- 1. Jagadguru Rambhadracharya Handicapped (J.R.H.) University is a flagship University in that it is involved in a unique and socially relevant venture aimed at imparting higher education to differently-abled (Handicapped) students from different stratas of society. It addresses higher education as a socially responsible, ethical & moral venture that aims at harnessing the inherent potentials of the differently-abled (Handicapped) students and make them equal stake holders at par with other citizens of the nation.
- 2. It is a multi-faculty University, and hence, includes all relevant areas of higher education needed for holistic and inter-disciplinary academic platform in higher education.
- 3. The University provides free lodging, boarding and health-care facilities to all its residents students. As such, it moves beyond mere class-rooms teaching to address a very significant humane and social need of a welfare state.
- 4. Some departments of the University, i.e., Fine Arts, Music and Special education are doing exceptionally well and are in-fact at par with other conventional Institutions of higher learning.
- 5. Being a niche University, the Committee feels that this University may not be judged on the parameters applicable to the conventional Universities. It should rather be given time to evolve its administrative structures and academic/research potentials in a time-bound manner and should as such be encouraged and supported in every possible way to achieve its objectives a meaningful manner.
