teachers) in Sciences.

Total amount of Rs. 11.45 Crore released to beneficiaries during 2018-19.

6.2 Research Awards / Research Scientist

6.2(i) Research Awards

The main objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to permanent teachers of Universities/ Institutions having doctorate degree to pursue research in their area(s) of specialization without undertaking any research guidance for a period of two years extendable by one year on the recommendation of the expert committee in exceptional cases. Selections are made for 100 slots in alternate years for all the disciplines of Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology based on the recommendations of an expert Committee constituted by the UGC. An expenditure of Rs. 5.80 crore was incurred during 2018-19.

6.2(ii) Research Scientist

The scheme of Research Scientists was originally initiated in 1983 to attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin, who may be working abroad, with a view to promoting high quality research in Science, Engineering/Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences at three levels:

- 1. Research Scientist 'A' (Lecturer)
- 2. Research Scientist 'B' (Reader)
- 3. Research Scientist 'C' (Professor)

This an old scheme & presently 24 Research Scientists are on UGC roll. An expenditure of Rs. 1.89 crore was incurred during 2018-19.

6.3 Post Doctoral Fellowships

6.3 (i) Post-Doctoral Fellowships for SC/ST Candidates

The objective of the fellowship Scheme is to provide fellowships to SC/ST candidates, who have obtained a doctorate degree and have published research work to their credit for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. For this purpose, the UGC has been providing 100 slots every year for them. Detailed guidelines of the scheme can be accessed on the UGC website.

An expenditure of Rs. 25.95 Crore was incurred to 460 Beneficiaries under the Scheme during 2018-19.

6.3(ii) Post Doctoral Fellowship for Women

The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to unemployed women candidates holding Ph.D. degree and intending to pursue post-doctoral research in Science, Engineering and Technology,

Humanities and Social Sciences. At present, UGC has been providing 100 fellowships per annum. An expenditure of Rs. 32.72 crore was incurred to 591 Beneficiaries under the Scheme during 2018-19.

6.3(iii) Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences including languages

The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to carry out the advanced studies and research in Humanities and Social Sciences including languages to the candidates having Ph.D degree in the relevant subject. The total no. of slots available under this scheme are 200 per year. An expenditure of Rs. 18.63 crore was incurred to 454 Beneficiaries under the scheme during 2018-19.

6.3(iv) DR.D.S. Kothari Post Doctoral Fellowship

Under this scheme financial assistance is provided to the research fellows to pursue Post-doctoral research in Basic Sciences / Medical / Engineering and Technology. The selections are made through-out the year. There is designated website for applying for the fellowship *ugcdskpdf.unipune.ac.in*. The selection process is completed within 6-weeks of the receipt of individual application. The Candidates who have either received a Ph. D degree or submitted their Ph. D thesis are eligible to apply. Till date <u>2661</u> candidates have been awarded the fellowship and <u>1364</u> PDFs are in position. Since, January 2013 the fellowship disbursing through the Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) scheme (where the fellowship is transfered directly to the beneficiaries bank account).

6.3(v) UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship

The main objective of the scheme is to facilitate talented teachers in Science & Technology who are at the verge of superannuation to continue their productive research for an additional period of three years after superannuation and to play a research mentorship role for young researchers and Ph.D. students.

Financial Assistance under the scheme shall be: 50,000/- p.m. (exclusive of the pension and / or other retirement benefits), and a research grant of 5,00,000/- p.a.

An amount of Rs.11.14 crores was released to 104 BSR Faculty Fellows.

6.3(vi) Emeritus Fellowship

The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years, of all recognized universities and colleges under UGC Act, to pursue active research in their respective field of specialization. The eligibility for this fellowship is based on the quality of research and published work contributed by the teachers in his or her service career. The number of slots available under this scheme are 100 for science stream and 100 for Humanities, Social Sciences and Languages (total 200 slots) at any one given time basis. An expenditure of Rs. 3.82 Crore was incurred to 169 beneficiaries under the scheme during 2018-19.

6.4 Research Fellowships (Junior Research Fellowships/Research Associateships) for M.Phil / Ph.D

6.4(i) JRF for Indian Nationals 2018-19

The UGC has schemes of fellowships to the research scholars to undertake research in the fields of Science, Humanities and Social Sciences. The fellowships provided by the UGC are not only supporting these researchers financially but also encouraging them to pursue their doctoral research in a very intensive and independent manner.

Award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences

To provide an opportunity to the scholars to undertake advanced studies and research leading to M. Phil/Ph.D. Degrees in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences including languages. University Grants Commission provides JRF to the candidates who qualify National Eligibility Testing (NET/JRF) of the UGC and the UGC-CSIR Joint Test. The total tenure of fellowship is for five years. With effect from 01.01.2019 the rate of JRF / SRF fellowship has been enhanced from Rs. 25,000/- to Rs. 31,000/- and Rs. 28,000/- to Rs. 35,000/- respectively. The other terms and conditions remain same as per the XII plan guidelines. The pattern of the fellowship is as under:-

An expenditure of Rs.740.00 **crore** has been incurred during the year 2018-19 under JRF in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. There are 9400 slots per annum under JRF. At present 24,850 Beneficiaries are pursuing M. Phil/Ph.D. under JRF. The UGC has started e-payment directly to the accounts of JRF's/SRF's w. e. f. Dec, 2012 onwards and from 1st July 2016 all JRF & SRF fellowships under legacy cases and fresh entries are given through DBT mode.

Followings are the achievements during 2018-2019:-

- 1. All the cases have come under Direct Beneficiary Transfer scheme.
- 2. Fellowship payments have been transferred to 24,850 JRF's/SRF's during the year.
- 3. Monthly Payment System has been initiated on the portal from October 2018

6.4(ix) BSR Fellowship (RFSMS)

The Research Fellowship in Sciences for meritorious students BSR scheme of the UGC is open to candidates who are selected for registering to the Ph.D. programme of the university through a procedure outlined already in the UGC notification by a regular admission procedure. The objective of the BSR scheme is to provide

opportunities to meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in sciences. The BSR Fellowship have been merged with UGC-NET Fellowship w.e.f. 2016.

The candidates who are selected for registering to the Ph.D. programme of the university through a procedure outlined already in the UGC notification by a regular admission procedure in Universities with Potential for Excellence/Centres with Potential for Excellence / Centres of Advance Studies and Department of Special Assistance identified by UGC.. The registration for Ph.D. may follow after the admissions. 9355 fellowships had been allocated to SAP/Non-SAP departments and 3550 JRFs are in position. Since, December 2013 the fellowship disbursing through the Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) scheme (where the fellowship is transfered directly to the beneficiaries' bank account).

An amount of Rs.62.94 crores was released during the year 2018-2019.

6.4(x) Scheme of Non-NET Fellowship in Central Universities

Non-NET Fellowship for M.Phil/Ph.D in Central Universities started in 2006-07 after obtaining the approval of the Commission vide its 433rd meeting of the Commission held on 27th December, 2006.

An amount of Rs. 113.38 Lakh has been released to all Central Universities during 2018-19 under the Scheme.

6.5 Post Graduate Scholarships

6.5(i) Post-Graduate Scholarships for SC/ST Students in Professional courses

Keeping in view the social background of the candidates from deprived sections of the society, the scheme has been initiated to provide them an opportunity to undertake post-graduate level studies in professional courses. The tenure of the scholarship is for two/three years depending upon the duration of Degree course. The number of slots make available to them is 1000 every year.

6.5(ii) Post-Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarships for Single Girl Child

The Govt. of India has taken various steps to uplift the status of women by implementing various schemes/ programmes including free education for girls, declaration of elementary education as a basic human right of every child. The Indira Gandhi Post-graduate Scholarship for Single Girl Child Scheme is one of such schemes, with an aim to compensate direct cost of girl education at all levels especially for such girls who happened to be only girl child in the families.

The objectives of the scheme are to support Post-graduate education of single girl child in non-professional courses and to recognize the value of observance of small family norms.

The scheme was started with the postgraduate academic session 2005-07. Only single girl child of her parents and who has taken admission in regular, full time first year Masters degree course (Non-professional course) in any recognized university or a postgraduate college is eligible for the scholarship. The scholarship is available for the full duration of the course. Girl students up,to the age of 30 years at the time of admission in PG courses are eligible. All eligible girl children will get the scholarship. There is no cap restriction on the number of scholarships.

It is expected from the institutions where students had taken admission in the first year PG course, no tuition fees will be charged by the institute from the girl students to pursue PG degree course in Universities/ Colleges/ Institutions covered under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act.

The scholarship may be tenable for a period of two years to enable the rank holders of each university at Undergraduate level to pursue their Master's degree. All universities/degree awarding institutions would be required to issue rank certificates to the toppers of the university (not at college level) both in General and Honors courses namely B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com.

The rank holders would be considered only from those affiliating universities wherein at least 100 students/ and in Deemed Universities/Autonomous/non-affiliated colleges at least 25 students have appeared in the examination at the UG level. Slots: - 3000 per year



6.7 Free Education for Sports Medal Winners/Participants of National/ International Events

Free Education for Sports Medal Winners/Participants of National/ International Events has been introduced under XII Plan in UGC. The objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance to the medal winners in national games or participants in recognized international sporting events recognized by World University Service, International Olympic Committee and Olympic Committee of Asia (OCA)\. Elite sports persons who are studying in Universities/Colleges leading to all the full time regular courses including PG Diploma and other professional courses.

The financial assistance on reimbursement basis is given to the universities/colleges/institutions of national importance on the basis of the details received individually depending upon the eligibility of the students as per UGC guidelines. The university will be responsible for submitting all relevant documents duly attested and verified as per the proforma prescribed by the UGC. Detailed guidelines of the scheme can be accessed on the UGC website.

There are 70 Beneficiaries are under the Scheme.

Basic Scientific Research Programmes in Universities

The M/HRD had set up a Task Force for rejuvenation of Basic Scientific Research in Indian Universities under the Chairmanship of Prof. M.M. Sharma, former Director, UICT, Mumbai. The M/HRD constituted the First Empowered Committee in May, 2005 under the Chairmanship of Prof.M.M.Sharma, former Director, UICT, Mumbai for implementation of recommendations of the Task Force. The Committee worked for almost 8 years till March, 2014. Subsequently, The Second Empowered Committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Dr. Anil Sahasrabudhe, in November, 2014 for implementation of recommendations of the Task Force.

Based on the recommendation of the Task Force following schemes are being implemented by UGC under the guidance of Empowered Committee.

6.9(i) Faculty Recharge Programme (FRP)

Operation Faculty Recharge was launched in the year 2011, under which 1000 faculty positions have been created and to be filled at national level through global advertisement. A Cell has been created in JNU for implementation of this scheme with Prof. R.P. Gandhi as National Co-ordinator and Prof. Sudesh Nangia as Associate Co-ordinator of the Cell. Now, the FRP Cell has been merged with BSR Section. At present 373 faculties i.e. Professor / Assistant Professor / Associate Professor have been selected, out of which 185 are in positions.

The tenure of appointment of faculties i.e. Professor / Associate Professor / Assistant Professor is 5 years, following a peer review. 'Faculty Recharge' positions can, in principle, is carried through to superannuation (at 65 years). There is provision for mid-term evaluation during each of the five year tenures.

Financial Assistance: Salary: The UGC-faculty receives emoluments at par with those of the Central University faculty. **Additional Grants:** Faculty positions carry a start-up grant of Rs.10.00 Lakhs to research.

During the year i.e. 2018-2019 so far Rs.13.32 crores in respect of Salaries to 160 Selectees and Start up Grant to 30 Candidates from various Universities/Institutions.

The Commission in its meeting held on 2nd September, 2016 has resolved to withdraw the FRP programme, prospectively under the scheme of Basic Scientific Research.

6.9(ii) NET Working Research Centres: Summer Winter School

The networking resource centers are established with the following objectives:

- 1. Research, training and skills development of the faculty and research scholars through periodic discussion, workshop and summer / winter schools.
- 2. Capacity building by adopting faculty and departments for augmenting their research skills and to mentor them.
- 3. Hosting and facilitating researcher from other institutes / universities to carryout keys experiments.
- 4. Augmentation of information resource facility of the department to provide quality research information to other institutes / researchers.
- 5. To enhance and build state of the art in-house research infrastructure and other research facilities in the department.

The following 10 departments were approved by the Empowered Committee for the establishment of Networking Research Centres under BSR Programme.

During the year 2018-2019, so far Rs.4.81 crores was released for above Centres.

6.9(iii) Start up Grant for Newly Recruited Faculty

Under this scheme, all teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor with Ph.D. degree with minimum two research publications in approved / cited journals are eligible. The Assistant Professor

should apply within a period of six months from the date of joining the post in the Department/University against permanent post in the faculties of Basic Science, Engineering and Technology following the specified procedure of university will be eligible to receive financial support.

- 1. The quantum of support under the scheme is Rs.10 lakhs.
- 2. The grant can be utilized for purchasing items like minor equipment, consumables, contingencies (maximum Rs.50,000/- p.a.), fieldwork (maximum Rs.50,000/- p.a.), travel etc.
- 3. The grant cannot be used for international travel or for appointing project assistant or research fellow.
- 4. The quantum of funds under these heads can be decided by the PI depending on his / her needs.

An amount of Rs.11.96 Crores was released to 181 newly appointed faculty members for various Universities / Institutions.

6.9(iv) MID CAREER AWARD to Teachers under BSR Programme

Under this MID CARRER AWARD "Scheme, Rs.10.00 lakh is provided for a teacher to do research. The grant could be utilized for minor equipment, chemicals contingency and field work.

The purpose of providing one time grant to teachers is to pursue their research in their specialized areas. The minimum eligibility criteria is as given below:-

- a) The applicant must have successfully supervised the Ph.D. dissertation of 15 full-time candidates, 5 of whom should have received their degrees during the preceding 5 years.
- *b)* The applicant must have successfully completed at least 5 sponsored research projects funded by national / international government or private agencies.
- *c)* The applicant should have a minimum 3 years of service left in the University from the date of submission of his / her application.
- *d)* The cumulative impact factor of the published papers by the applicant should be ≥ 30 (according to the Journal Citation Reports of Thomson Reuters).

An amount of Rs.2.09 crores was released to 28 teachers who are pursuing their research in various Indian Universities / Institutions.

Gender & Social Equity

- 7.1 Development of Women's Studies in Indian Universites and Colleges

- 7.3 Representation of Social Category, Minority, PWD Students and Teachers In Higher Education

7.1 Development of Women's Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges

The UGC programme for promotion of women's Studies envisages financial assistance to universities and colleges for setting up centres and cells for Women's Studies. The Centres/Cells are required to undertake research, develop curricula and organize training and extension work in the areas of gender equity, economic self-reliance of women, girls education, population issues, issues of human rights, social exploitation, etc. These activities are expected to contribute not only to social awareness and change but also to academic development.

Guidelines of Women Studies Centres (WSC): The broad spectrum of Women Studies that emerged in the early years of this century was included in the 11th and 12th Plan by UGC. After 12th plan period ended in 2017, a standing committee for women studies was constituted by the MHRD, Government of India to further strengthen Centres for Women Studies in the light of United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN-SDG) of Promoting Equality and Empowerment of Women.

Over this background, the guidelines were developed with objective parameters and uploaded on UGC website. These Guidelines of Women Studies Centres (WSCs) may be treated as Draft Guidelines. UGC invites feedback from all the stakeholders till 5th April, 2019 on wscugc2019@gmail.com.

It is reiterated that UGC is committed for the cause of promoting equality and empowerment of women. On the basis of the feedback of the stakeholders, the guidelines will be finalized. The Final Guidelines will be made available on UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in.

At present 159 Women's Studies Centres (WSC) have been established in various Universities and Colleges.

As per decision of the Commission 's meeting held on 22.12.2017, no grant will be released after XII plan to those institutes whose Review Performance have not been received yet.

An amount of Rs. 7.00 Crore released to the Women Studies Centres from 2012-13 to 2018-19.

Programmes for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes (excluding creamy layer), Minorities and Persons with Disabilities

The University Grants Commission is making continuous and special efforts for ensuring facilities for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes at the level of higher education in the light of suggestions made by the Government of India and the Commission for Scheduled Castes/Tribes from time to time. These measures include reservation of seats in various courses offered by the Universities & Colleges, reservation in recruitment to teaching and Non-teaching posts, provision of seats in Hostels, Scholarships, fellowships, remedial courses, special assistance to colleges in Tribal areas etc.

According to the Central Education Institutions Act, 2006, 15% and 7.5% reservation in admission is reserved for SCs, and STs respectively, which encourage SC and ST students to continue Higher Education and make it mandatory on the part of the Institutions to enroll a certain percentage of SC and ST students in their intake. Efforts are taken for continued implementation of the act. The UGC has forwarded the central Educational Institutions (Reservations in Admission) Amendment Act, 2012 to all Universities vide letter No.F.1-5/2006 (SCT) dated 19.12.2012 for compliance and necessary action as per the Gazette Notification no. 31 of 2012.

7.2(a) Establishment of SC/ST Cell in each of the institution is mandated as per instructions of the Govt. of India vide letter no. 43011/153/2010-Est.(Res) dated 04.01.2013. Further, UGC vide its D.O. letter No. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 8th June, 2015 requested all Central Universities and UGC funded deemed to be Universities to comply the instructions of DoPT for setting up of special Reservation Cell for enforcement of orders of reservations in Posts and services and other related works. The Commission in its 535th meeting held on 27th September, 2018 resolved to establish a SC/ST cell in newly established centrally funded universities where the SC/ST cell does not exist. For establishment of Cell, the Commission has approved the non-teaching positions.

7.2(b) Guidelines for implementation of Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) and Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP) in University Grants Commission released after approval by 529th Commission meeting of UGC dated 8th February, 2018. Ministry of HRD allocates earmarked funds for SCSP and TSP to the extent of 15% and 7.5%, as a consequential step UGC should monitor that funds to the extent earmarked for SCSP and TSP are not diverted elsewhere. For this purpose, separate sanction letter should be issued for SCSP and TSP funds. UGC should obtain utilization certificate in respect of each of the three component viz general category, SCSP and TSP indicating inter alia the funds utilized during the year and unspent balance to be carried forward in the next financial year. UGC has also opened separate bank accounts for SC and ST funds managements.

7.2(c) Prevention in Caste discrimination: UGC has advised all the Universities/Colleges that

- The official/faculty members should desist from any act of discrimination against SC/ST students on ground of their 1. social origin.
- 2. The University/Institute/College may develop page on their website for lodging such complaints of caste discrimination by SC/ST students and also place complaint register in the Registrar/Principal office for the purpose. If any such incident comes to the notice of the authorities, action should be taken against the erring officials/faculty member promptly.
- 3. The University/College should ensure that no official/faculty member indulge in any kind of discrimination against any community or category.
- 4. The University may constitute a committee to look into the discrimination complaint received from SC/ST/OBC students/Teachers and Non-teaching staff.

7.2(d) Reservation for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes in the matter of appointment to teaching posts and Non Tachaing Post, Students Admissions, Hostel Residents in Universities/Colleges

With Reference the Allahabad High court in its order CMWP No. 43260 of 16 dated 07.04.2017 and later upheld by the Supreme Court in its judgment dated 21.07.2017 passed in SLP(C) No. 16515/2017, the UGC examine the issue relating to all aspects referred to in the 10 judgments on the matter of reservation in teaching positions and submitted its recommendations to MHRD for its consideration and appropriate action. The issue is mainly the practice of treating the entire University as a unit of reservation.

Inter Ministerial Committee unanimously recommended that (1) in case of reservation for SC/ST, all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grants-in-Aid institutions and centers shall prepare the roster system keeping the Department /subject as a unit for all level of teachers as applicable (ii) the roster department wise, shall be applied to the total number of posts in each of the categories (e.g. Professor, Associate Professor, Associate Professor) within the Department/Subject.

M/HRD vide. its OM No. 1-7/2017-CU.V dated 22.02.2018 has conveyed its concurrence to amend the UGC guidelines of 2006 with a request to intimate all the Universities accordingly and prepare a fresh roster within one month. Accordingly, the UGC vide its letter F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 5th March, 2018 circulated the above decision to all the Universities.

The matter of switch over from "University as a unit" to "Department as a unit" may reduce the representation of reserved category candidates considerably was discussed by the Honorable Chairman of the Parliamentary committee on the welfare of SCs and STs and M/HRD constituted Inter-ministerial committee and decided to file SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India by UGC and MHRD separately. Accordingly UGC and M/HRD filled SLP, before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. On January 22nd 2019, the Hon'ble Supreme Court dismissed SLP.

The Central Education Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Ordinance, 2019 dt. 7th March, 2019 Published by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Law and Justice and Ministry of HRD (Department of Higher Education) Notification published dated 7.03.2019.

As per direction of Ministry of HRD, Department of Higher Education, the UGC forwarded a copy of the Ministry Letter No. F 38-11/2018-CU.V dated 07.03.2019 along with notification No. 1013 dated 07.03.2019 regarding 'The Central Education Institutions (Reservation in Teachers' Cadre) Ordinance, 2019 vide UGC letter no. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 07.03.2019 and 8.03.2019 which is also posted on UGC Website.

The Central Government hereby specifies that there shall be reservation of posts in direct recruitment out of the sanctioned strength in teachers' cadre in a Central Educational Institution in the manner specified in the Office Memorandum, No. 36012/2/96-Est.(res) of the Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, dated 2nd July, 1997 to the extent as follows, namely:-

- (a) Fifteen percent for Scheduled Castes
- (b) Seven and one half percent for Scheduled Tribes, and
- (c) Twenty –Seven percent for socially and educationally Backward classes

During the year 2018-19 the information submitted by 32 Central, 95 State Public, 15 Deemed Universities (Under Section 12B of the UGC Act) regarding Teaching, Non-Teaching Posts, Students Admission & Hostel Residents are as follows:










Graph 7.2(d)(iii): Category-wise Students Admitted (Ist Year of Admissions) during 2018-19





7.2(e) Coaching Schemes for SCs/STs/OBCs (Non-creamy layer) & Minorities: UGC has been contributing towards social equity and social economic mobility of the under privileged section of the society through following special coaching schemes in Universities/Colleges.

7.2(e)(i) Remedial coaching for SCs/STs/OBCs (Non creamy layer) & Minorities Community students. The Commission introduced Remedial Coaching for the benefit of Undergraduate (UG)/ Post-graduate (PG) Students in 1994 with a view to improve & Strengthen their knowledge, academic skills and linguistic proficiency in various subjects and to improve overall performance in the examination.

An amount of Rs. 6.13 lakhs has been released to Five Centers during 2018-19.

7.2(e)(ii)Coaching for NET/SET for SCs/STs/OBCs (Non creamy layer) & Minorities Community students

The Commission introduced Coaching for NET/SET in 2004-05 with the objective to prepare SC/ST/OBC/Minority Community candidates for National eligibility Test (NET) 0r the State Eligibility Test (SET) which is an essential eligibility condition for becoming a Lecturer/Assistant Professor in Universities & College.

7.2(e)(iii) Coaching classes for entry in services for SCs/STs/OBCs (Non creamy layer) & Minority Community students.

In order to gain useful employment in groups A,B &C, including all Indian and State provincial services or equivalent positions in the private sector, The Commission introduced the coaching scheme during 2004-05.

An amount of Rs. 10.14.lakhs has been released to Five Centers during 2018-19.

7.2(f) Equal opportunity cell in Universities/Colleges: To make Universities/Colleges more responsive to the needs and constraint of the disadvantaged social group, Equal opportunity cell (EOC) oversees the effective implementation of policies and programmes for these groups. An amount of Rs. 0.88 lakh has been released to Five Centers during 2018-19.

7.2(g) Establishment of Centers in Universities for study of Social exclusive and Inclusive policy: UGC has established 33 centers in different Universities to support research on the issue of social exclusion, which has a theoretical as well as policy importance. An amount of Rs. 7.25 Crore has been released to Five Centers during 2018-19.

7.2(h) Facilities for Persons with Disabilities

The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including persons with disabilities. In the recent years, there have been vast and positive changes in the perception of the society towards persons with disabilities. It has been realized that a majority of persons with disabilities can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures.

The Protection of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 indicates that differently abled persons should have access to education at all levels. In the higher education sector, the University Grants Commission has been supporting universities and colleges in the country and involving them in special education activities to empower differently abled persons.

The UGC, from time to time, has been conveying to the Universities and Deemed Universities, the policy decisions, including reservations in admissions and employment in the Government of India pertaining to the persons with disabilities. In addition, the decisions taken and the guidelines framed at the level of the

Commission in this regard have also been circulated to all universities for implementation. The Commission had also circulated the Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 2016 to the universities requesting them to strictly follow the provisions contained therein.

Reservation in higher Educational Institutions- All Government institutions of higher Education and other higher education institutions receiving aid from the Government shall reserve not less than five percent seats for persons with benchmark disabilities.

Reservation - Every appropriate Government shall appoint in every Government establishment , not less than four percent . of the total number of vacancies in the cadre strength each group of posts meant to be filled with persons with benchmark disabilities .

UGC has issued the instruction to all Universities regarding guidelines for conducting written examination for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities vide letter No.F.6-2/2013(SCT) dated 14.1.2019 and 21.2.2019.

UGC has issued the instruction to all Universities for compliance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders in Writ Petition No.292 of 2006 regarding to formulate internal Committee for the Students of Disabilities in Universities/Colleges vide letter No.F.6-1/2018 dated 11.1.2019. The contents of the letter are as under:-

- Adoption and implementation of Harmonised Guidelines and Space Standards for Barrier free Built Environment for Persons with Disability and Elderly Persons, developed in February, 2016 by Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, to make the existing buildings barrier free and accessible for Persons with Disabilities and the aforesaid guidelines shall also be followed during approval of the plan and Detailed Project Report in cases of new buildings.
- > To form an Internal Committee comprising teachers, staff, students and parents for taking care of day to day needs of differently abled persons as well as for implementation of the schemes existing and to be devised in future.
- To report the proper functioning of Equal Opportunity Cell in the Colleges, Universities and other higher education institutions.

Besides, the UGC is also implementing plan schemes for the benefit of persons with disabilities. UGC has to monitor the effective implementation of the reservation policy for Persons with Disabilities in employment and in admission in Universities/ Colleges.

7.2(h)(i) Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN).

Objectives- The HEPSN scheme is basically meant for creating an environment at the higher education institutions to enrich higher education learning experiences for differently-abled persons. Creating awareness about the capabilities of differently-abled persons, construction aimed at improving accessibility, purchase of equipment to enrich learning, etc., are the broad categories of assistance under this scheme.

Eligibility -Financial assistance under the scheme is available to such universities and colleges which come within the purview of section 2(f) and fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

7.2(h) (ii) Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE)

The Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE) scheme is meant for assisting Departments of Education to launch special education teachers' preparation programmes to prepare special teachers to teach children with

disabilities in both special and inclusive settings. The scheme provides financial assistance to offer B.Ed. and M.Ed. Degree courses with specialization in one of the disability areas.

Objectives -The specific objective of the TEPSE schemes is to encourage Universities to start M.Ed. special education courses to prepare teacher- educators to serve in higher education institutions offering special education teacher preparation courses

7.2(h)(iii) Financial Assistance to Visually Challenged Teachers

Objectives- The Scheme has been formulated to help visually challenged permanent teachers to pursue teaching and research with the help of a Reader and by using teaching and learning aids by way of providing Reader's Allowance and funds for purchase of Braille books, recorded materials, etc. and help such teachers achieve self- dependence by using various aids for teaching, learning and research.

Eligibility - Financial assistance under the scheme is available to such universities and colleges which come within the purview of section 2(f) and are fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

Ceiling of the grant for University/College Rs.36,000/- per annum

7.3(a) Estimated Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) (2018-19) in Higher Education in India is 26.3% which is calculated for 18-23 years of age group. For Scheduled Castes, it is 23.0% and for Scheduled Tribes it is 17.2%. The Gross Enrolment Ratio of all Categories and SCs & STs students since 2013-14 in Higher Education is given below:-





8.1 Area Study Centers in Universities

The Commission started Area Studies Programme in 1963 in different universities. In the last five decades it has evolved with all its strengths and limitations. These Centers are working with following major objectives;

- a. to promote holistic understanding of the area with its cultural, social, economic and strategic specificities;
- b. to promote alternative paradigm of area studies from the perspective of post colonial societies;
- c. to contribute towards Indian perspectives of the region and issues;
- d. to provide critical inputs to the policy makers, particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests:
- e. to bring knowledge of regions of the world to the core of intellectual disciplines;
- f. to conduct research to promote inter-regional comparative perspective.

During the year 2018-19, 35 Centers are functional and an amount of Rs.79.14 lakhs has been released to 8 centers under the Area Studies Programme for realizing the above objectives.

8.2 Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India


India has a heritage of produced great thinkers and social leaders who, by their revolutionary and path breaking thoughts and actions, have left a lasting impact not only on India, but the world as a whole. They have developed indigenous ideas and have provided cultural and ethical identity to India. There is a great need to acquaint the teachers and students with their thinking and work and to involve them in studies, research and field work based extension service programmes of constructive work. The Scheme of Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India (Special Studies) was initiated by the UGC in the year 1983.

There are 394 Studies Centres established in various universities/colleges under the Scheme 'Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India'.

9.1 : e-Governance/e-Office

To decentralise its work efficiency, UGC has been implementing e-Governance through initiatives like e-Office, NIC mail for UGC employees, online applications of UGC scheme including Scholarship/Fellowships, web-based application forms for other UGC schemes. The new UGC website was also launched in December 2017 with several user friendly features for easy access and information to users which is an ongoing process. UGC is striving towards a paperless office through e-governance.

The UGC constituted a Technical Advisory Committee to guide UGC with respect to e-Governance initiatives, challenges and the way forward.

The Commission's decision in its 539th meeting held on 26 February 2019 in respect of Development and Management of e-Governance for UGC by Information and Library Network Centre (INFLIBNET), an autonomous Inter-University Centre of UGC was communicated to Director, INFLIBNET vide UGC letter dated 7th March, 2019 with a request to complete the task within the stipulated time as mentioned in the INFLIBNET proposal including training of manpower. A new e-governance cell has been set up in UGC and fresh technical staff has been recruited to expedite the process of e-governance in UGC.

UGC WEBSITE: UGC website's main objective is to share Important Information of various UGC schemes to End Users/Stakeholders. Also stakeholders can submit/upload their various information including University reports, Proposals for schemes, apply for scholarships/fellowships/jobs etc. through UGC web portals.

The UGC website is being updated on regular basis. Hindi version of UGC website has been made online. Reminder is being sent to all the Universities with request to appoint Nodal Officers for UGC Student Grievance Portal and also to close all pending Grievances related to their Institutions. The section is also handling the work of various portals with the provision for generating MIS reports is as follows:

University Activity Monitoring Portal (UAMP): The University Activity Monitoring Portal of UGC is serving as a one point stop for events/activities undertaken by HEIs from time to time. This portal is facilitating Universities to upload details of various events /activities undertaken by them. Universities are requested to login to this portal with the same user id and password as provided to them by UGC for the UGC University portal Also Universities may regularly update their contact details on this portal. In the year 2018-19 UGC gathered online information from Universities and Colleges for the following activities:

(i) International yoga day 2018 (ii) 150th birth anniversary of the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi (iii) Swachhata Hi Seva (iv) Observance of Surgical Strike Day on 29th September 2018 (v) Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) (vi) Observance of Vigilance Awareness week-2018 and (vii) Pariksha Pe Charcha 2.0 (viii) Compliance Report on Grievance Redressal Mechanism.

Online information including Images and videos of the activities conducted by Universities and Colleges also the detail of Activities with number of Participants.

Autonomous College Portal: A Web Portal for Autonomous Colleges is developed for Inviting Online Application from eligible Colleges for Autonomous Status.

Deemed To be University Portal: Work has been initiated on developing an online portal for accepting proposals from Institutions for the seeking status of Deemed to be University.

UGC-Outreach / **Stakeholders:** Creation of master database of UGC Colleges and Universities has been initiated. It will be featured as mode of communication (over mail /sms) between UGC and Colleges / Universities.

Central Universities Portal: Integrated Portal for Planning, Financing and Coordinated Development of Central Universities.

e-PGPathshala: Under the National Mission on Education through information Communication Technology (NME-ICT) UGC as PI of production of e-course for post graduate subjects developed high quality, curriculum-based, interactive, in different subjects across all disciplines of social sciences, arts, fine arts and humanities, natural & mathematical sciences, linguistics and languages under initiative named e-PG Pathshala. The Learning Management System for e-PG Pathshala (http://epgp.inflibnet.ac.in/) is available in open access and hosted on INFLIBNET server. **Status of e-content developed so far is as follows:**

9.2(b) Massive Open Online Courses for SWAYAM Platform:- (www.swayam.gov.in)

The Government has also launched SWAYAM portal that provides an integrated platform for online courses, using information and communication technology(ICT). Through this, it would be possible for any student to join virtual courses offered by the best teachers in the Country, interact with the teacher, take tests, earn academic credits and transfer them on their academic record.

UGC is the National Coordinator for Non Technology, Post Graduation, Degree programme.

Since July 2018 to December 2018 total 47 courses have been offered on the SWAYAM platform by various universities with the provision of credit mobility across educational institutions and 58 Courses are finalised to be offered for the session January-May, 2019.

Ninety Two (92) Universities have come on board for accepting credit transfer for courses done through SWAYAM platform till March, 2019.

- **1. 40,311** learners enrolled in 47 UGC Non-Technology Post-Graduate the National MOOCs Course on SWAYAM Platform in July-Dec 2018 Session.
 - o The Online examination for 8 Courses was conducted by NTA on 1st December & 2nd December, 2018, 412 learners appeared for examination.
 - o The pen & paper examination by UGC for remaining MOOCs course was conducted by UGC NET bureau on 19th & 20th January, 2019. 1436 learners appeared for the examination in 33 Courses.
 - o 1848 certificate & transcripts have been issued for UGC MOOCs
- 2. 58 Courses are to be offered on the SWAYAM Portal from the Session starting from January-May, 2019.
- 3. The Academic Council on MOOCs finalised 48 Fresh proposal; for the development of new MOOCs Courses.
- 4 UGC has prepared three 30 seconds radio spots and three TVCs in the following 10 regional languages:- Bengali, Telugu, Marathi, Tamil, Gujarati Kannada, Malayalam, Odia, Assamese & English plus Hindi.
- 5. The Radio spot in 10 regional languages have been broadcasted PAN India across all the FM Channel for the period of 30 days from 04/07/2018 to 02/08/2018
- 6. UGC has also prepared 3 different posters on SWAYAM Initiative which were dispatched across all the Indian Universities to promote SWAYAM Initiative by displaying at prominent locations in the University Campuses.
- 7. UGC requested all the Universities & Colleges to identify SWAYAM Coordinators and Mentors respectively to act as Single Point of Contact for the SWAYAM in their respective HEIs.

- 8. Approximately 140 SWAYAM Coordinators and Approximately 1000 Plus SWAYAM Mentors have been identified by the universities.
- 9. Social Media like Twitter is also regularly being used for promoting SWAYAM.
- 10. UGC has successfully conducted two regional workshops for adoption, production & promotion MOOCs. The first such workshop was held at Maulana Azad National Urdu University Hyderabad on 31st August,2018 which saw an attendance of about 500 participants including Vice Chancellors, Principals, SWAYAM Coordinators and Swayam Mentors and representatives from the States councils of the States Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry & Daman & Diu.
- 11. The second workshop was held on 12th October, 2018 at Gujarat Forensic Sciences University Gandhinagar where 455 participants attended including Vice Chancellors, Principals, SWAYAM Coordinators and Swayam Mentors from the States of Gujarat, Maharashra, Goa and Daman & Diu.
- 12. A two day MOOC development workshop programme was organized from 15th -16th October, 2018 at IIM Bangalore for capacity building of Course Coordinators for developing Fresh MOOCs for the SWAYAM platform.

Total cost incurred in the Project (MOOCs for SWAYAM) during 2018-19 is ₹ 5,89,88,176.20 (Rupees Five Crore Eighty Nine Lakh Eighty Eight Thousand One Hundred Seventy Six rupees and Twenty Paisa only).

9.3 National Academic Depository (NAD)

In 2017, NAD was launched as an online store house of academic awards (Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates, Mark Sheets etc.) lodged by the academic institutions / boards / eligibility assessment bodies in a digital format. It is a 24X7 online mode for making available academic awards and shall help in validating their authenticity, their safe storage and easy retrieval.

- UGC has established NAD Cell which is being operated from UGC-NAD Cell, Old CRS Building, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Aruna Asaf Ali Marg, New Delhi-110067. The cell is operating since December 2018.
- Designated staff has been appointed for the Cell which includes 1 Finance, 2 Technical, 4 System and 4
 Data Analyst.
- A designated email and contact number has been provided on the website to report grievances related to NAD.
- To cater the grievances, UGC –NAD is in process of developing Grievance redressed portal. The portal shall be an integral part of the NAD dynamic website.
- UGC has conducted 29 workshops/Meeting/Training throughout the country since June 2017 till 31st March 2019 to make the Academic Institutions to aware of NAD system. Further, the regional offices of UGC have also conducted workshop/seminar to create awareness about NAD.
- UGC Officer, NAD, visited Chhattisgarh Board of Secondary Education, Raipur, Chhattisgarh on 13th December 2018 for hand holding process i.e. academic award upload into NAD system.
- NAD Consultants visited 31 AIs(23 in NCR and 8 outside NCR) to train and assist university in uploading of academic awards.
- Periodic meeting were held amongst UGC, depositories and the Ministry of HRD to discuss issues related to NAD.

- As part of media strategy, National Film Development Corporation (NFDC) were given the work of creating and publishing NAD TV Commercial, Radio Jingle and Poster.
- UGC had sent regular letters at the Secretary level to all the academic institutions across the country to create awareness and to enable institutions to onboard NAD, AIs periodically informing them of NAD.
- For general awareness in the internet world, details about NAD and its process was made available in Wikipedia and the page is monitored and updated regularly.
- Progress-cum-status report of the Academic Institutions in regard to the award upload was collected from all AIs regularly.
- National Informatics Centre (NIC) was given the task of making NAD website dynamic. Nodal officers from NAD were appointed to monitor the work.
- All the AIs who have signed the SLA have appointed a nodal officer for NAD, whose contact details (email and mobile phone) are available with depositories/ UGC NAD cell. Nodal officers were regularly contacted to submit the progress made so far in account of NAD.
- NAD status is weekly updated on NAD website (<u>www.nad.gov.in</u>) with the list of on-board institutions, academic data lodged, registration of students etc.

9.4 Annual Refresher Progamme in Teaching (ARPIT)

A unique initiative of online professional development of in-service teachers' of higher education' using MOOCs platform SWAYAM-Annual Refresher Progamme in Teaching (ARPIT) was launched by MHRD on 13th November, 2018. The ARPIT is 40 hour programme with 20 hours of video content offered in a highly flexible format which can be done at one's own pace and time. The programme has built-in assessment exercises and activities as part of the academic progression in the course. At the end of the course, there is a provision for terminal assessment which can be either online of written examination. It has been decided by the UGC that successful completion of the courses offered under the ARPIT programme with 40 hour of instruction material with a proctored examination will be treated as equivalent to one Refresher Course for the purposes of career Advancement.

10.1 UGC Skill Development Schemes under NSOF

10.1 UGC Skill Development Schemes under NSQF

The UGC is implementing three schemes viz. Community Colleges, B.Voc Degree Programme, and Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centres for Knowledge Acquisition and up-gradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (KAUSHAL) under NSQF.

The UGC guidelines for Curricular Aspects, Assessment Criteria and Credit System for Skill based Vocational Courses have defined credits for specific NSQF levels which may utilize as a tool for equivalence to the academic qualifications at par with equal number of credits awarded by any institution in related specializations.

Activities/outcomes of Skill Development scheme during 2018-19:

• Model Curriculum for Skill based Courses:

The UGC, in consultation with NSDC and concerned Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) has developed Qualification Pack(QP), National occupational standard (NOS) based Curriculum in 45 potential trades. These courses being offered / proposed to be offered may also serve as option of Skills basket for Ability Enhancement Courses and Skills Enhancement Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).

• Academia-Industry Collaboration:

The Skill Development Schemes have Academia Industry Collaboration, providing suitable platform for industries in academia, which otherwise could not materialize in a desired manner even with lot of policy efforts.

• Type of Courses and Awards:

There will be full time credit-based modular programmes, wherein banking of credits for skill and general education components shall be permitted so as to enable multiple exit and entry.



10.1(a) Community Colleges (CC)

The Community Colleges scheme is to offer low cost-high quality education locally that encompasses both skill development as well as traditional course work, thereby providing opportunities to the learner to move directly to employment sector or to move up in higher education sector. The Community Colleges are to offer knowledge-skill mixed programmes of different duration depending on the need of local industry leading to a certification at various levels of NSQF.

Objectives of the scheme

- Developing work ready man force for employment as per Industry needs.
- Bridge Courses to the Learners having Certificate or Diploma to bring them at par with appropriate NSQF level.
- Up gradation and Certification of traditional/ acquired skills of the Learners inrespective of their age.
- To develop synergistic relationship between learners

UGC invited fresh proposals from the Universities and Colleges under the scheme for the year 2018-2019. 172 institutions have been approved under the scheme of Community College. Status of amount allocated and grant released during the year 2018-2019

109 institutions have been granted extension to run courses under the scheme of Community Colleges in the year 2018-19. An amount of Rs. 2.5 Crores was released for these institutions.

10.1(b) B.Voc. Degree Programme

The UGC launched a scheme on skills development based higher education as part of college-university education leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree with lateral entry and multiple exit options at Diploma/Advanced Diploma level under the NSQF. The B.Voc programme is focused on universities and colleges providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles and their NOSs along with broad based general education. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc to make a meaningful contribution in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge.

Objectives of the scheme

- To provide judicious mix of skills relating to a profession and appropriate content of general education.
- To ensure that the students have adequate knowledge and skills, so that they are work ready at each exit point of the programme.
- To provide flexibility to students by means of pre-defined entry and multiple exit points.
- To integrate NSQF within the undergraduate level of higher education in order to enhance employability of the graduates and meet industry requirements. Such graduates apart from meeting the needs of local and national industry are also expected to be equipped to become part of the global workforce.
- To provide vertical mobility to students coming out of (a) 10+2 with vocational subjects; and (b) Community Colleges.

UGC invited fresh proposals from the universities and colleges under the scheme for the year 2018-2019. 330 institutions have been approved under the scheme of B.Voc. Degree Programme. The status of grant allocated and grant released to relevant institutions during 2018-19 is as under:

10.1 (c) D.D.U. KAUSHAL Kendras

Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centres for Knowledge acquisition and upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (DDU KAUSHAL) Kaushal Kendras

Realizing the need to boost vocational education on a larger scale, UGC proposes to establish 'Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centres for knowledge Acquisition and up-gradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (KAUSHAL)'. These Centres would take-up the vocational education to new levels and offer courses beyond Diploma and B.Voc degree also. These Centres will not focus on skilling alone but also develop entrepreneurship traits. The Centres may endeavor to maintain a paramedical structure of student enrolment with respect to Diploma, Advance Diploma, B.Voc and further studies at PG and Research level. These Centres will also coordinate between the country's higher education system and Industry to work as Centres of Excellence for skill development in specialized areas.

UGC invited fresh proposals from the universities and colleges under the scheme for the year 2018-2019. 28 institutions have been approved under the scheme of DDU KAUSHAL Kendras. The status of grant allocated and grant released to relevant institutions during 2018-19 is as under:



11.1 Open & Distance Education Programme

UGC had notified UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017. Subsequently 1st Amendment was notified on 11th October, 2017, Second Amendment was notified on 6th February, 2018 and Third Amendment was notified on 6th September, 2018. UGC had invited on-line proposals for ODL programmes from Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) for the academic session 2018-19 and onwards under second and third amendment.

After processing the proposals received under UGC (ODL) second and third amendment Regulations 2018, 82 HEIs (75 HEIs for academic session beginning July, 2018 and onwards and 7 HEIs for academic session beginning January, 2019 and onwards) have been accorded recognition to offer 1328 programmes through ODL mode from the academic year 2018-19 and onwards. The details regarding the same are available on the UGC website and are also given below at **Table 11.1(a)**.

In addition, as per UGC, [Categorisation of Universities (Only) For Grant Of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018, Category-I Universities may offer courses in the Open and Distance Learning mode, without approval of the Commission, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and amendments. In reference to above, those HEIs which have been placed under Category-I by UGC, through a formal communication need to submit an affidavit stating that the HEI will abide by all the terms and conditions as stipulated under UGC (ODL) Regulation, 2017 and its amendments and norms issued by the statutory bodies/councils from time to time.

Accordingly, a list of 20 Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) under Category – I as per UGC (Categorisation of Universities (Only) for grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018, entitled to offer programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Mode has been uploaded on the UGC website and details are given at **Table 11.1(b)**.
